

Key Verses:

They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost. He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts rise in your minds? Look at my hands and my feet. It is I myself! Touch me and see; a ghost does not have flesh and bones, as you see I have." (Luke 24:37-39)

Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. (Luke 24:45)

The Point: Easter is real - eyewitnesses saw Jesus alive, and the Holy Spirit also reminds us of what is true.

Notes:

- We can help our teens understand that Easter is a true story of something real that happened in history it's not a myth or legend. Read and watch Luke 24 together with your students and ask them what they notice. Point out the clues that this is real how surprised the women were, how confused Peter and the others felt, how peoples' lives changed. In a made-up story, that would all have been cleaned up. Jesus really died and really rose from the dead that means he has the power to move and work in our own lives today.
- Students like to help others if you are able, encourage them to gather canned or boxed foods around the house that you can drop off together at a local Community Services organization.
- Try to do something fun with your teens today! Teach them to boil eggs, hide eggs for them - or let them hide eggs for you. No one is too old to celebrate and enjoy Easter!
