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Abstract

Introduction to the Problem: State the problem statements of the article briefly and concisely.

Purpose/Study Objectives: State the article's purpose/objective briefly and concisely.

Design/Methodology/Approach: State the article's design/methodology/approach used in the paper.

Findings: Present the article's findings based on the analysis and discussion done in the paper.

Paper Type: Research Article or General Review

Keywords: List the article's 3-5 keywords using the semicolons (;) to separate one word from another. Begin each word with a capital letter.

Note: The total of word accounts in the abstract should not be more than 300 words



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Introduction

The introduction should be clear and set the stage for the topic discussed in the manuscript. Before stating the objectives, authors should give a brief background and a concise literature review. This helps to capture the current scenario, showcase the standout previous research, identify limitations in past studies, propose how to address those limitations, and highlight the scientific significance or innovations of the paper. The paragraph should end with the author/s reflecting on the importance of identifying the issue and the research objectives.

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and maintain 1.15 line spacing for the main body of the manuscript (Introduction to Conclusion).

The Articles section is expected to span between 4000 and 6000 words in length. It should incorporate a minimum of 25 references, and a total of at least 50 body notes, of which no less than 80% should be sourced from journal articles.

How to write a Bodynote:

(the author/contributor's last name, year)

Examples: (Skogly, 2021) or (Larsson & Teigland, 2019) or (Woodside et al., 2021).

If there is more than one, the references remain in one column, separated by a semicolon (;), examples: (Heeks, 2017; Kim et al., 2023) or (Aleksynska, 2021; Au-Yeung & Qiu, 2022; Mäntymäki et al., 2019; Woodside et al., 2021).

If the author is on behalf of an institution/organization, the name should be written in full or use an abbreviated name, examples: (European Commission, 2021) or (The Jakarta Post, 2023) or (East Asia Forum, 2022) or (UN, 2019) or (UNODC, 2022).

Methodology

The inclusion of this approach is optional for original research articles. It is presented in a descriptive manner. The approach, method, or process being discussed is explained in a way that provides a clear and detailed description. It is crucial to provide a general, step-by-step explanation of the research methodology. The primary purpose of employing this method is to offer readers a comprehensive understanding of the techniques employed in the study. It is important to note that this is only applicable to original research articles; it is not required in papers categorised as General Reviews.

Results and Discussion

This section is the most important section of your article. The analysis or results of the research should be clear and concise. The results should summarize (scientific) findings rather than provide data in great detail. Please highlight differences between your results or findings and the previous publications by other researchers.

For direct citation when it is more than four lines, you need to write it in 10 pt with single space, opened and closed with quotation marks (""):

“Subject to the provisions of Article 12, the General Assembly may recommend measures for the peaceful adjustment of any situation, regardless of origin, which it deems likely to impair the general welfare or friendly relations among nations, including situations resulting from a violation of the provisions of the present Charter setting forth the Purposes and Principles of the United Nations.”

Following the main headings should be bold and italic (if any).



Tables and Figures are presented center and cited in the manuscript. The figures should be readable and at least have a resolution of 300 DPI (Dots Per Inch) for excellent printing quality. Table made with the open model (without the vertical lines) as shown below:
