Meeting convened at 1248 hours via Zoom

 - a. [Report](#) of the Chair - [SCCH](#) - see [briefing notes](#)
 - i.) Lee - Posted lengthy report and sent the report via email; main points are that there are many discussions going on at many levels as a response to COVID-19. Thinks we are doing a good job with our response; colleges and deans working to support faculty along with department chairs; Provost and President exceedingly engaged and keeping instruction going at a high level and addressing faculty challenges and concerns moving modalities as well as challenges in society
 - b. Report of the President
 - i.) Morishita - We are physical distancing, but should not be socially distant. Appreciative of faculty work in the midst of a semester to convert

- modalities and respond to students. Will continue with online instruction of the rest of the semester; took time to make decisions with consultation of health professionals and others
- ii.) Morishita - Made the difficult decision to postpone graduation; thinking about video message to debrief to students that the commencement is postponed but not canceled; may do a video commencement in May; Convened presidential meeting as a time to share the big things happening or not happening on campus; grads are not excited about virtual commencement and want a physical commencement ceremony. Spoke with ASI president yesterday and there were concerns of the lack of physical commencement. Cultural celebrations will have their monies reimbursed; graduation fees do not cover all costs for commencement and will not reimburse; will plan to have a commencement ceremony towards the end of this calendar year or may tie into May 2021 celebrations
- iii.) Morishita - Still need people coming to campus; students in housing are receiving reimbursements; some do not want to move out; some were coming and going from campus, some have moved back to their family home; there are a number of students who need to remain on campus. Move out dates set and will be flexible with moving out; checked in with financial aid and other unintended consequences that may affect moving out
- iv.) Morishita - Concerning areas is what happens when we move forward; assume affecting enrollment; unknown if state will reduce budget; odds of getting \$199M for next fiscal year is in jeopardy; work all we can to get through right now and how we go into the next fiscal year; enrollment is a concern across the nation; students are struggling and we are doing all we can to continue to pay them for the positions they were holding on campus; developing an urgent emergency fund with decisions made by Provost and VP Student Affairs to best support our students and what else is needed on campus by faculty and staff to continue their work; providing headphones, laptops, hotspots, and more to faculty and students for continuity of instruction; addressing food insecurity and working with students about moving out and having Chartwells provide food for those who moved out of the dorms; difficult to determine how to distribute food;



- open to ideas as to what would be helpful; fundraising continuing for the emergency funds to support our students as well as our staff and faculty
- v.) Morishita - Budget for next year, cabinet looking at searches that have been posted and in process to decide if they are mission critical; need to justify the continued searches; being prudent; concerns of overcommitting of funds when the budget is unknown
- (1) Glass - For the unfilled positions and justification, does it include incomplete faculty searches?
 - (2) Morishita - Yes, all searches are included right now
 - (3) Glass - If contracts have been done but are unsigned, what will occur?
 - (4) Morishita - All unsigned contracts will require justification
 - (5) Glass - With the notification being made of going entirely online, it would have been helpful with the subject line of going entirely online for the rest of the semester
 - (6) Morishita - Went back and forth with the information shared and the subject line
 - (7) Glass - Decision on post-spring break return of staff and faculty?
 - (8) Morishita - Not sure due to county order ending on April 7th or 8th; guess is that we will not be returning on April 8th; interesting conversations about phasing return of personnel; Stanford president discussed slowly returning to labs in an R1, 1/3 return first considering distancing; will likely not ask for all employees to return at once but will develop a sequence for returning to campus; are going to a position where coverage will be available for people to get paid then we need to figure out what will happen after that; it's not a money issue but agreeances; budget is available for payment, but other aspects enter into decisions; unknown return date for staff and faculty – unlikely in April to bring a lot of people back
 - (9) Glass - Housing: Any contact with Public health and donating rooms, dorms, should people need to be quarantined?
 - (10) Morishita - Governor has approached EB asking if we would house quarantines; at this point in time it is based on our available



space and how many students end up staying on campus; would need to reserve an entire building; student focus first and at-risk people who would be housed first (no COVID-19). Mills College offered housing to health workers coming from another area to work in Oakland; our commitment is assisting with housing of at-risk, but no symptoms or confirmed COVID-19 diagnosis; other instances is moving people out of hospitals who don't have COVID-19 who still need housing to free up beds in a hospital (EB not approached for this currently)

- (11) Glass - Discussion around modifying grade policies
- (12) Morishita - Recently saw Cal went to pass/no pass and they have an option for the student to declare by May 6th; took away restriction on Veteran's getting a non-pass grade for their benefits – changed by VA
- (13) Lee - Will return to grading questions with the Provost
- (14) Baham - Thanked Morishita for work with food and housing insecure students; observing how things are going on in the world with take out orders and unknown if we have infrastructure for deliveries for students who cannot make it to campus or taking mobile orders and having pick-up site on campus; thinking about how he has been able to get his coffee and takeout and still patronize favorite community restaurants
- (15) Morishita - Students in housing go and get takeout from dining services to honor social distancing; should look at delivery possibility and other ways to maintain social distance; EB does not have a lot of vehicles but other aspects can be researched for options
- (16) Lee - This can be an offline discussion; envisioning CSUEB meals on wheels; agree to return to discuss this later
- (17) Morishita - Prez of Harvard and wife are COVID-19; both had chills on Sunday and were tested that came back positive; he has not been on campus or exposed to many people as he would have been otherwise

c. Report of the Provost



- i.) Inch - Very tough lift and recognizing change completed; particularly appreciative of senate leadership and good to brainstorm about what is needed to support our staff, faculty and students, and also that we try to take care of one another; Morishita reminded yesterday of the amount of pressure people are under and everyone is trying to do their best; the whole message may not come through, would appreciate stories of good work on campus – please forward; colleges mobilized to support faculty, support and students; ITS getting more equipment to the community and being accommodating; ITS allowing Library Commons; Work done on Emergency Funds has been impressive with 150 grants available at \$1500/each; students can apply online. Issues available with grading; governed by Title 5 and executive orders; courses can be graded A-F; A-C and NC, and CR/NC; EB can choose which courses are available to be graded in certain ways; need to consider satisfactory academic progress, financial aid, major requirements, and licensure, prerequisites can be affected; unique grading restrictions with certain student populations; athletes needing graded units, international students, academic probation students, and more, may be affected; two sets of things to be considered: campus policies that need to be changed; Title 5 or system orders cannot be changed this year; cannot allow a “D” grade to count as passing this academic year
- ii.) Lee - Grading and finals need clarity and guidance for faculty; many students did not choose an online environment to learn, as well as faculty in the same situation; the combination may lead to the student or faculty not delivering their best work. Need discussions and empowerment as part of being a compassionate and rational university with a broad approach; how to get a rapid action force together to do this
- iii.) Glass - Mixed feelings about this and why students would change, possibly alleviating workload activities; possibilities of local decisions as to if the term can be excluded from graduation GPA, similar with the option to exclude evals for faculty; notice on transcript for applying for jobs/grad school
- iv.) Inch - Notice can be placed on the transcripts; the CO needs to agree to via Statewide Academic Senate as it’s a statewide issue; what is



included/excluded from the campus is a Systemwide choice impacting Title 5

- v.) Newcomb - Transactional question: In other schools taught at, not allowed to give out pass/fail grade until the end; so all work up until the final exams was graded, but the grade provided to the student is pass/fail; not much of an alleviation of workload by the faculty member; the choice was made by students toward the end of the academic term; wondering how that would work here?
 - vi.) Inch- Depends on the policies the senate has on books; choices are present and need to review the rules of how the grades are provided on campus
 - vii.) Carpenter - Two things to add: Incomplete grade policies; Many students are looking in going to grad school and concerns of a pass/no pass versus a grade; no answer
 - viii.) Inch - Incomplete policies remain the same; pass/no pass grades based on Senate decisions and systemwide decisions for change in a relatively short period of time
 - ix.) Glass - Has anyone spoken with associated students and is there a desire for this? Who would want this?
 - x.) Lee - Going to ASI Board meeting virtually tomorrow and will discuss grading
 - xi.) Inch - Hearing more from faculty and worried about students who may not fare well who are normally good students
 - xii.) Lee - Meeting with Provost multiple times this week to address these concerns
 - xiii.) Pollock - Coming from Art Departmental meeting; concerns of students having a dip in participation from lecture-based to online courses; the pass/fail question arose
 - xiv.) Inch - Check grades from pre-midterm and post-midterm to reach out to students individually
