As a result, you were assigned the following sanctions:

Sanctions: 1. Suspension from the Residence Halls/Apartments

Start Date: Monday, March 11, 2024 Complete by: Tuesday, December 31, 2024

A student may be required to move out of the residence halls/apartments for a given period. The student may apply to be readmitted to the residence halls/apartments following the period of suspension. No preference shall be given to such student in the readmission or re-entry process. Any individual under suspension from the residence halls/apartments is prohibited from entering all residence facilities, residence hall cafeterias and the grounds/roadways around the residence hall quads and apartment complexes. Any individual found violating these terms of suspension from the residence halls/apartments may be suspended from the University and subject to prosecution under the law.

You will have until Friday, March 22 at 4:00pm to check out of your residence hall assignment.

#### 2. Residential Probation

Start Date: Wednesday, January 01, 2025 Complete by: Saturday, May 31, 2025

Students may be placed on residential probation for a specified period of time. During this time, students are permitted to continue to reside in University housing. Violations of University policies during the probationary period may result in additional and more significant sanctions including but not limited to housing suspension or expulsion. While on Residential Probation, students will not be able to select to live in West Apartments, Chavez or Tubman Halls during the housing selection period.

I have reviewed your appeal request and all associated case documents and find that the initial decision to be an appropriate response considering this matter's circumstances. Therefore your appeal has been denied, and this decision is final.

Rationale: Based on a case review, your appeal has been denied. The decision is upheld, and based on past conduct history, the sanctions are proportionate. There were no procedural violations detected. The letters attached to your appeal do not change the outcome of the previous conduct officer. Your deadline to vacate the residential facilities has been updated to Friday, March 22, at 4:00 pm.

All findings and sanctions associated with this case will remain on your official university conduct record, and this case is now closed.

I am the Psychiatric provider (PMHNP-BC) who has been treating Patient Amadi Agbomah.

Patient was last seen on 02/06/2024.

Patient is currently diagnosed with (F43.10) Post Traumatic stress disorder, unspecified and (F41.1) General anxiety disorder. Patient is prescribed Paxil 10mg oral tablet.

Amadi has certain limitations due to her disability which affects her activities of daily living. These limitations include the inability to regulate physically and emotionally while in her home and in public. To help alleviate these symptoms and enhance her ability to live independently, I recommend supportive housing in which will allow Patient to focus on her mental health symptoms. Therefore, her request for reasonable accommodation should be granted.
