EQ Color Run/Walk 2024 Information

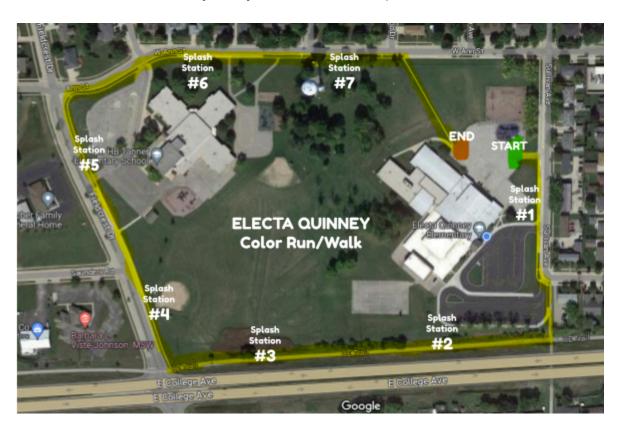

Helpful Information -

- Students should wear clothing and shoes that you do not mind getting powdered color on. Thank you for helping make sure your child has tennis shoes appropriate for running/walking.
- The PAC is providing every student that registered on FundHub with a white Color Run shirt. They will receive that the day of the race. They can then change into their color run shirt and will have the shirt they wore to school to change into after if they desire. The Color Run shirt is theirs to keep.
 - Option Send your child with a plastic bag to put their color run t-shirt in after the event.
- Students who earned any incentives depending on donations (sunglasses, etc.) have already received those items.
- Students who did not earn incentives are encouraged to bring sunglasses (to keep sun and dust out of their eyes). Students can also wear a bandana to cover their hair or to cover their mouth if they desire. Since face masks are more prominent these days, that could be an option too if a child desires. None of these items are required, just options/ideas.

- Any child that does not want to get sprayed with powder does not need to go through the spray station but will be able to run/walk around the powder stations.
- Please send a beach towel to school. This towel can be used on the seat of the car. or bus on the way home. It can also be used to sit on for our picnic bag lunch.
- The color powder is not intended to stain or dye clothing. For best results removing the color, brush off as much of the powder as you can before it gets wet. Then, wash the clothes on a regular wash cycle or handwash the affected area until the color comes out. We will have a brush off station for students to use at school after their grade level run/walk.

In addition to the Color Run/Walk we will also eat a **PICNIC LUNCH** together (12-12:50) as an entire school community. If your child does not take hot lunch, please send a cold lunch with your child.

At the end of the event students will also have time playing on the playground and being entertained by the students who earned a chance to dunk a staff member or community member.

Please read these safety FAQS and guidelines since you know what they say: "An apple a day keeps..." Oh, wait. Wrong one. "Keep your arms and legs inside the vehicle at all..." Nope, not that either. Just go on ahead and read the safety FAQs.

Q: What if it the color powder gets in eyes?

A: The easiest solution is to not throw the color powder in the face. Tell anyone who will be touching the color powder to aim for the body and not the head. (Isn't that always a cheap shot anyway?) You could also encourage participants to wear cool sunglasses to reduce the risk of getting the powder in the eye. If color powder does get into the eye, rinse thoroughly with water until the irritation goes away.

Q: Can we eat the colors?

A: We recommend wearing it, throwing it, even jumping into it, but not ingesting it. If you cannot resist the desire to try it, please know it is gluten-free. Our materials are non-toxic, and technically edible. We just don't think you'll want to add our color powders to your culinary craft collection. It is corn starch, but will probably taste like colored dirt.

Q: Can we inhale color powders?

A: Inhaling color powder is like breathing in dust and dirt, extensive exposure is not recommended.

Q: Are the colors safe?

A: Our vibrant colors are made up of corn starch and FD&C and/or D&C colors. Color safety information: Approved for use in foods, cosmetics and/or drugs. These products are not considered hazardous, 29 CFR 1910-1200.
