Can you believe your JUNIOR year is finally here?

This year proves to be an exciting year as the School Counseling Department will help you explore your options for the future and assist you in formulating a plan to reach these goals. This newsletter provides important information and resources for the Fall of your Junior year. You will receive more information in December about events and opportunities for the second half of Junior year.

JUNIOR PARENT NIGHT: Please join Ms. Tracy Lenz, Director of School Counseling, at **Junior Parent Night on Tuesday, September 30, 2025 at 6:30pm in the Library Media Center.** This evening will kick off the post-secondary planning process as well as provide information about the benefits of the Naviance Student Program, college visits, SAT/ACT deadlines, and many other topics.

DIGITAL PSAT ADMINISTRATION: The **Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test (PSAT)** will be administered at LOLHS on **Wednesday, October 22, 2025.** The digital PSAT/NMSQT is substantially shorter than its paper and pencil predecessor—lasting 2 hours and 14 minutes instead of almost 3 hours. You'll have more time on average to answer each question, so more than ever before, the digital PSAT/NMSQT measures your skills and knowledge, not test-taking speed. There will be shorter reading passages and a built-in calculator that can be used on the entire Math section.

The digital SAT Suite of Assessments uses multistage adaptive testing. Each test section (Reading and Writing, Math) is divided into two equal-length, separately timed parts, called modules. Students answer a set of questions in the first module before moving on to the next. The questions that students are given in the second module depend on how they performed on the first module. This type of adaptive testing allows for a much shorter, but just as reliable, assessment that delivers accurate scores more efficiently.

We will provide a PSAT Student Bulletin, which contains test information and practice recommendations, in your English class in late September. You will also receive information about the National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (NMSQT) Program. Students should get a good night's sleep on Tuesday evening before the test as well as charge their Chromebooks and put their charger in their backpack. Remember, cellphones, Apple Watches, earbuds and fitness trackers, are NOT ALLOWED in the testing room so please leave them in your car or locker. PSAT Rosters will be posted in the Commons on Friday, October 17th.

Juniors will also take the **NGSS: Next Generation Science Standards on Wednesday, April 8, 2026 here at Lyme-Old Lyme High School.**

ASVAB: Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Test: The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) will be administered at LOLHS to interested juniors and seniors on **Wednesday, October 1, 2025 at 7:40am in the Library/Media Center.** The ASVAB provides valuable information to help select educational and career goals by linking your aptitudes with occupational areas. It can help assess your potential for future formal education and, if you are interested in the military, can help predict what areas of work you would qualify for in the military. Seniors and/or Juniors can sign up through Naviance. Please note, you will need a fully charged CHROMEBOOK for testing day.

NAVIANCE STUDENT: We will once again use our comprehensive future planning site, the **NAVIANCE Student** program. This comprehensive college search tool allows you to search for colleges and then compare your own GPA and test scores with those of former LOLHS students who have been admitted to particular colleges.

PLEASE NOTE: Each parent/guardian has an individual registration code that gives access to the site by linking you to the student's Naviance page.
