#### **Discernment:**

We are an intentional Christian community, grounded in the transforming love of God, engaged in Christ-centered practices, and responsive to the work of the Holy Spirit. Community living means sharing the benefits and burdens - it is beautiful and challenging. We recognize that it's *not* for everyone and that people who commit to living in community do so with intention and purpose (usually out of a sense of calling from God), either for a season or for a lifetime.

We approach residency as a mutual discernment process. We ask, is Heirloom the right community for someone in this season? Are they the right resident for this community in this season? The residency application is not a guarantee of acceptance. Open rooms do not mean “first come, first serve” access to applications. Our pastoral staff will engage in an ongoing conversation with potential residents to discern next steps together.

#### **Discernment Process:**

##### **Steps:**

- Interest Form
- Interview with Staff
- Fill Out Application
- Get Background checked
- Meet with residents
- Determine Housing Placement/Waitlist
- Ministry Safe Class Completed
- Lease Made & Move in

Our Discernment Process takes 3-4 weeks. Communal discernment takes time and this process cannot be rushed. When reasonably possible, anyone interested in residency should first make a guest visit to Heirloom.

We will include community residents in the discernment process and encourage you to join a group conversation and community events. At any point during this process, either party may decide not to continue.

Those who commit to the residency will be required to pass a child safety background check as well as child safety education and certification. This safety screening is a basic requirement of all participants (including staff). We believe that the whole community is responsible to care for children and this baseline training is helpful for building awareness and responsiveness. As part of the application process, you are asked to give explicit consent and commitment to this screening/training.

*Please note that on a Separate Form, you will also be asked to sign a liability release form, sexual harassment and boundaries policy, and general respect clause. We need a photocopy of your ID and confirmation of income.*

### **Covenant & Commitment:**

All residents enter into a covenant relationship with Heirloom - making a shared commitment to God and to the community. By committing to this community, you *desire* to embody this covenant and prioritize our life together.

#### *The Heirloom Covenant:*

As Heirloom, we confess God first loves us and we respond to this generous and transforming love by seeking restorative relationships with God, ourselves, others, and creation.

As Heirloom, we work to nurture a community that bears witness to the love of God through hospitality, sustainability, and creativity.

As Heirloom, our life together is rooted in the values and tension of acceptance and transformation, action and rest, community and solitude, resistance and embrace.

As Heirloom, we desire to grow in Christlikeness and commit together to pray, eat, work, and play.

As members of the Heirloom community, we belong to one another and commit to engaging with vulnerability, respect, and love.

#### *Rule of Life (Rhythms of Community) = “pray, eat, work, and play”*

We hope everyone finds ways to embody these practices individually. We have developed a structure of community rhythms which all residents are expected to participate in. While we understand each person will have additional responsibilities, such as jobs/family needs or occasional absences for travel or illness, residency means choosing to prioritize the community rhythms when making schedule/time commitments. The timing and content of these rhythms are subject to change, but currently include:

- Daily prayers (encouraged, currently Monday-Thursday at 8:00am)
- Weekly House Meeting (required, currently Wednesdays at 6:45pm; follows a “play/eat/work/play” structure with a different focus each week)
- Weekly Supper Church (encouraged, currently Sundays at 5:30pm)
  - assigned a week to cook on a rotation, approximately every 3 months
- Community Meals (Currently an optional sign-up for Monday-Thursday, \$3/meal, options for cooking and/or cleaning)
- Daily/Weekly chores (range from 3 or more times per week, depending on the season)
- Monthly farm “work days”
- Supporting the ministries of Heirloom, including animal chores (at least 4 hours/week; annual project priorities and event calendar are discerned by staff and residents according to the season & needs of the community/land).

- Encouraged to take a weekly sabbath day and regular time away/vacations from Heirloom responsibilities for spiritual, emotional, and physical refreshment
- Optional community activities: coffee with staff, movie nights, etc :)

**Financial Commitment:**

Rent and utilities only cover a portion of what it costs to operate Heirloom. We are committed to making Heirloom a financially viable living option in the midst of an unjust housing market. In order to do that, we all share in and accommodate income-generating activities that make the farm financially viable. Any resident is welcome to contribute more than the monthly rate and consider it a tithe/offering to our faith community, especially if they have an income that would allow them to afford higher rent. Rent amounts may increase at the end of the annual lease to help Heirloom move towards financial sustainability.

Full-time residents have access to the Farmhouse, pool, autoshop, wood shop, work spaces, garden, 95 acre hills, the food produced on the land, 7 nights of “guest stays” to give to friends/family, and more!

Residential Spots include:

- 5 Trailer/Tiny Home spots ranging from 800-1250/month which allow one cat or dog, and allow kids
- 5 Farmhouse spots ranging from 650-1250/month which cannot accommodate pets or kids

Plus Utilities per person: all inclusive \$150/month (Internet, electricity, AC/heat, water, trash)

Residents also contribute \$30/month to a “community fund” which covers shared household items (common food and kitchen items, cleaning supplies, etc.) and provides an avenue for generosity (ex: sharing coffee/tea with guests, sending a care package to a neighbor in need, etc.)
