Do not include identifying information such as author names and affiliations in the manuscript. Make sure your figures and tables do not contain any identifying information.

Figures and Tables

Figures and tables must be centered in the column. Prominent figures and tables may span across both columns. It is recommended that Figures and Tables be positioned at the top of the page.

Graphics may be full color. Graphics must not use stipple fill patterns because they may not be adequately reproduced. Please use only solid fill colors that contrast nicely on screen and on a black-and-white hardcopy.

There are no specific requirements for header rows, column width, row height, use of borders, etc. Do not use colors in tables. The text in the table must be 8 pt. Figures and tables may be inserted in text boxes, as shown in these examples. Figure and table captions should follow the guidelines in Table 1. When referencing figures and tables within your paper, use the abbreviation "Figure 1." even at the beginning of a sentence. Do not abbreviate "Table.1"

#### \*Permissions

Authors wishing to include figures, tables, or text passages that have already been published elsewhere are required to obtain permission from the copyright owner(s) for both the print and online format and to include evidence that such permission has been granted when submitting their papers. Any material received without such evidence will be assumed to originate from the authors. All figures should be in high resolution and readable. Authors are encouraged to submit the original format and file of the statistics (not an image) if they are created using other software.

#### **Tables**

Number tables consecutively and use table numbers when referring to a table (Table 1, Table 2, 3...). Use uppercase and lowercase letters for the title of the tables as shown here. The table caption must briefly explain the contents of the table.

Round to two decimal digits of accuracy while reporting correlations, proportions, and inferential statistics such as t, F, and  $\chi$ 2.


