- Wang-Ying Glasgow shared that Memphis Public Library is now offering hybrid and in-person programming. Decisions about what format to provide programming in is left up to branches, and Memphis Public is working closely with the City of Memphis and the Shelby County Health Department.

New Business

- Social Committee Survey Report (Carl Hess on behalf of Michael Harris)
 - There were 29 responses to the survey.
 - Approximately 70% of respondents indicated they were not comfortable with meeting in person without preventative measures such as meeting outside, social distancing, and masking.
 - Those who were not comfortable want benchmarks related to lower transmissions and higher vaccinations rates to be hit.

Guest Speakers

- Rory Thomas, President, and Haley Gentner, Program Associate, both from the Memphis Medical District Collaborative (MMDC), presented on the work MMDC is doing in the Medical District.
- They briefly discussed the history of the MMDC, their anchor institutions and partners, and then discussed work they provide for the Medical District around real estate programs, anchor institution programs, and place-based programs. These included leveraging \$545 million in private real estate investment, a clean and safe streets ambassador program, a quality public spaces team, community and economic development services for new and existing businesses, housing incentives for employees of anchor institutions, and a hire local program for existing residents to find work at the anchor institutions. In all MDCC has provided \$15.8 million in direct investments in their first 5 years.
