CTH attended the first day of the Inquiry, 10th June 2025 - with regards to the plans next to Duchy Court. She delivered an interested party statement that outlined the issues linked to the development as expressed by some members:

- Loss of quality green space
- Issues with accessibility
- Housing Need Assessment and how this identifies the developments that are needed in the Consett Area
- Toxicity of the land and the slag heaps avoid disturbing such land.
- Lack of community buildings in the area.

CTH also attended the inquiry on the afternoon of the 17th June to listen to key evidence and support Forum members.

Note - the inquiry was suspended with the Project Genesis barrister expressing dissatisfaction with the Government Inspector. A new Inquiry date is yet to be decided upon.

CTH put a request for the following:

Freedom of Information Act 2000

This request is being handled under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Your request:

Could you please inform me about how much money Durham County Council gets from Project Genesis when they draw down the land in the Consett area?

With regards to this, is Durham County Council meeting its best value for the land in question?

There have been a series of disputes where Durham County Council are challenging Project Genesis for their use of the land, if the finances linked to this are taken into account, how much money does Durham County Council make from drawing down this land for Project Genesis?

Is the 1993 master agreement between Project Genesis and what was Derwentside Council, and since 2009 with Durham County Council, an illegal document because it is not best value compliant for Durham County Council?

Our response:

As per Section 1 (1) of the FOIA the information is not held by the council in the format requested.

We are unable to provide a response to the information you have requested as these fall outside of the FOI/EIR regime as it asks us to offer an opinion or puts

a question on a request. The basis of the FOI/EIR is to provide recorded information and the questions as phrased do not ask for recorded information.

It is asking for opinion, officer judgement or dispute resolution which is outside of the act. The request is not asking for recorded information as held by the council. Officer judgement and thinking does not have to disclosed under the act, as per the ICO guidance below:

The Act does not cover information that is in someone's head. If a member of the public asks for information, you only have to provide information you already have in recorded form. You do not have to create new information or find the answer to a question from staff who may happen to know it.
