### Civil Discourse Boosts Student Achievement

Decades of research shows that civil discourse lessons boost students' overall academic and social-emotional success. Evidence from more than 20 international studies showed that engagement in high-quality classroom discussions improved overall student performance in core subjects, as measured by national and global exams (Alexander, 2012). While all students benefited from this approach, students from multilingual backgrounds appeared to gain an extra boost. Research demonstrated that lessons in civil discourse and oracy—defined as proficiency in oral expression and comprehension—significantly improved the spoken English skills of multilingual students, leading to increased confidence and engagement in all educational areas (Kotler et al., 2001).

### Civil Discourse Fits in Any Classroom

Making space within your existing curriculum for civil discourse lessons maximizes student learning with minimal time commitment. Teachers don't need to worry about straying from required content, because the civil discourse framework fits within existing curricula. In

fact, civil discourse lessons improve student understanding of all educational content, as students are given the chance to think deeply and discuss the material with their peers.

Teacher-led lectures require students to take notes and sit passively. Students in these lessons miss out on opportunities to develop important communication skills, healthy reasoning, and social-emotional learning. By contrast, in civil discourse lessons, all students are actively engaged, so learning takes place on a deeper level.
