## SPOT GHRI Letter of Involvement

## **OVERVIEW & PURPOSE:**

Encourage McGill SPOT (undergraduate, master's and PhD) student engagement in the domain of Global Health and Rehabilitation by formally recognizing their involvement in GHRI activities. Upon completion of the requirements, students will receive a signed Letter of Involvement from the GHRI Committee.

## **Requirements:**

In order for students to receive the certificate, they must earn 10 points by the end of two academic school years...

- 1. Liking the GHRI Facebook Page (1 point)
- 2. Be a member of the SPOT GHRI Student Committee (2 points)
- 3. Attending GHRI forums (as a participant and/or an organizer) (1 point per forum attended)
  - a. Bonus: Submitting a 100 word reflection per forum to <a href="mailto:spot.ghri.letter@gmail.com">spot.ghri.letter@gmail.com</a> (1 point per reflection)
- 4. Involvement in the annual GHRI Fundraising Activity (1 point for involvement, 2 points for organizing) (Not considered for 2020- 21, 2021- 22 session)
- 5. Volunteer with an organization involved within the Global Health field (verify with GHRI Coordinators if organization is Global Health oriented) (Points TBD based on role and level of involvement 1 point per 2 hours)
- 6. Conducting research as a Global Health Scholar (4 points)

7. Involvement in the annual GHRI symposium (2 points for attendance, 4 points for organizing)

## Letter of Involvement Objectives:

For students to...

- 1. Promote student learning about Global Health in Rehabilitation
- 2. Create opportunities to share knowledge with others about Global Health
- 3. Encourage students to Take Action (Raise awareness) and Make a Meaningful Impact + Contribution
- 4. Recognize contributions of students contributing to GHRI
