School Supply Fees

Rayleigh Elementary offers and strongly encourages a user fee program for school supplies with payment through School Cash Online. For a nominal fee, we supply all pens, pencils, exercise books, crayons etc. School fees include a \$15 Performance fee so that we can bring in live performances to the school for students to enjoy.

Money

Please do not send money to the school with your child unless there has been a written request from the teacher. Our school offers [SchoolCash Online](#), which provides you with the convenience of paying online for school items such as field trips, school supply fees, etc. This is the preferred way for families to pay for school-related items.

Forms & Permissions

During the first full week of school, we will send home forms that require Parent/Caregiver signatures. Please ensure these forms are checked over for accuracy and returned to the school as soon as possible.

Emergency Preparedness Drills

All schools participate in Emergency Preparedness Drills each year. We will have six fire drills, two lockdown practices and an Earthquake drill. If your child talks to you about these drills, please reassure them that the practices are to ensure their safety in an emergency.

Dress Code

While at school, students are expected to dress in a way that aligns with the learning environment that they are in. Rayleigh Elementary follows the SD73 Dress Code and this includes choosing clothing that avoids the following things:

- promoting the use of tobacco, illegal drugs or alcohol
- advocating for illegal activity
- promoting hatred of a person or persons, including, but not limited to, clothing that denigrates or promotes hate based on race, colour, ancestry, place of origin, religion, marital status, family status, physical or mental disability, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity and/or expression, or age
- containing profanity, pornography or obscene images

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Personal Digital Devices

Rayleigh Elementary School's personal digital devices guidelines & expectations are guided by the Provincial Government and SD73 and have been developed with staff and parents/caregivers to promote online safety and focused learning environments for all students.

During Instructional Time (class time & field trips), student use of personal digital devices is only permitted based on staff discretion. Criminal Record Checks for Volunteers

All volunteers that wish to be involved in field trips and other school based activities are required to submit a criminal record check. Once completed, criminal record checks are valid for three years. On July 1, 2024, we were informed that all Criminal Record Checks must be completed through the online [Criminal Record Check](#) Review program as the RCMP no longer offer an in-person option. We

usually receive these online reviews within 3-4 days of submission. We encourage anyone interested in volunteering to proactively complete this process as soon as possible.

Lunch Hour Supervisors

We have a list of parents/caregivers who are on our Lunch Hour Supervision Team and we have room for a few more people to join the team. Lunch Hour Supervisors must have a completed Criminal Record Check on file and have read through our Rayleigh Elementary Lunch Hour Supervisors' Handbook. This is considered a volunteer position and comes with a \$12 per day honorarium. Lunch Hour Supervisors can sign up on a flexible schedule ranging from one day a week to five days a week. Student Absences

Parents/Caregivers are encouraged to no longer leave a message on the school's answering machine. Our system handles the majority of parent/caregiver contact (including phone calls) for current and upcoming student absences. If your child arrives late or needs to leave part way through the day, they **must** be signed in or out at the office.
