DUAL / CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT

Guidelines for Dual Enrollment Math and English Placement

Math Placement: For entering students, math placement is based on the most advanced high school math class passed (*B- or higher*), and a score calculated from a student's Math SAT and/or overall high school GPA (*if no SAT score is available*). A copy of high school transcripts with SAT scores (if available) should be submitted with DE Registration Form.

The below table represents possible math courses at Mid based on HS GPA (3.0 or higher) and grade (B- or higher) in most advanced HS math. SAT Math scores can be used in place of HS math completion for dual enrollees. *

DUAL ENROLLMENT CONTRACT for the 2023-24 School Year

As a dually enrolled student, I understand and agree to my strict academic and social responsibilities which include, but are not limited to, the following:

- I must attend class at the designated postsecondary institution and provide my own transportation.
- I am expected to complete all coursework and understand the workload can be much more demanding.
- I must read each course syllabus and adhere to attendance and assignment expectations and deadlines according to the individual instructor and in conjunction with my home high school.
- I will not place myself in any endangering situation. As a high school student, I understand that I will be attending courses with students who are older than I am. My parent(s)/guardian(s) and I have discussed their expectations for my social behavior in a postsecondary setting.
- If I enroll in 1st semester dual enrollment class(es) and choose not to dual enroll in a 2nd semester course, I will be required to enroll in an APEX course for the remainder of 2nd trimester.
- I must attend class even when my high school does not (i.e. spring break, snow days).
- I am expected to communicate *immediately* with the school counselors if I have any concerns about my success in my dual enrollment class.
- Dual enrollment courses MUST be scheduled in correlation with my high school classes.
- I must get a C- or better to dual enroll in future courses and to receive the BRHS cost coverage benefit.
- I may not take more than 10 college classes during my high school career.
- My credit allocation (high school v. college credit) decision is final once the course has begun.
- Failure to successfully complete the course with a C- or better, or dropping the course after the drop deadline, will result in the student/family being responsible for repaying the cost of tuition to school.

By signing below both students and parents agree that they:

1. Have read the above information and asked the counseling office to clarify any remaining questions.
2. Agree to the requirement to have a full schedule throughout the school year and the requirement to add an APEX class when the dual enrollment course ends (if not enrolled in more DE classes).
3. Have discussed the responsibility needed to enroll in a dual enrollment course and the student commits to the actions needed to be successful.
4. Agree to the payment terms required for BRHS to provide partial coverage for the cost.
