- A Transportation Update
 - o The changes to transportation for some students came as a surprise to us. I put it in our weekly newsletter as soon as we heard and we have received a lot of responses.
 - o We had already been requesting additional service to the school from OCTranspo before this change was announced.
 - o We are working with OSTA and OCTranspo, along with the councilor's office, to continue to advocate for change as we don't believe it's an acceptable route for our students.
 - Laura Dragone, assistant to Jessica Bradley, City Councilor, is joining us tonight. She notes: StFX is not in our ward but many parents and students live in our ward. Councilor Bradley send her regrets, noting she wanted to be here. The route review came up and concerns were raised by parents. As a result of the volume of emails from parents, we secured a meeting with transit services (as high up as we could) to advocate on your behalf. Councilor Bradley supports parents on this issue. The new route (bus, LRT, bus) is unreasonable for young kids. OCTranspo has committed to
