Get Out the Vote '24 (G10)



Overview

This project will challenge you to develop an understanding of some of the core issues of the 2024 election in order to help eligible voters be more informed and engaged about their civic agency. By the end of this project, we are not encouraging you to take stands on any particular issue or candidate, but be more aware of how current politics impacts those in our community as well as how to have a voice in the political system.

You will first build your understanding of the voting systems and the key issues that are driving current political engagement. Next, you and your team will select one specific issue to explore in-depth. This will lead to the creation of a **short film #1** that presents an overview of the issue, along with the political stances of the two major parties.

Next, you will gather community voices about your chosen issue to create a **short film #2** that shares community perspectives on how the issue impacts them. Finally, your team will go into post-production to make your two short films public ready to be shared on November 5th with eligible voters within Wellesley High School.

This project will introduce you to skills in researching and metacognition by building on your skills of interviewing, filming, and editing.

Final Product and Presentation

• In-School screenings for eligible voters and invited guests - show films and have conversations with audience about them
