


Answer (A), (B), and (C).

- C) Briefly explain ANOTHER specific historical effect that resulted from the change depicted on the graph.




- A) Briefly describe ONE contributing factor to the unemployment rates depicted in this table.

- C) Briefly describe ONE reason for the falling unemployment rates in 1941.




- A) Briefly explain ONE important similarity between the British colonies in the Chesapeake region and the British colonies in New England from 1607 to 1754

- C) Explains ONE factor that accounts for the difference that you indicated in (B).




- A) Briefly explain ONE important goal of the Missouri Compromise of 1820.

- C) Briefly explain ONE reason why this compromise was unsuccessful in achieving the goal you outlined in part (a).




- A) Briefly explain how ONE specific historical development represents an accomplishment of the national government under the Articles of Confederation.

- C) Briefly explain how ONE specific way in which the United States Constitution addresses a criticism of the Articles of Confederation.




