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ABSTRACT

Purpose - Reason/aims of the paper. State the background of the study.

Methodology - State the research design, sampling design, sample size, and research procedure(s), including intervention, instrument, and data analysis.

Findings - State the main results of the study. Numerical data may be included but should be kept to a minimum. State the conclusions and implications.

Contribution - Writing the contribution of this study

A structured abstract (250-300 words) in a single paragraph should be included here. The abstract summarises the significant aspects of a paper.

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INTRODUCTION

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The introduction section explains the context of the study and states the precise objective. An Introduction should contain the following three parts:

Background

Authors have to clarify the context. Authors should give an idea of the state of the art of the field the report is about.

The Problem

If there were no problem, there would be no reason for writing a manuscript, and definitely no reason for reading it. So, please tell readers why they should proceed with reading. Experience shows that a few lines are often sufficient for this part.

The Proposed Solution

Now and only now! - authors may outline the contribution of the manuscript. Here, authors have to ensure readers point out the novel aspects of authors' work. Authors should place the paper in proper context by citing relevant papers. At least five references (recent journal articles) are used in this section.

Word Limits

The manuscript pages are expected to have between 4.000 and 10.000 words, excluding references. The authors should include a word count in their cover letter.

Do not include identifying information such as author names and affiliations in the manuscript. Make sure your figures and tables do not contain any identifying information.

Figures and Tables

Figures and tables must be centered in the column. Prominent figures and tables may span across both columns. It is recommended that Figures and Tables be positioned at the top of the page.

Graphics may be full color. Graphics must not use stipple fill patterns because they may not be adequately reproduced. Please use only solid fill colors that contrast nicely on screen and on a black-and-white hardcopy.

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FINDINGS

Text Citation of References

Within the text of an article, references are to be cited by last name of the author(s) and year of publication. See Table 1:

Organization as an Author

If the Author is an organization or a government agency, mention the organization in the signal phrase the first time you cite the source.

World Health Organization. (2020) ...

If the organization has a well-known abbreviation, you may include the abbreviation in brackets the first time the source is cited and then use only the abbreviation in later citations.

First citation: (World Health Organization [WHO], 2020)

TABLES AND FIGURES

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Tables

Number tables consecutively and use table numbers when referring to a table (Table 1, Table 2, 3...). Use uppercase and lowercase letters for the title of the tables as shown here. The table caption must briefly explain the contents of the table.

Round to two decimal digits of accuracy while reporting correlations, proportions, and inferential statistics such as t , F , and χ^2 .

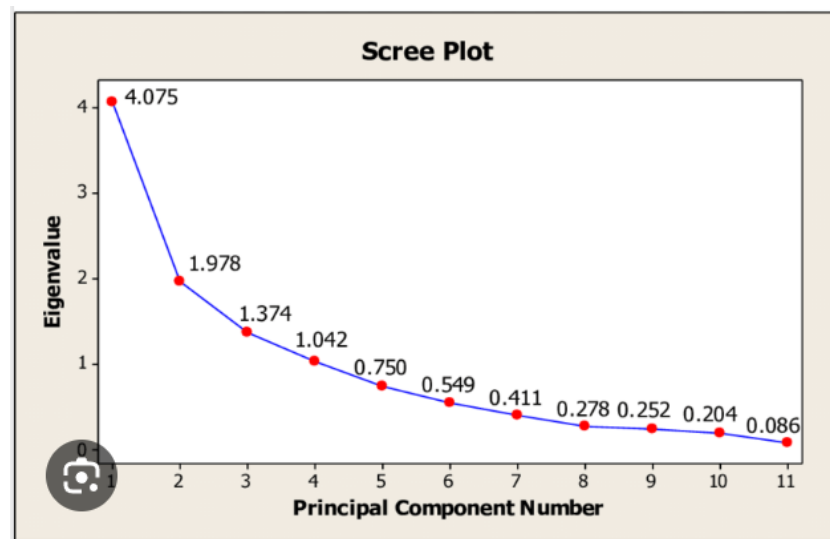


Figure 1. Summary of the User's Perception of the Enforcement and Effectiveness of the Institution's Information Security Policy
