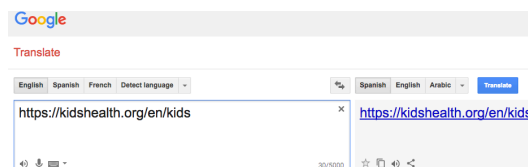
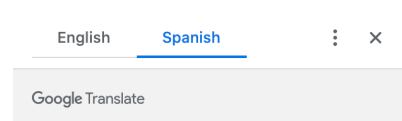


# Translation tips for Multilingual students

## Translating websites:

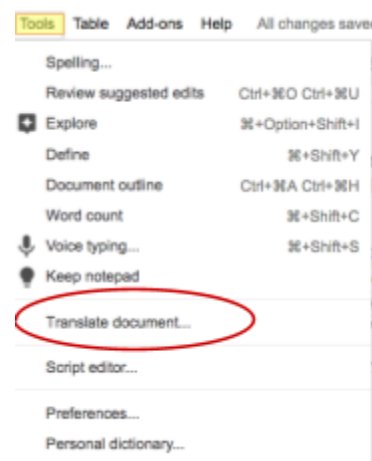
- “Right Click” on any website and a translate option appears. You can change the language of translation by clicking on the three dots on the right of the pop up box. Toggle back and forth between English and the desired language using the tabs.
- [Google Translate](#): paste the address of any website into the box and it will give you a link to a translated one.
- [Chrome Translate Extension](#) *same as above but fewer clicks - doesn't work on Chromebooks*
- [Chrome Read-Aloud Extension](#) *will read in non-English languages as well if the page is translated*
- [Lingro](#): *Copy and paste any website address and students will be able to view that site exactly with the added ability to click on any word and have it translated into their language of choice or defined in English.*



## Translating entire google docs is easy!

1. Click on tools tab of your google doc
2. Then click on translate.
3. Choose a language and it will make an exact copy of your page in the new language.

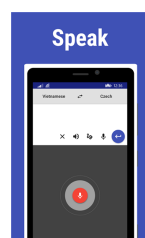
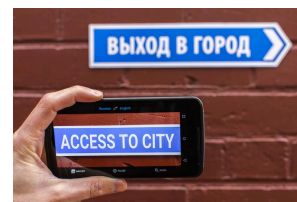

## Translating a textbook or spoken language

The Google Translate app has a camera feature that allows you to hover over text and see the translation appear on the screen. Magic! But not as good as the top two options if possible.



Also, you can click on the microphone and it will do it's best to translate spoken language. It will even speak back the translation out loud in the new language! Additionally there is a “conversation” feature that allows for easy back and forth between two people speaking different languages to see the translation in real time.
