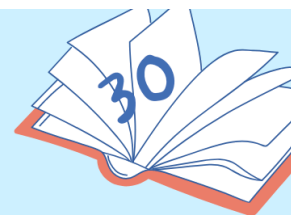

# Local Transportation

Please peruse [this document](#) if you would like to coordinate with other Asha volunteers for transportation.

- [Marta](#): Marta is the local transit option in Atlanta which includes trains and buses.
  - **Train**: The train station and schedule can be found [here](#) on the Marta website. The stations that will be the most relevant to us include
    - **Airport**: This is the starting station for the red and gold lines. You can use any of the two lines if you intend to come to GT campus.
    - **Midtown**: This station is on red and gold lines and drops you close to Tech Square which is in the NE part of the campus. This is also close to other hotels, including [Hotel Indigo](#).
      - One can then either take a cab or wait for a GT shuttle (Tech Trolley) to take you to the campus.
      - Tech Trolley frequency over weekends is about once every 20-30 mins.
    - **North Avenue**: This is an alternative close to the SE part of the campus.
      - Note that Hotel Indigo is about 0.2 miles or a 4-min walk from here
      - One can then take a cab to come to the campus as Tech Trolley does not service this location.
    - Depending on where your hotel/Airbnb is, you might want to possibly look at Lindhberg, Buckhead, and Arts Center stations as well.
  - Bus: Transportation using the Marta bus is generally good for the last mile connectivity. Details can be found [here](#).
- **Georgia Tech Shuttles**: GT runs shuttles (Stinger bus) that connect different parts of the campus. If you are staying close to the campus, you can possibly use this means of transport to travel between your hotel and the conference location.
  - You can either download the app "[Passio Go](#)" for routes and live tracking of the buses, or go to this [website](#) for routes. The route that will be most useful is the **Tech Trolley**.
  - The stops closest to the conference location are **Cherry Emerson, Nanotechnology, and Kendeda Building**.
- **Electric Scooters** like Helbiz, Veo, Spin, and Bird for cheap small distance alternatives to Uber and Lyft. Note that these cannot be used between 9pm-4am. An important point to note is that some of the areas are geofenced where you either cannot ride, or park. Before availing the facility, do make sure that your destination is not geofenced. Lastly, please be careful while riding these.
- [Relay Bike Share](#): You can get a bike/cycle by downloading the app. It costs \$3.5 per 30 mins of ride. This bike sharing service is docked, i.e. the pickup and drop-off locations are specific and the bike must be parked at one of these locations to end the ride.

## Parking Near Campus

There are numerous visitor parking options available around the campus. The list of all the locations can be found [here](#).

The visitor parking locations that are closest to the conference venue are:

- [Visitor Area 5](#): North Campus Parking Deck (W23): \$2/hour (\$15 max, \$20 for lost ticket)
- [Home Park](#): Free street-side weekend parking is available in [Home Park](#) and is walking distance from the venue.
- [Visitor Area 4](#): Ferst Dr and State St: \$2/hour (4 hrs max, ParkMobile App Zone: 8629).
- If these two parking lots are full (unlikely), please park at [5th and Spring St](#) and take a tech trolley to reach the conference location: \$2/hour (ParkMobile App Zone: 8641).

## Things to do in Atlanta

There are a variety of fun things to explore in Atlanta during your stay here. Some options sorted by distance from GT campus are listed below:

Name	Description	Distance (in miles)
Fox Theatre	Get ready to feel like a movie star when visiting Fox Theatre. Musicals, dance performances, and nationally renowned acts await guests at the end of the red carpet walk. No show scheduled? You can take a tour and learn the fascinating history of this Atlanta icon.	1.1
Atlantic Station	Shopping Center in Midtown that includes multiple restaurants, a movie theatre, and a bowling alley.	1.5
Centennial Olympic Park	Pay homage to Atlanta's Olympic legacy, take a selfie with the Olympic rings, splash around in the Fountain of Rings, enjoy a nice picnic, or play on the lush green space with Downtown views in every direction. Many of Atlanta's top attractions, restaurants, and venues are only steps away.	1.5
Georgia Aquarium	The Georgia Aquarium is something you should "sea" to believe. Stare in awe at the sheer variety of marine life on display, peek at puffins and penguins or feed the dolphins after their spectacular show. Don't miss the opportunity to check swimming with whale sharks off your bucket list.	1.6
World of Coke	The World of Coca-Cola is a museum, located in Downtown Atlanta. Get a chance to view the history of Coca-Cola and taste different Coca-Cola products from around the world.	1.6
National Center for Civil and Human Rights	Connect the American civil rights movement to current human rights issues through moving, experiential exhibits at The National Center for Civil and Human Rights. Interact with history to understand your role in the dream and the future. The Georgia Aquarium, World of Coke, and the National Center are located right next to	1.6

SkyView Atlanta	Ride a SkyView Atlanta Ferris wheel to experience the city from 20 stories up. It's a thrilling view during the day and a breathtaking sight at night. You'll see everything from Stone Mountain Park to Midtown's Georgia Tech campus.	1.7
High Museum of Atlanta	Located in Midtown. You will find more than 17,000 works including 19th-century art and a growing collection of contemporary pieces inside the leading art museum in the Southeast. Bring your friends or family for special exhibits and events plus the permanent collections at the High Museum of Art.	1.7
Piedmont Park / Beltline	Truly experience The City in the Forest with a walk or bike ride through Piedmont Park, home to Atlanta Botanical Garden and Lake Clara Meer. The Beltline (right across from Piedmont Park) is a great pathway for biking (you can rent bikes there) or going for a stroll. It connects multiple restaurants and you can view wonderful street art along the way.	1.9
Atlanta Botanical Garden	Nestled in the northern corner of Piedmont Park, Atlanta Botanical Garden spreads its roots across more than 30 acres. Explore the lush green garden when it is lit up for special events, blooms during seasonal activities, and harvests a spooky spectacle or two.	2.0
Jackson Street Bridge	One of the best views of the Atlanta skyline. Best to visit at night.	3.1
Martin Luther King Jr, Natural History Park	Visit the birth home of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. and see where he preached at Ebenezer Baptist Church. Explore his legacy at The King Center established by Coretta Scott King as well as their final resting place. See Dr. King's Nobel Peace Prize and the key to his room at the Lorraine Motel in Memphis	3.2
Historic Oakland Cemetery	Historic Oakland Cemetery is alive and kicking. The infamous scenic resting place for more than 70,000 residents includes Atlanta legends such as author Margaret Mitchell, professional golfer	4.4



	Bobby Jones and Atlanta's first African-American mayor, Maynard Jackson. The cemetery also frequently hosts events including Halloween Tours, regular weekend tours, and a Harvest Hunt.	
Zoo Atlanta	The Zoo Atlanta is home to a wide variety of animals ranging from elephants, giraffes, zebras, Southern white rhinos, and more. You'll also see the only giant panda twins, Ya Lun and Xi Lun, in the U.S. plus many more animal exhibits.	5.4
Fernbank Museum	Get up close and personal with the dinosaurs at Fernbank Museum of Natural History. This museum is very similar to other Natural History Museums (like NYC) and is an adventure for all who dare and takes travelers back in time to see giant creatures of the Mesozoic – including one that measures more than 120 feet long.	6.4
Porsche Experience Center	Push yourself to the limit at Porsche Experience Center, specially designed to exhibit elegance and engineering under the hood while testing you on and off the tracks. Once you feel the power from the driver's seat, be sure to refuel with fine dining at Restaurant 356.	10.7
