### **Candidate Information**

Emmanuel Macron (La République En Marche):

- Emmanuel Macron (b. 1977) is the 25<sup>th</sup> and current President of France. Originally a member of the Socialist Party, Macron had served as a senior advisor and Minister of Finance to former President François Hollande. In 2016, Macron left PS to form his own political party, La République En Marche. Branding himself as a progressive and pro-European politician, Macron scored a decisive victory over Marine Le Pen in the second round of voting in the 2017 French Presidential Election. During his presidency, Macron has faced a number of political and social crises ranging from the Yellow Vests (Gilet Jaunes) protests to the COVID-19 Pandemic. Seeking to head off future challenges by Marine Le Pen and other right-wing leaders, Macron and his party have embraced a ‘law and order’ approach to

governance, prioritizing aggressive policies such as the Global Security Bill, the Islamic Separatist Bill, and a significant reduction on immigration. At the current moment, Macron – who has not made a formal decision of whether to stand in the 2022 election – is the current favorite to win the 2022 Presidential Election.<sup>1</sup>

Marine Le Pen (Rassemblement National):

- Marine Le Pen (b. 1968) is the current leader of the far-right Rassemblement National (National Rally) party. Although Le Pen has sought to present herself as a more moderate and mainstream candidate than her father, Jean-Marie Le Pen, she still favors hardline policies on immigration, security, and Islam.<sup>2</sup> As of October 2021, Le Pen remains one of the favorites to challenge President Macron in the upcoming election. However, Le Pen's popularity has dropped significantly due to a poor showing by Rassemblement National in the 2021 regional elections and the unexpected rise of Eric Zemmour, a far-right television pundit who is now seen as the primary challenger to President Macron.<sup>3</sup>

Xavier Bertrand (Les Républicains):

- Xavier Bertrand (b. 1965) is the current President of the Regional Council for Hauts de France and the perennial frontrunner in the race

to represent Les Républicains in the 2022 Presidential Election. Although Bertrand has long been seen as an outsider to the mainstream right, Bertrand's simple nature and working-class conservatism has appealed to a wide-range of French voters – much to the ire of LR leaders - who feel that they have been neglected by the political class.<sup>4</sup> Despite Bertrand's middle-class appeal, he currently sits in fourth place in the polls, trailing President Macron, Eric Zemmour, and Marine Le Pen.<sup>5</sup>

Jean-Luc Mélenchon: (La France Insoumise):

- Jean Luc Mélenchon (b. 1951) is the current head of the progressive La France Insoumise (Rebellious France) party. Often described as a left-wing populist and a democratic socialist, Mélenchon has advocated for a French exit from both the European Union and NATO. Equally important, Mélenchon and LFI have upheld traditional progressive policies such as gender equality, the fair treatment of migrants, and an end to Islamophobia and anti-Muslim stigmatization.<sup>6</sup>

Anne Hidalgo (Parti Socialiste):

- Anne Hidalgo (b. 1959) is the current Mayor of Paris and the Socialist Party's candidate in the 2022 Presidential Elections. Originally from the Andalusia region of Spain, Hidalgo has taken a particularly sensitive approach towards immigrants – a sharp contrast from the

attitudes of compatriots on the right. In addition to her support of a ‘humane’ immigration policy, Hidalgo has also been a strong supporter of eco-friendly initiatives.<sup>7</sup> At the current moment, Hidalgo trails every major French candidate in the polls.

Yannick Jadot (Green Party):

- Yannick Jadot (b. 1967) is a current member of the European Parliament and the Green Party’s (EELV) candidate for President. As typical with Green Party candidates, much of Jadot’s political positions are centered around an effective response to global climate change and the implementation of green/eco-friendly policies. Described as a pragmatist, Jadot seeks to implement a “solutions based” approach to the current environmental crisis.<sup>8</sup> Despite a common agreement amongst French politicians that climate change presents one of the most significant challenges of the modern era, Jadot and the EELV are currently polling second to last amongst major candidates in the 2022 Presidential Election.

Eric Zemmour (Independent – Far Right):

- Eric Zemmour (b. 1958) is a French far-right journalist, author, and television pundit who has been mentioned as a possible candidate in the 2022 Presidential Election. Commonly known for his controversial and extreme right-wing views on immigration, Islam, and

LGBTQ rights, Zemmour has sought to provide the French far-right with another alternative to the increasingly moderate Marine Le Pen. Although Zemmour has repeatedly turned down requests to run for President, some French polls currently show him as the primary challenger to Emmanuel Macron in the 2022 Presidential Election.<sup>9</sup>

## **Key Issues**

### **COVID-19**

#### Summary:

- With over 6,800,000 million cases and nearly 115,000 deaths, France has been one of the hardest hit countries by the COVID-19 pandemic.<sup>10</sup> According to a paper by Or et al, the pandemic “brought into light structural weaknesses of the health system, including its governance and decision making process.”<sup>11</sup> Despite a wide-ranging vaccine campaign - around 76% of the population has received at least one dose of a government approved COVID-19 vaccine (Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca, Johnson & Johnson), the government has been accused of abusing its power and mismanaging the health crisis.<sup>12</sup> In particular, Macron has come under fire for the draconian measures implemented during the country’s three national lockdowns, the government issued Health Pass (Pass Sanitaire), and an alleged

neglect of the national healthcare system during the pandemic.

### Economic Recovery/Recession

Summary:

- Like many other countries, France's economy has been hit hard by the COVID-19 Pandemic. In 2020, the French economy contracted by over eight percent as a result of two national lockdowns and large-scale community spread of COVID-19.<sup>13</sup> This marks France's worst recession since the Second World War. In response to the pandemic, the French Government has introduced a series of monetary assistance schemes such as payment deferrals, rate reductions (taxes), state compensation, and economic stimulus measures (loans,

moratoriums, debt repayments) in addition to a support for the social and solidarity economy and a wide-ranging economic recovery plan.<sup>14</sup> Despite the continued spread of COVID-19 and the introduction of the highly contagious Delta Variant, the French economy is predicted to grow an estimated 8% in 2021.<sup>15</sup>

**Security/Police Violence**

Summary:

- In April of 2020, the LREM controlled National Assembly (lower house of the French Parliament) passed a wide-ranging security bill, greatly expanding the authority of the Police. Despite the government’s claims that the new law will better protect officers and allow them to effectively perform their jobs, opponents have claimed that the new law is too vague and can easily be abused. In particular, critics argue that Article 24 - a section of the bill which makes it illegal to share or publish images of active duty police officers - will restrict the ability of the public to report acts of police violence.<sup>16</sup> Prime Minister Jean Castex has since said that the article would be ‘amended.’<sup>17</sup>

**Islam/Laïcité**

Summary:

- Throughout his term, President Macron has worked to uphold Laïcité (French Secularism) and prevent the spread of radical Islam within the country. In February of 2021, the French Parliament passed a bill designed to curtail the influence of Islamic ‘separatism’ in the country, promising stronger oversight of “mosques, schools, and sports clubs to safeguard France from radical Islamists and promote respect for French values.”<sup>18</sup> This new legislation comes in the face of two violent attacks by Islamic extremists that claimed the life of Samuel Paty, a schoolteacher in northwest Paris who was beheaded for showing images of the Prophet Muhammed to his class, and a series of stabbing that killed three people in Nice.<sup>19</sup> Despite large support for the bill in the French

Parliament, opponents claim that the law unfairly targets members of the country’s estimated five million Muslims.<sup>20</sup>

### Immigration

Summary:

- Although France has not experienced the large-scale migrant crisis faced by Germany, Hungary, Austria, and Greece, the number of asylum applications within the country has grown exponentially in the last five years.<sup>21</sup> Reeling from a series of devastating terrorist

attacks and fearing an influx of refugees from the Middle East, far-right figures such as Marine Le Pen and Eric Zemmour - who have called for strict limits on immigration - have skyrocketed in popularity. This approach has also been mirrored by the Macron government who recently passed legislation making it more difficult for migrants to legally enter the country.<sup>22</sup>

**Pension Reform**

Summary:

- President Macron’s attempt to overhaul France’s dated pension system has become a key issue in the 2022 Presidential Election.

Although Macron’s proposed reforms were intended to streamline the current system, they have been met with substantial backlash from several groups.<sup>23</sup> From December 2019 to February 2020, hundreds of thousands of French citizens participated in nationwide protests calling for President Macron to scrap his plans to universalize the current pension system.<sup>24</sup> Despite resulting in some of the largest and most sustained strikes in Modern French history, the government has stated that it intends to address the issue of pension reform once the

## Gender Equality

### Summary:

- Although France ranks highly within the EU on Women’s Rights (abortion has been legal on the national level since 1975), the country still struggles with reports of Femicide – the intentional killing of women and girls – domestic violence, and sexual harassment in the workplace.<sup>26</sup> According to Human Rights Watch, incidents of domestic violence rose approximately 30% during the first week of the national lockdown in March 2020. Moreover, French police had reported at least ninety instances of femicide/sexual violence by December of 2020.<sup>27</sup> France was also heavily impacted by the #MeToo – the French called their movement #BalanceTonPorc (Rat out your Pig). Despite a lack of “significant convictions or resignations”, the movement has greatly increased “the visibility of victims.”<sup>28</sup>

### Climate Change

#### Summary:

Climate Change – like in many other countries – has had a major effect on France. This has been especially true in recent years as the country has suffered from extreme heatwaves and large-scale flooding.<sup>29</sup> Despite being a member of the Paris Climate Accord and promising to shift to a ‘Green Economy’, the French government has been criticized by both the United Nations and the country’s independent High Council for the Climate for failing to meet its goals for combating Climate Change.<sup>30</sup> In response to these shortcomings, President Macron recently announced his intention to add a provision to the French constitution guaranteeing “environmental protection and biological diversity” in addition to an

ambitious effort to combat climate change.<sup>31</sup> However, climate activists have continued to criticize the government for not doing enough stating, “as it stands, the proposed law is a climatic and social failure.”<sup>32</sup>

**Counterterrorism (the Sahel and the Middle East)**

Summary:

- Since the early to mid 2010s, France has participated in major counterterrorism operations in both the Middle East and its former colonies in the Sahel.

- In 2013, French troops were deployed to Mali to assist the government in pushing back Islamic militants that had gained a foothold in the country. The mission has since been succeeded by Operation Barkhane – an anti-insurgent operation that seeks to provide counterterrorism support for G5 Sahel governments and prevent terrorist groups from regaining a foothold in the region.<sup>33</sup>
- In 2014, France launched Operation Chammal in an effort to contain the rapid expansion of the Islamic State in Iraq and Syria. Initially French forces conducted limited airstrikes on ISIL positions in the Levant. However, the size and scope of these operations was greatly increased after the 2015 Paris Attacks.
- In addition to Iraq and Syria, France has also deployed military forces in Libya where – alongside Russia and the United Arab Emirates – it has supported the forces of renegade Libyan general Khalifa Haftar against the UN backed Government of National Accord.<sup>34</sup>
- Despite devoting massive amounts of resources to counterterrorism operations at home and abroad, France has struggled to contain the spread of Islamic extremism. In the past decade, nearly 1,300 people have been killed or injured in terrorist attacks on French soil - the most notable being the 2015 Paris attacks in which Islamic State gunmen and suicide bombers killed 130 people and wounded 350 more.<sup>35</sup>

- As of 2021, French authorities are believed to be monitoring roughly 15,000 terrorism suspects.<sup>36</sup> Equally important, the French government has worked to keep tabs on at least 1,400 radicalized individuals in French prisons and the approximately 2,000 French citizens who have left the country to join terrorist organizations since 2016.<sup>37</sup>

**Foreign Policy (European Union/AUKUS)**

Summary:

- As one of the bloc’s founding members and the seat of the European Parliament, France has long favored a strong relationship with the EU.<sup>38</sup> However, the 2015 migrant crisis and the subsequent rise of populist forces in Europe has led some French citizens questioning the benefits of the European Union.
- On September 15, 2021, the US, Australia, and the UK announced the creation of a trilateral security pact (AUKUS) in which

Washington and London would provide the Australian government with nuclear powered submarines. The French – who had signed a \$66 billion submarine deal with Canberra in 2016 – were shocked and dismayed by the announcement of the agreement, referring to it as “knife-in-the-back.”<sup>39</sup> For Macron and the French government, who have sought to maintain France’s traditional role as a global power, the AUKUS debacle has created an existential crisis in which the French people have begun to question their country’s place in the world. Additionally, AUKUS represents a significant setback for French power projection in the Pacific – which it sees as currently dominated by the US and China.<sup>40</sup>
