Passage of Reflection

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Project Description:

The [Passage of Reflection] is a proposed installation project designed to fit in an open indoor space, curated to foster reflection, exploration, and gratitude in the viewer. The floor-to-ceiling windows establish a bridge between the outer and inner worlds, utilizing natural lighting to softly illuminate the space.

The tree serves as the center monument reminding us of the connection between ourselves, nature, and the spiritual world. The stone pathway provides guidance for participants while they ponder, allowing thoughts to arise in tandem with footsteps. The stone wells at the end of the pathway allow participants to deposit their reflections and emotions, either positive or negative, before they finish their journey. At the exit, letters can be written and put on the wall for future participants to read, prompting a final collaborative conversation before returning to the outer world.

How would this project help people connect with a sense of spirituality?

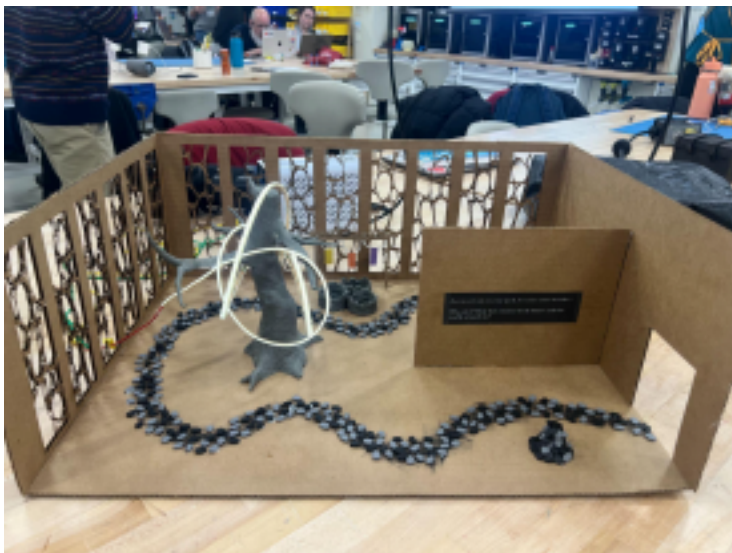
Passage of Reflection aims to prompt participants to take an introspective perspective on their being, their environment, and their purpose. When entering the space, participants are greeted with prompts on the wall to initiate their reflections. They can collect a pebble to accompany them throughout their journey. Following the pathway, participants navigate between the tree and the windows

while experiencing the spatial difference. Near the end of their journey, participants can let go of their feelings and desires by depositing their pebbles in the wells of "Review", "Sorrow", or "Gratitude." Before leaving their resolutions behind, participants can leave their mark in this space by putting letters on the exit wall.

We hope that the journey will serve as a meaningful expedition to their personal inner worlds that allows for fruitful conversations that bloom into new perspectives.
