Grading Policy: Your quarterly grade will be calculated with the following weights:

- Daily Grades 40% at least one daily grade will be earned weekly. These may be from labs, problem sets or other in-class activities.
- Assessments & Retest Policy (Projects/Quizzes/Tests) 60%

Each chapter will have at least 2 quiz assessments and a chapter test. The chapter test will count but can also replace the lowest quiz grade. (So for example you make a 70 & 80 on quizzes. Then make a 90 on the chapter test. Your grades in the grade book would be 80,90,90 for the test/project category).

Your semester average is computed by averaging the two quarterly grades (40% each) with the final exam (20%).
