ABSTRACT (Times New Roman; 12pts; Bold; Spacing 6 pt)

Abstract is written in a single paragraph consisting maximum 250 words. Abstract should be integrated describing the whole article which includes introduction & objectives, methods, results, analysis, and discussion. Avoid abbreviations and references in the abstract. (Times New Roman 12 pt)

Keywords: keyword a; keyword b; keyword c; (in alphabetical). (Times New Roman 12 pt)

BACKGROUND (Times New Roman; 12pts; Bold; Spacing 6 pt)

Background provides the state of the art of the study and consists of an adequate background, the previous researches and significance of the study to show the scientific merit or novelties of the paper. Avoid the use of literature review or a summary of the results. (Times New Roman 12 pt)

METHODS (Times New Roman; 12pts; Bold; Spacing 6 pt)

Methods consist of: Design and samples (including place and time of research). Research instrument and data collection. Data analysis Ethical consideration. (Times New Roman 12 pt)

RESULTS (Times New Roman; 12pts; Bold; Spacing 6 pt)

The results presented must be sequential from the main results to the supporting results. Use units of measurement based on applicable international standards. You can add diagrams, tables, pictures, and graphs by completing them with narration.

Figures and tables are placed at the end of the manuscript following the following rules:

- 1) Figures, tables, and diagrams must be editable;

- 2) Title of the figure and table is written at the top with times new roman 11, single space;
- 3) Narrative figures and tables are written at the bottom of the tables and figures;
- 4) Fill in the table using times new roman 11, single space. (Times New Roman 12 pt)

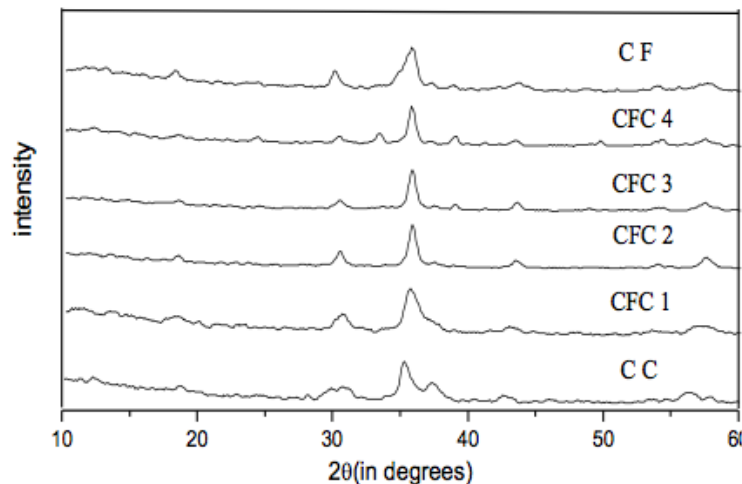


Figure 1. XXXXXX xxxx

DISCUSSION (Times New Roman; 12pts; Bold; Spacing 6 pt)

The discussion should explore the significance of the results of the study. The following components should be covered in discussion: How do your results relate to the original question or objectives outlined in the background section (what)? Do you provide interpretation scientifically for each of your results or findings presented (why)? Are your results consistent with what other investigators have reported (what else)? Or are there any differences?. (Times New Roman 12 pt)

CONCLUSION (Times New Roman; 12pts; Bold; Spacing 6 pt)

Conclusion should answer the objectives of the study. Provide a clear scientific justification for your study, and indicate possible recommendation for nursing practice and future practice. (Times New Roman 12 pt)

REFERENCES (Times New Roman; 12pts; Bold; Spacing 6 pt)

Writing is based on the Author-Year notation system. All references mentioned are written according to the rules of APA Style edition 7, published in the last 10 years and in alphabetical order. References from journals are endeavored to include DOI. Reference writing is expected to use an electronic citation system such as Mendeley, EndNote, or Zotero. (Times New Roman 12 pt)
