### Final Assessments – Exams and RSTs – School Year Calendar

Grade 9 - 12 students' examinations and Rich Summative Tasks (RSTs) <u>WILL NOT</u> be rescheduled for holiday or travel convenience, and all appointments should be scheduled so as not to conflict with exams and RSTs. If a medical problem arises, the school must be contacted prior to the exam or RST. Medical certificates might be required to permit alternate arrangements for final examinations in these cases. <u>Here is a copy of the schedule</u>

Students and Parents/Guardians can refer to the OCSB website for the Grade 9 - 12 calendar. These calendars identify the first and last day of school, PD days, Statutory Holidays, Board Holidays, and High School exams. As a general rule, it is prudent to avoid any planned student absences during the months of January and June as this is when RSTs and exams are scheduled.

### Semester 2 Start and Cameras/Engagement Reminder

Semester 2 began on Monday February 3rd.

Below is a reminder about engagement and camera expectations for students. If for some reason, students do not have a working camera on their device, they can be easily purchased at locations such as <u>Amazon</u> or Best Buy. Below is information which has been shared earlier.

- Q. What expectations are there for synchronous learning (i.e. learning via google meet)?
- A. Students need to be engaged in the learning process, just as they would be expected to for in-person learning. Daily attendance is taken. Students are expected to attend classes, participate in their virtual class meetings each day as they would for in-person instruction through cameras being on and/or providing feedback to the teacher.

Students who do not maintain regular attendance and/or demonstrate active participation in the learning process, may lose access to the google meet.

# Regular Attendance and Participation is necessary for success! What does being Present in class mean?

### Being Responsive

Respond to teacher when called on for attendance and **regularly engage throughout the meet** when asked to by your teacher. If you do not respond after the first 5-10 minutes of class you will be removed from the meet and marked absent. It is the student's responsibility to identify to the teacher if they are going to be late or absent and identify when they arrive. If you need help, ask!

### Communication

If you need to have a bathroom or brief body break which will take you away from your screen please ensure you send a private chat message to your teacher when you "leave" the class and when you "return". That way you will not be marked absent. This is similar as to what happens during in-person learning.

## Individual Breakout Sessions with Teacher

Camera is to be turned on in individual breakout room with the teacher. This is to support your academic success and to engage in the OBSERVATION and CONVERSATION component of assessment. You need to work with the classroom teacher, just as you would for in-person learning.

#### Use of Class Time

Classwork, assignments, projects, tests etc., etc are only accessible and will only be evaluated if you are **present** and participating in the Google Meet. Regular attendance is a requirement of synchronous virtual learning, similar to in-person learning.

### Q: What type of device do I need?

A: Students need to have a working electronic device (chromebook/laptop) with a fully functional camera and microphone to access google meets with their student email account. Students are expected to use these tools in order to be considered fully engaged in class. Students must be prepared to participate and interact with staff and peers.

Students must be logged in and actively participating.

An important reminder for parents and students who are taking Elearn courses. Elearn (asynchronous) is different from Synchronous classes (done through google meet). Ensure you check your D2L site (on the student portal) for information related to your elearn course (asynchronous). Keep up with the work. Don't fall behind! Most students in grades 11-12 will have at least one elearn course on their timetable. Some students in grade 10 will have an elearn. A few students in grade 9 will have an elearn course on their timetable.

## eLearning Classes -Tips for Success

If you are enrolled in e-learning classes for semester 1 or 2, please see below for some important information.

- Your class teacher is your main point of contact for your online learning class. Contact your teacher immediately if you have questions or concerns, or if you need support. Connect with your class teacher early and regularly throughout your course.
- Stay on track with your online learning course by intentionally scheduling time into every school day.
- Success in online learning requires your active participation in all aspects of the course. Complete all assignments on time and to the best of your ability.
- You are expected to follow the timelines, guidelines, and expectations of the school board hosting the course.

Other Questions and Answers

- Q. What is Immunization Surveillance?
- A. A review of every child's immunization record by Ottawa Public Health. It Ensures that the information in the Provincial database is up-to-date and meets the Immunization of School Pupils Act and/or Child Care and Early Years Act.
- Q. Where can students get their missing vaccines if they don't have a family doctor?
- A. OPH and Kids Come First will be offering routine vaccination clinics. Please visit our website at <a href="https://www.ParentinginOttawa.ca/immunization">www.ParentinginOttawa.ca/immunization</a> for more details.
- Q. How long does it take for OPH to update immunization records submitted online or by fax?
- A. It can take up to 5 business days for OPH to update a record.
- Q. What should a parent do if there is a discrepancy between what the family doctor has recorded and what OPH says?

A. Inform the parent to contact OPH to verify the status of the immunization record. OPH does not receive automatic updates from health care providers.

## **Click Here** to view More Information On eligible Service Hours for students

To graduate high school, students must complete 40 hours of volunteer community involvement. Community involvement activities may be done in many places, including charities, not-for-profit organizations, and public sector institutions (including hospitals and libraries). The OCSB has developed a list of community involvement activities that are considered acceptable. Unapproved activities cannot be started until permission has been granted by the school.

### **TVO Mathify Tutoring Service for Students**

TVO Mathify is an Ontario online tutoring service that is now offering math help for students up to Grade 12. Students will need to register to create an account using their Ontario education number (OEN). The service connects students with a certified Ontario teacher where one-on-one tutoring can occur. The service is publicly funded so there is no cost to families.



### Step 1

- Log into your child's Google account (specific to each child), access their respective student portal
  - o On a Chromebook, log into the device with their account.

### Step 2

On a PC/Mac, using the Chrome Browser, access a child's respective Chrome Profile.

- Then, visit the Student Portal K-6, Student Portal 7-12
- Click on "Form Portal" (top left)

### Step 3

• Click on the "Electronic Device Responsible use agreement" (ALL)

### Step 4

- Fill in the respective demographic data for your child (student number will be automatically filled in),
- Choose Grade, then respective school.
- Review the required field, with your child,
- Sign the form,

• Submit.
