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ABSTRACT

The abstract is a summary of the article. It is consist of aim/goal/problem of research, research methods, results and discussion, and conclusion. Implications or recommendation can be added in the abstract. The abstract must be written in 150 - 250 words. The abstract must not contain lengthy background information and have no reference to figure, table, equation, any bibliographical reference either coming within or other article. The language of abstract must be clear and concise. It is a stand-alone summary in one paragraph.

Keywords: consist of 3 to 5 important words chosen to reflect the concept of the article and to help access to searches on the Internet.

INTRODUCTION

The introduction contains research backgrounds, problem formulations and research objectives, as well as literature reviews, and relevant and current theoretical foundations (maximum 10 years from published). Introduction uses Cambria font, 11 pt, *single* spaces and follow the same for other sections. Spaces for paragraphs 0 pt before and 6 pt after. Paragraphs continue from here and are separated only by headings, subtitles, images, and formulas.

Section titles are arranged by numbers, bold, Grandview font, 12 pt, line spacing should be 1.5 pt. The space for the header must be 12 pt, before and after. The introduction can be included literature studies that become a reference to writing.

Heading and subheadings

If required, subheadings are written using Grandview font, 11 pt, regular, single spaces, spaces before 12 pt and after 12 pt. If there is more subheadings or explanations that should: (1) Use lowercase; (2) No numbering, bullets and or symbols; and (3) The writing format does not jut out but follows the previous paragraph.



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METHODOLOGY

Describes the chronology of the research, including how to prepare research materials, research design and research procedures (in the form of algorithms, pseudocode or others). The terms of writing follows previous explanation. Research methodology contains the research design, the materials and tools used, and the methods used in conducting research. As for konseptual or study articles, this chapter will contain about the method of obtaining data that will be discussed.

RESULTS

If there is an image, then the image laying should be in the center/*center of the* page. Each image should have a number and a brief caption. Write the image number using Cambria font, 10 pt, bold, single space, middle flat. While the image title uses Cambria font, 10 pt, regular, middle flat, single space, line space 4 pt before and 12 pt after. If the image is not from a private source must be accompanied by an image source caption with Cambria font, 10 pt, regular, middle average, single space, line space 0 pt before and 12 pt after. The number and description of the image, written with the same provisions as the previous explanation but there is a difference in the line space, which is the space before 4 pt and 0 pt after. The placement of the title and source of the image is below the image according to the example.




Figure 1. Image caption.




Figure 2. Image caption. Source: Source of the image.

All tables must be equipped with numbers. Each table must have a title. The title should be placed at the top of the table, using Cambria font, 10 pt, left flat, spaced before 12 pt, after 6 pt. Tables should be embedded into text and not provided separately. Format the contents of the table with a Cambria font, 10 pt, the row space must be 1 pt/*single*. Table sources can be written below the table with the terms of Cambria font, 10 pt, single space, left flat, space before 0 pt, after 12 pt. The placement of the title and source of the table corresponds to the example.

The reference list contains only books, articles, theses, research reports and other sources that refer to the writing style of Vancouver. Write a list of references using the help of mendeley or zotero apps. The reference list is written in Cambria font 11 pt, right-left average/*justify*, single space. The number of reference libraries is at least 10 (ten) pieces, with the number of primary references (journals, proceedings, thesis, dissertation) recommended as much as 80% of the total reference library. Format writing as the following example.
