Each player gets a good, bad, or neutral letter from outside, and will be asked to read it aloud for a bonus. May be from a backstory character or not. These were all express mailed after Day 1, so are not up-to-date with the game itself.

Current plan is to roll a 1d6 1=good letter 2-5=Neutral question 6=bad letter.

Highlighted letters mark the ones received by players.
