Contains regarding research phenomena and problems, literature facts ending with research gaps/differences and novelty from previous research, research objectives, and reasons/statements that provide value/significance/justification for conducting research.

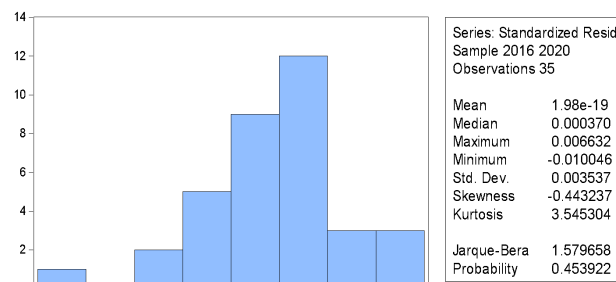
