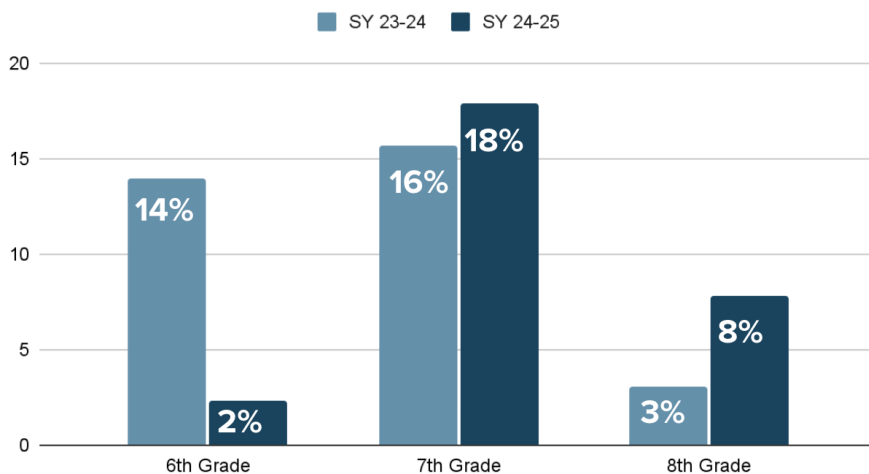
What's going well?

What are we monitoring?

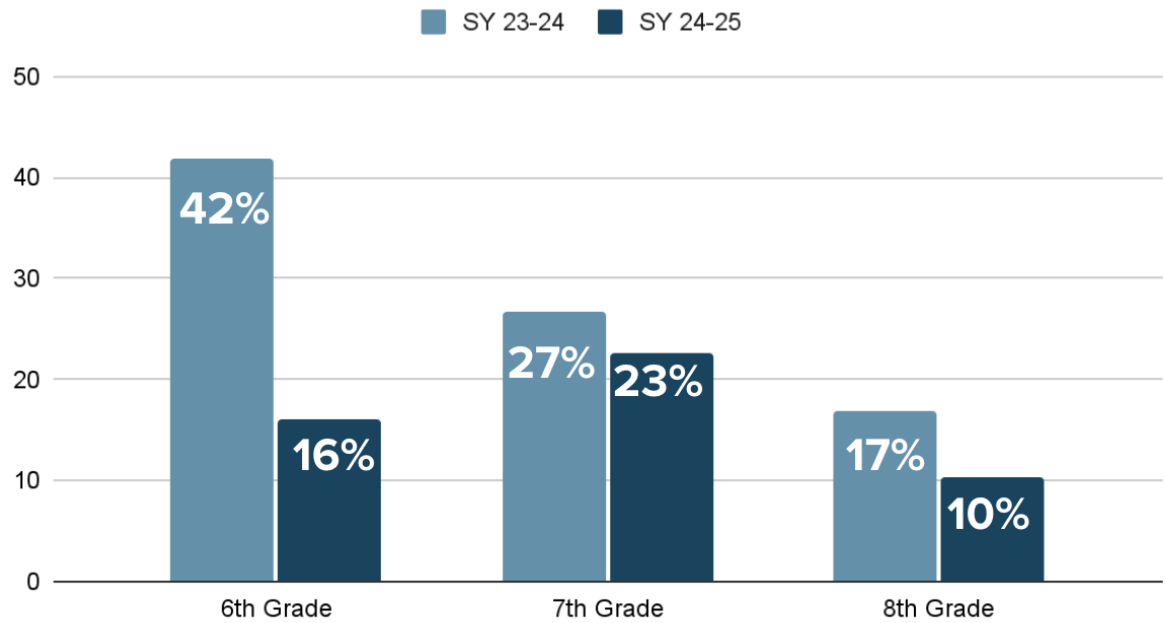
- Preliminary OSTP assessment scores have been released. In May, the Commission for Educational Quality and Accountability (CEQA) voted to restore Oklahoma's cut scores to 2023 levels to better align with national standards. We are told that the decision aims to align with National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) benchmarks and ensure proficiency reflects true college and career readiness. As a result, we may see fewer students scoring at the Proficient level across the state. This reflects more rigorous standards, not a decline in student achievement.

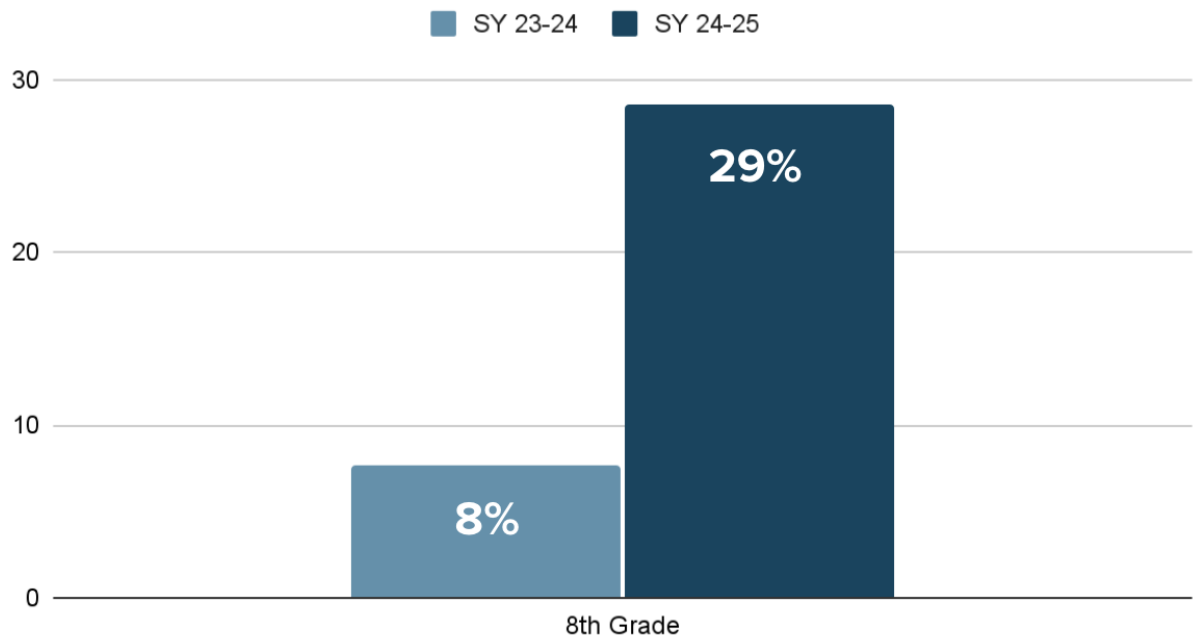




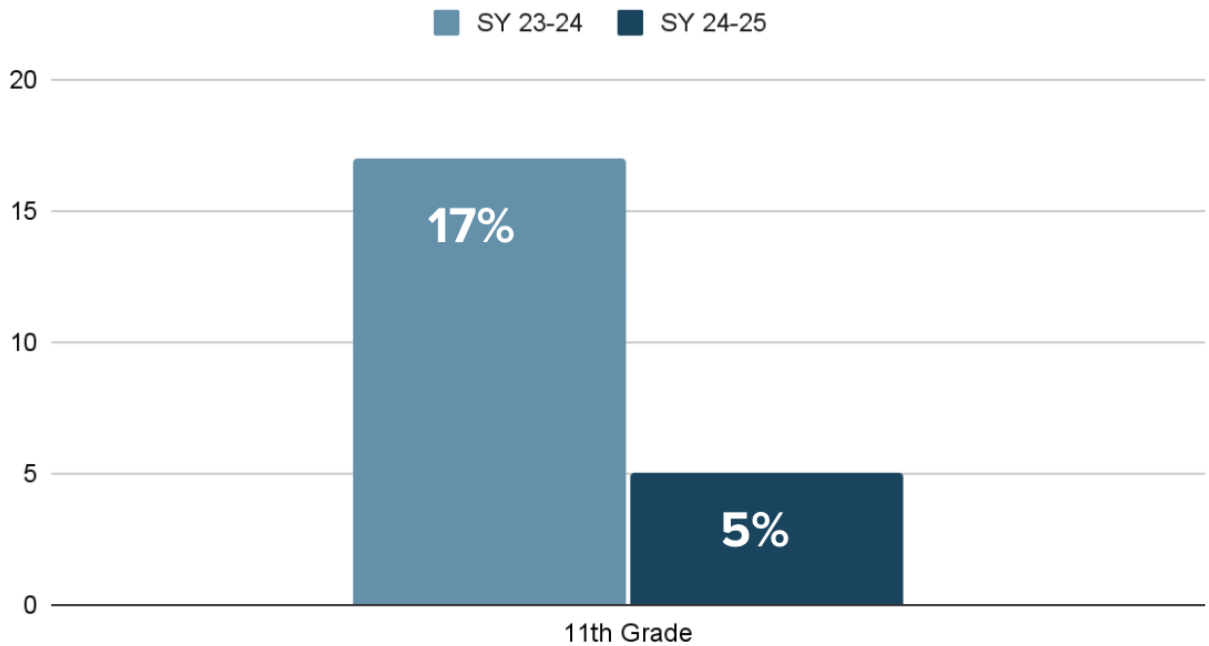
ELA- Comparative OSTP Data



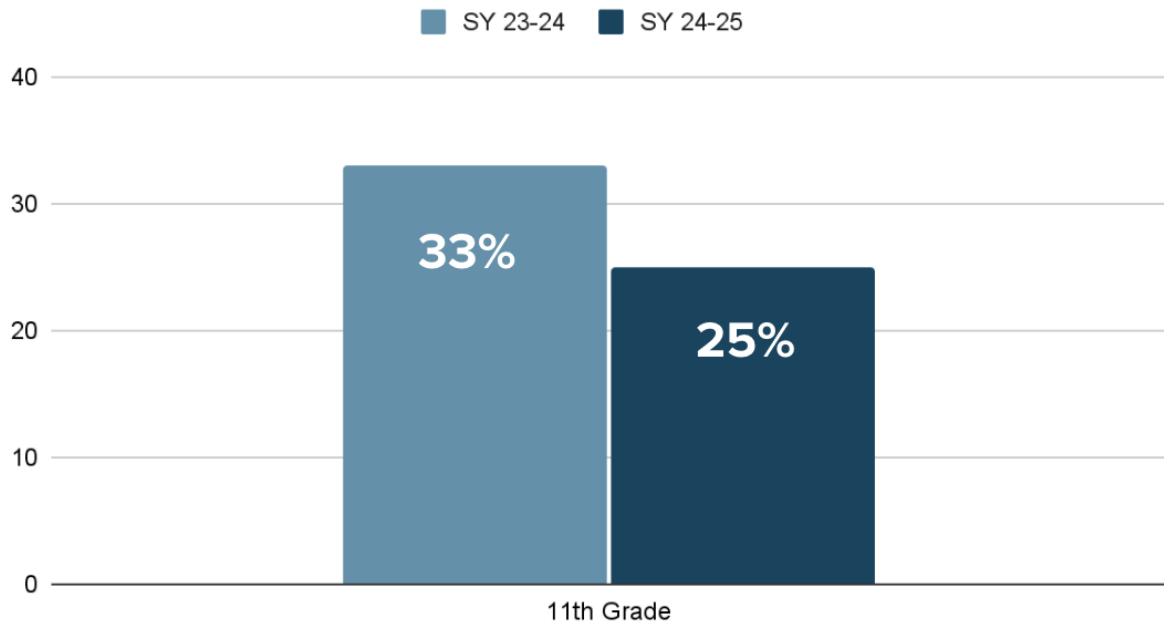
Science- Comparative OSTP Data

Levelfield Partnership

- Levelfield is supporting KIPP Tulsa by conducting a comprehensive analysis of current facility conditions and future site opportunities as part of a long-term facility planning process. Their work includes evaluating the condition, capacity, and strategic fit of the two Tulsa Public Schools buildings currently leased by KIPP Tulsa, Woods (KTCP), and Mark Twain (KTUP). Through data collection, on-site assessments, and engagement with school leadership, Levelfield is helping determine whether purchasing, renovating, or relocating these campuses, or identifying new sites altogether, would best support KIPP Tulsa's goals for growth, sustainability, and alignment with the communities we serve.
