Testing Information

Fifth graders will be taking two tests during the month of March.

- The Maryland Integrated Science Assessment (MISA), is administered to all students in fifth grade, eighth grade, and high school. The purpose of the assessment is to provide educators, parents, and the public with information on student progress toward scientific literacy. Click here for more information.
- The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) is a climate survey administered to students and educators. The purpose of the survey is to provide the school, the school system, and the State with valuable information about the learning environment in each school. Information gathered from the survey will ensure that schools across the State promote a climate that supports student learning, and that educators receive critical instructional feedback.

School Calendar Updates:

The Board also approved moving the end of the third marking period from March 28 to April 4, which accounts for inclement weather days and better balances the number of days in each marking

period. Barring any additional inclement weather days, the last day of school will be Wednesday, June 18, 2025. Updates to the June calendar include the following:

The Bellows Spring Early Childhood Classes are making preparations for the upcoming 2025-2026 school year and are accepting applications for general education students to participate as peers through the Learning Together Program (LTP). These classes include general education and special education students. The program's focus is helping all children develop communication, literacy, math, problem solving, motor, and social skills. Parents of children who will be 3 by September 1st, applications are being accepted now.

In alignment with <u>Maryland's Blueprint for the Future</u>, *new LTP applications for students turning* 4 by September 1 will not be available. The Howard County Public School System continues to offer Prekindergarten for income eligible children who will be 4 years old by September 1. Repeated Information

Morning Arrival and Dismissal

If you are driving your student to school please wait in the line, drive over the bridge and drive to the right with the flow of traffic to drop your student off at the circle. Please do not drive over the bridge and turn into the parking lot on the left and have your child walk across where the buses are driving. This is very dangerous and we do not want people walking between the buses. In the afternoon, please wait in the line, drive over the bridge and drive to the right with the flow of traffic to pick up your student. Some parents are parking in the lot on the left. Having them walk alone or with you where the buses are is dangerous. Here is some more clarifying information. All car riders need a sign with big bold letters in their dashboard stating child name, grade level, and teacher. This really helps us expedite the car rider line.

Clothes

Please send in weather appropriate extra clothes (labeled with your child's name) in case your child has a spill or has a bathroom accident and needs to change. Also, if your child has borrowed clothes from the health room, please wash and return them to the health room so that they are available for others. We are running low on our extra clothes available, especially long pants.

Finally, since cold and flu season is upon us, we wanted to send a friendly reminder of when children should be kept at home. Be sure to email **BSESabsence@hcpss.org** when your children do

not come to school due to illness. In your email, please include Name (first, last), Date of Absence, and Reason for Absence in your email.

Students/Staff should NOT come to school with the following:

- *If they had fever reducing medication (Tylenol or Ibuprofen) in the morning before school fever 100.0 F or higher (student may NOT return to school unless they are fever free for 24 hours without medication)
- *severe sore throat
- *hacking and/or disruptive cough
- *difficulty breathing
- *diarrhea or vomiting
- *new onset of severe headache (especially with fever)
