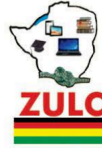

1. Background

Open Science is increasingly shaping how research is conducted, shared, and assessed globally. Across Africa, countries are actively reforming research systems to improve openness, transparency, accessibility, and impact.

In Zimbabwe, there is growing interest in strengthening Open Science practices across research governance, scholarly communication, data management, and policy development. However, these efforts remain fragmented and require stronger coordination among key national stakeholders.

The Zimbabwe Open Science Stakeholder Convening will therefore serve as a targeted side event at the 6th ZULC Biennial Conference to bring together key actors to align national priorities and strengthen coordination for Open Science implementation.

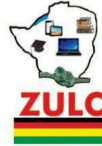
2. Objective

The main objective of the convening is:

To bring together key national stakeholders to assess the current Open Science landscape in Zimbabwe and identify priority areas for coordinated national implementation.

3. Specific Objectives

The convening will:



- Review the current state of Open Science in Zimbabwe across key thematic areas
- Discuss findings from the national Open Science needs assessment
- Identify national priorities for Open Science implementation
- Explore policy pathways for integrating Open Science into existing frameworks
- Strengthen coordination among key stakeholders involved in research governance and scholarly communication

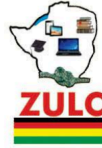
4. Thematic Areas

Discussions will focus on:

- Research assessment reform
- Open access publishing
- Research data management and data sharing
- Institutional and national Open Science policy development

5. Expected Outcomes

- Clear mapping of Zimbabwe's current Open Science landscape
- Identified national priorities for Open Science implementation
- Agreed policy entry points for integrating Open Science principles
- Strengthened multi-stakeholder collaboration framework
- Inputs to support future national Open Science strategy development

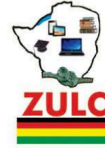

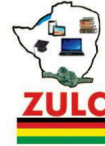
