Course Description:

In Commerce, students are taught how businesses, consumers, and governments interact in the economy. Students are taught how to apply financial and economic reasoning and use models to explain decision-making in context. Students are also taught how internal operations and external influences affect business operations, and how tools and how they connect to practical business concepts such as marketing, people management, business planning, and operations management. Year 11 Commerce leads to further study in Business Studies, Accounting, Economics, and other related subjects in Years 12 and 13.
