MIEP-Ham

Meeting minutes 1-16-2015, 0900hrs. Mike Coffeen

General discussion: members should join ARRL.org, \$40/yr plus CQ magazine. We need 50% of members to join to get listing of club in ARRL web site. Dick mentioned our Ham group web site- AA7MI, check in Google.

-members present: John, Patricia, Pat (new amateur), Kurt, Pete, Owen, Dick, Mike

Agenda discussions: 1) storm followup- repeater lasted for the event but had little usage, will definitely need a larger battery, we should plan for a 5-10 year event first. With internet access you can view PUD google map that shows emergency truck locations and outage areas. Pete said he used his smart phone to watch the map. Dick discussed FRS network testing scheme, with results of transmissions from roadways, not homes.

- 2) RT System- Dick discussed the programming software available from this company for Baofeng, ~\$100, but software is much better than Baofeng and their cable. Cable works on several makes of portables, software is specific. Pete may also get a copy.
- 3) Repeater location/WSU- Dick stated that WSU is getting down to only a few questions, Kurt has forwarded all the recent e-mails to club. Owen suggested that we just put a 15 amp outlet plug on the trailer which should be adequate current. We need to do a budget for all the expenses on the repeater, just the liability insurance is \$200/yr. To buy the trailer and other items we hope to get financial help from MICA, MIF, MIEP, with MICA owning the trailer. Power options were discussed, including a propane generator, extra charged batteries. A propane generator with a 40 gal tank should last 4 days. Getting large batteries were discussed with venting problems for flooded cell and advantages for AGM. -It was suggested that we talk to DEM about how they have their "corn dog" trailer set up. It has a ham shack and battery bank, no generator. Their target is 7 days of outage with 150 watts of draw.
- 4) Purchase of a trailer should be pursued immediately after we have a signed MOU with WSU. We need formal confirmation that MICA/MIFF will cover the purchase, the insurance and hold the trailer title.
- 5) There should be no discussion with WSU about auxiliary power until we have the present MOU in place. Auxiliary power might be something we bring up once we have been at TVR for a while.

Patricia reported on the possible purchase of bull horns as early warning devices for MI as mounted sirens as in PT are cost prohibitive for us. The idea was rejected.

Bob Hamlin suggested acquiring old police sirens mounted on poles with a switch lock, battery & charger which could be used for Tsunami early warning, fire, etc. Bob said they're successfully used in Oil City at the Ho River by the tribe there. They should be about \$500 each to acquire. It was stated that we need to at least test one... wail sound is most effective, said Bob. No-one volunteered to follow up with the Fire Dept or Police Dept to get further info. It's felt that MI needs an Island wide Audio System of some kind for warning. Will someone take it on?
