

MAGA Chronicles: The Return of the King - A Review of the Second Season

It's a story right out of Hollywood. The loyal fanbase of the MAGA show has been waiting for four long years. On January 20th, 2025, the new livestream started: The second season of "MAGA: The Return of the King" is finally here!

The first season (MAGA: Chaos in the Capitol) has often been described as a dark slapstick comedy of cheap production value. Partly hilarious, partly horrifying - like a fever dream on acid. Its script was so absurd, not even a Silicon Valley super AI, held captive in an echo chamber of Reddit, X, and 4chan, would have been able to come up with such dialogue.

But, due to a multi-billion-dollar budget sponsored by the US taxpayer, the saga could double down on ambition in season two. This time, the producers were able to hire professional screenwriters and the result proves them right. It is a much darker and more serious attempt to rewrite American filmmaking history.

"MAGA: The Return of the King" is best described as a political thriller in the style of Roland Emmerich's blockbuster classic *"White House Down"* - but with zombies.

It is popcorn cinema at its peak, with all the best ingredients Hollywood has to offer: Patriotic US zombies, Russian spies, a coup in the White House, and the return of the Nazis! All of that is happening on the brink of an economic collapse and a looming nuclear holocaust. *Hell yeah! Drill, baby, drill for your spot in the atomic bunker!*

Cast

Most of the original cast is back for season two. Once again, the Orange Man gives only a half-believable performance as Krasnov, an autocratic caricature of an elderly and confused US president. He delivers his dialogue with a mixture of early stage dementia and very dry humor - inappropriate granddad jokes, if you will.

The rumor is that the writers tried to kill off the character Krasnov, after the Orange Man's performance in the first season was heavily criticized by large parts of the audience. But in the end, the studio decided in favor of the Orange Man because he still draws the biggest crowds.

Fortunately, the new main character Elmo is just killing it as an autistic Bond villain on a ketamine-fueled power trip, out there to disrupt: America first, and then the rest of the universe. He's brilliantly played by a humanoid-looking car salesman from Mars.

Compared to Elmo and Krasnov, the rest of the characters seem like a bunch of NPCs lacking any signs of inner life or impact on the story whatsoever. Sure, the costume design of the First Lady fits the theme like a hooker's dress on an Eastern European wedding. *But honestly, I really don't care, do you?*

I believe the audience deserves more than just pseudo-intellectual bullshit. More personality, more real character. But instead, we get cunts like Vice President Jerk Donald's Lance. His character could have added real depth as a moral antagonist to the president, like in the first season. Unfortunately, this opportunity was missed and JD is just an angry, obedient church boy that only gets off by role-playing his Fuhrer's perverted ideas on the world stage. *Thanks for nothing, JD!*

Production Design & Music

Visually, the 1930s are definitely back in fashion. The show is kept in a campy red and blue tone, elevated with a hint of iconic white supremacy. Very Riefenstahl-esque!

Too bad the music disappoints, though. There are a few classic gay club bangers like *YMCA*, *Dancing Queen* and *Bohemian Rhapsody* sprinkled in. But otherwise, it's mostly the same old "Oh, say can you see ..." theme song on repeat. "Yes, we can! We've seen it for decades, but we can't listen to this bullshit anymore", the viewer wants to scream at the person responsible for that crime against humanity.

A Short Recap

Just like last season, the show starts off with a zombie infection caused by a mind virus, the origins of which are not really explained. (But those who can connect the dots and do their own research, will find that it probably has something to do with Chinese food).

The mind virus spreads through US social media like a Californian wildfire in autumn. It turns your friendly neighbor Ted into a brainless zombie with a red hat who only wants to watch Fox News and drink Bud Light all day long.

Pretty standard stuff so far. The only difference compared to last season is that a new and superior strain of Uber-zombies has developed that wear black hats now. These Uber-zombies have even more rotten brains than their buddies with the red hats. Somehow, this leads to a great transvaluation of American values in their judgment. And so they get their asses off the couch and onto the streets. Zombie revolution, here we go!

Terrified to the bone, the uninfected half of the population tries to protect themselves against the disease with a vaccine. Unfortunately, most of them get blue-pilled by the side effects of ignorance, hypocrisy, and hyper-wokeness. In other words, they are down the Neo-Marxist rabbit hole and out of their minds for good.

Only a small fraction of Americans are still healthy. With sweaty hands, they try to get the fuck out across the nearest border, before it's considered illegal emigration due to the new quarantine rules.

The conflict arises with regard to the obvious question: Can the brave and freedom-loving people of the greatest nation in the world still manage to escape the trap that is the

basement of their own house, while the undead capitalist serial killer with the bloody knife is already on the stairs, slowly closing the door behind him?

Current Season

The hero of the current season is once again Krasnov, a simple man from humble beginnings and Germanic lineage, but also a genius dealmaker. Krasnov manages to win the popularity contest of the global financial elite and becomes the greatest President of all time again - topping even his own performance from the first term.

At this point, the current season starts off strong with a surprise party organized by the tech oligarchy bros for their beloved new leader. However, Krasnov has no time to celebrate because the tension immediately rises.

Can the new president write enough executive orders in a short enough time to prevent the ultimate catastrophe: A full-blown zombie apocalypse fueled by the corrupt bureaucrats in the deep state?

These ghouls in the government give out checks for Medicaid like crazy to make the zombies even stronger. As if that wasn't enough, Krasnov has to deal with massive incompetence in the CIA, FBI, and military which are staffed with pussies who don't want to shoot at the zombies. Therefore, he must replace the high-ranking ghouls in government with pure men whose only mission is to make America great again!

Under this extreme pressure, President Krasnov becomes increasingly burned out and realizes he can't continue like this any longer. On a short golf break he comes up with a lifesaving idea: He needs to build a luxury resort overseas - a *Riviera of the Middle East* - where the remaining 1% of healthy and wealthy Americans can escape from the zombie epidemic raging in the homeland!

"There's only one problem," says his old pal Bibi, the local real estate manager from the Middle East: The marketing videos are already out, but the dirty Taliban don't want to leave the beachfront property unless they're paid off with massive amounts of American dollars.

Thanks to his extraordinary deal-making instincts, the president realizes that you can't do business with the camel traders. Instead, he decides to search for a business partner who can raise the money, pay off the Arabs, and invest in the resort to secure America's future.

Krasnov looks through his business contacts. His finger slides down the list, searching for the perfect candidate while his lips mumble the names: ... DeSantis (faggot), Diddy P. (good parties), Eisenhower (is this guy still alive?), ... Elmo, Eminem (how did this guy end up here?), Epstein (even better parties) ... He freezes and asks himself, "Wait, who the fuck is Elmo?"

The president decides to give him a call. It turns out, Elmo is a patriotic genius as well, a real savant of the business world. The autistic prodigy works through the math and finds out that the government sits on a ton of money in the form of Medicaid checks. This money could be

used more efficiently to build the resort and, at the same time, weaken the zombies, he concludes. So the two geniuses come up with the master plan to build the resort together and save the USA. Team America is born!

Because the zombies have already infiltrated the deep state with their ghouls, Team America must operate carefully. Elmo disguises himself as one of the Uber-zombies with a black hat in order to move in stealth-mode through their ranks and find the money. Meanwhile Krasnov uses the newly founded Department of Ghoul Extermination to get rid of the ghouls that Elmo encounters on his deep state dungeon crawl.

Just as our two heroes have almost succeeded in finding the money, the White House is infiltrated by a coup led by the Russian president, Putler! Or so they think at first.

What happened behind their backs was that Vice President Lance invited his dear pen pal, President Putler, to the White House to show him his mineral collection. But, the man with whom JD had exchanged so many letters, is in fact, not the Putler, but a skilled imposter of the Russian President!

It turns out, he is an actor who impersonated President Putler in order to destroy the USA. In reality, the imposter is a man, known by the code name "Ziegheilskeyy". He is working for the Nazis who returned some years ago from the moon and took over Europe and parts of Russia in a covert military operation.

Thank god, Krasnov gets suspicious because Ziegheilskeyy doesn't wear a proper Russian military suit. And so the president does the only right thing and calls out the Nazi spy in front of the public. But, JD Lance is still mad because he feels betrayed by Ziegheilskeyy who doesn't want to apologize.

They get into a heated argument, during which Ziegheilskeyy threatens to start World War 3 if they don't let him go. President Krasnov makes the supreme decision to prevent the ultimate war and the Ziegheilskeyy manages to escape back to Nazi Europe. What a cliffhanger!

My personal verdict on the show so far?

We are watching an epic American saga of addictive entertainment value - infinite jest for the whole family! And this is just the beginning of the season ...
