

Hey there, True Believers. You might remember a couple of months ago, I released the X-Men Film Timeline.

(http://www.reddit.com/r/movies/comments/26vlql/xmen_visual_timeline_oc/)

For my cake day, I decided to build a timeline to document Peter Parker's 14 years as Spider-Man. Then it just grew into a whole other beast. I've spent the last few months reading literally hundreds and hundreds of comics so that I could make this as accurate as possible. Unfortunately, this is going to be a wall of plain text before I get the opportunity to do something on imgur. I kept on finding more and more events to include in the timeline, and it just sort of spiraled out of control! I will lay out some of my headcanon before hand, and hopefully you all enjoy!

Peter Parker/Spider-Man's birthday will be considered August 10th, 1985 (for the purposes of the timeline). His debut, *Amazing Fantasy* #15, was released on August 10th, 1962. This will give us a frame of reference for Peter's age, and from the details we have been given, it's very likely Peter has a summer birthday. *Amazing Spider-Man* (Vol 1 – 3) will be the main reference for details as the longest running Spider-Man title.

Midtown High is a fictional high school, but it's definitely located in Forest Hills, Queens, New York. With this in mind, the school calendars for Bayside High and Forest Hills High let school out at the end of June and start back up in September. I will also take this time to explain that it is a fact that Empire State University is based off of New York University. Keeping that in mind, the Spring Semester usually ends in May, graduations in May, and Fall Semester beginning in September. This acted as a guideline for where certain issues took place.

Now, to get us started off, *Amazing Spider-Man* Vol 3 #1 (published June 2014, and taking place during Late April 2014) establishes that Peter has been Spidey for 13 years. While this fits well with Marvel Time (where every 4 years in the real world equals 1 year in comics, so $13 \times 4 = 52$. $1952 + 52 + 2014$), it causes problems with Spidey's earlier years because of milestones such as graduations. So, the way we fix it is that we use Marvel Time for the later years the best we can, while also staying true to the fixed points in Spider-Man's life.

Here we go. - Anthony L.

15000 BC – Selene is born.

3000 BC – Apocalypse is born.

1830s – Birth of Nathaniel Essex who will go on to become Mr. Sinister.

1859 – Nathaniel Essex became a biologist in Victorian [England](#), who developed advanced theories on human evolution and was obsessed with [Charles Darwin's](#) theory of evolution, though he felt Darwin and his contemporaries were shackled by too many moral constraints and that science was beyond morality

1882 – Birth of James Howlett (Logan/Wolverine) in [Alberta, Canada](#). (X-Men: Prelude to Schism #4)

1891 – 9 year old James Howlett hides with his puppy from his grandfather, Mr. Howlett. (X-Men: Prelude to Schism #4) Implied to be right before Origin #2 takes place (Dog kills James's puppy). James Howlett's father is killed by Thomas Logan, and James Howlett kills Thomas Logan with his first use of his claws.

1900 – Events of Origin #5?

1907 – Logan, the Wolfish Man, lives far away from civilization with his wolf pack. Logan kills Essex's polar bear after it slaughters Logan's pack. Essex (later on Mr. Sinister) finds Logan and tries to attack him with his Marauders. Saul Creed and Clara Creed track and turn Logan over to Hugo for his circus. Essex takes Logan from Hugo and experiments on him. Clara and Saul free Logan, Logan and Clara make love, and Clara is kidnapped by Essex. Logan and Saul retrieve Clara. Logan kills Saul in a fit a rage and Clara leaves him because of it. Saul and Clara are revealed to be the younger siblings of Victor Creed. (Origin II #1-#5, February 2014 – July 2014)

1914 – Logan joins the Canadian Army. He is assigned to the Devil's Brigade.

[Ypres, Belgium, on April 22, 1915](#) - Logan encountered a being, called [Lazaer](#) (an anagram of Azrael, the Angel of Death), who was armed with a large broadsword and had been using it to kill soldiers on the same battlefield. They began to fight one another, with Lazaer initially gaining the upper hand, but, after being impaled with Lazaer's sword, Logan pulled it from his chest and stabbed it through his surprised opponent. Besting Lazaer in combat sent Logan in to a deep depression, even causing him to put a gun to his own head at one point. Logan started drinking considerably more as the war dragged on and ate less and less, until Lazaer finally confronted him. Lazaer explained that the depression was a punishment for defeating him and defying the natural order of things. It was also later revealed that

because Logan defeated Lazaer, whenever Logan was wounded severely enough to tax even his healing factor, he recovered by defeating Lazaer in an astral arena.

1915-1916 – Captain Leonard McKenzie is sent out by Winston Churchill to recover lost vibranium in the Antarctic. His expedition brings him close to Atlantis, where he meets Princess Fen. He is attacked and forced away from Atlantis during their marriage ceremony. Princess Fen gives birth to Namor months later.

July 4th, 1920 – Birth of Steve Rogers, who will go on to become Captain America.

Early 1920s – Birth of Nick Fury.

1921 - Logan found himself in the [Mexican](#) Sonoran Desert beaten, locked up by the local police, and accused of horse thievery. As Logan was blindfolded and tied to a post to be shot, by a firing squad, a voice next to him asked if he was a murderer. Logan answered, "...worse, a horse thief.", and the person next to him turned out to be [Mystique](#), who was also about to be killed for being blue.

1925 – James Buchanan "Bucky" Barnes is born.

Late 1920s (1928?) – Birth of Max Eisenhardt, who will go on to become Magneto.

1932 - Logan was in Madripoor again, and Seraph taught him how to be a better assassin. Around this time, Logan started to use his recurrent alias "Patch", if not before.

November 1933 – Logan smuggles alcohol with his friend, Elias during the period of time at the end of Prohibition from Canada to Grand Rapids, Minnesota. (Savage Wolverine #14)

November 13th, 1933 – Logan drops off the kids he's taking care of with their Aunt Adele and Uncle Burt at Valleyheart Ranch in Sterling, Colorado. Burt gifts Logan with a motorcycle as a token of his appreciation. (Savage Wolverine #17)

November 14th, 1933 – Eiffel and Marion arrive at Sterling Colorado and kill Burt. Wolverine saves his wife and the surviving kids (with their help) and Eiffel and Marion are both killed. (Savage Wolverine #17)

Some time later, Logan remembered Ogun's offer and he went to Japan to better learn self-discipline.

1936 – Oil spill attracts the attention of Namor. who meets and begins a relationship with Sandy Pierce. (Namor #1, June 2003)

1938, Logan, under Romulus' orders, spent two years learning espionage from Taras Romanov, and in turn Logan gave hand-to-hand combat lessons to [Natasha Romanoff](#), Taras' ward/daughter. Taras then told Natasha to kill Logan, but Logan instead killed him and allowed Natasha to depart. (Wolverine Origins #9)

December 1937 – Bucky Barnes's father dies.

"Marvel Golden Age, 1939 (Marvel Comics #1, November 1939) – 1945 (Captain America Reborn #1 - #6, July 2009 – January 2010)"

*The Marvel Golden Age happened in the 616 Universe, although numerous details have been tweaked since their original explanations. This is explained as Golden Age Marvel Comics existing in the 616 Universe, but having their stories based in real life events. For example, Captain America Comics #1 state that Bucky became Captain America's sidekick by walking on him changing from his identity as Steve Rogers. It is later revealed that Bucky had been trained by the SAS and Army for months before taking position as Steve's partner, and the common story was from the fictional comic book existing in the 616 Universe.

1939 – The Human Torch is born in the laboratory of Professor [Phineas T. Horton](#), one of the pioneers in the field of artificial intelligence and robotics. The culmination of Horton's research was an android who mimicked virtually all of the functions of a human being, including independent thought, but was composed entirely of synthetic materials. Horton worked closely with fellow scientist [James Bradley](#) who grew disgusted by Horton's hope for fame and fortune and dissolved their partnership.

September 1st, 1939 - [World War II](#) began, Logan returned to the Devil's Brigade, again under Burr's command, although his memories of Burr's crimes were mostly purged. Seraph was like Logan's handler in Madripoor, and she prepared him for more covert missions for Romulus.

November 1939 - Horton revealed the Torch's existence to the public at a press conference. The dawning of Marvel is heralded by the lighting of the original (android) Human Torch. In the original story, it's just shown to a small group, but in retellings like in "Marvels", it's a press event. The general reaction, however, is the same: the Torch must be destroyed. (Marvel Comics #1, October 1939)

Late 1939 – Third Reich extends their power in Europe and annexed Poland. Max Eisenhardt awakens his powers over magnetism for the first time as his parents and sister are killed. He is buried in a shallow grave with them. After digging his way out, he is taken to Auschwitz. (New Mutants #49)

1940 - The Human Torch began earning a reputation for himself as a champion of justice. In his third recorded adventure, still confused Human Torch fled New York by train and prevented the crooked [Mr. Ritton](#) from exploiting [Martians](#) into helping him conquer the world in exchange for TNT to help them fight off invaders to their world.

June 1940 – Max Eisenhardt becomes one of the earliest prisoners in Auschwitz. He is forced into the Sonderkommando, and forced to help with the processing of bodies of fellow Jews.

Summer 1940 – “The Human Torch and The Sub-Mariner Meet” The Human Torch and Namor the Submariner battle it out. (Marvel Mystery Comics #8 - #9, June 1940 – July 1940)

Fall 1940 - Seeking an escape from his ever day life, Steve enjoyed going to the movies. One day in the fall of 1940, he was horrified by newsreels about the [Nazi's](#) invasion of Europe and became determined to join the army in order to do his part to protect America from the potential Nazi threat. He would continuously be rejected for his frailty under class 4F.

Winter 1940 – Operation Rebirth (part of the larger Weapon Plus) takes place with its first successful test subject: Steve Rogers is transformed into Captain America. (Captain America Comics #1, March 1941)

Winter, Early 1941 – 16 year old Bucky is shipped off to England for combat training after getting drunk and knocking out two sailors and injuring an MP on his birthday night. He is trained to be the ideal combat soldier by the US Military and British SAS. (Captain America Vol 5 #50)

Early Spring 1941 – 16 year old Bucky is assigned to be the partner of Captain America.

Early 1941 – Fury enlists, where he received nine weeks of basic training at Fort Dix without Red Hargrove, hoping to ride out the wave of unemployment in the States. Eventually Fury reunited with Hargrove, both getting stationed at Pearl Harbor.

Summer of 1941, Seraph and Logan worked with the US super-soldier [Captain America](#) and others in order to sabotage an alliance between the Hand and [Baron Strucker](#), luring the Hand's Jonin, their leader, out of hiding. Natasha Romanoff, now a Romulus operative, wanted to kill the Jonin, but Logan, regretting how he trained her to be an assassin, killed the Jonin himself. Later that same year, Logan, under orders to recruit or kill the Cap, worked with him and [Bucky](#) in [Tunisia](#), where Logan met [Sgt. Nick Fury](#). Finally, Logan decided not to kill Captain America, creating a rift between Seraph and himself.

September 22nd, 1941 – The Invaders (Captain America, Bucky Barnes, The (First) Human Torch, Toro, and Namor the Submariner) come together to defeat Master Man. Winston Churchill encourages them to remain active.

December 7th, 1941 – Attack on Pearl Harbor.

Fall of 1942 - The Howling Commandos' earliest assignment occurred in the autumn of 1942. They were to recover British rocket scientist Dr. MacMillan from a German military base in occupied Norway. Their success brought the attention of British Prime Minister Winston Churchill, who incorporated the unit into the British Army, and given the title of "Commandos".

October 3rd, 1943 – Woodrow McCord becomes The Man on the Wall.

December of 1943 - The Invaders were sent to Monte Cassino in Italy in order to retrieve a highly coveted weapon known as *the Ordnung Zeitgeist* before Hitler's forces could lay claim to it.

1944 – Captain America and Bucky worked together to take down a Nazi coastal gun control unit so that Allied Forces could launch another beach assault in the war effort.

In 1944, Logan participated as a paratrooper for the 1st Canadian Parachute Battalion, during the Normandy landings on D-Day, as well as the liberation of the [Netherlands](#). Logan may have also been a spy for the Allied Forces and he spent time in the Sobibor Death Camp in [Poland](#), where he psychologically tortured three [Nazi](#) commandants by simply never speaking and returning every time they ordered him executed. While at Sobibor, Logan was known as "Prisoner Zero". A year later he surfaced in Newell, [California](#), overseeing inhumane experimentation on Japanese prisoners of war. Even though Logan had been a hardened killer, he was atypically cruel during this period, his personality probably altered by Romulus.

Sometime between January 21st, 1945 – January 25th, 1945 – Max Eisenhardt and his soon-to-be-wife Magda escape Auschwitz mere days before The Liberation of Auschwitz took place. (Classic X-Men #12)

Early to mid April 1945 – Bucky and Captain America attempted to stop a drone plane operated by Baron Zemo. The plane exploded over the English Channel, claiming Bucky's left arm, and freezing the two in suspended animation in the frigid wars. The Russians will find Bucky's body, and make him their soldier. (Captain America Reborn #1 - #6, July 2009 – January 2010)

April 30th, 1945 – Jim Hammond, the original Human Torch, kills Hitler. (Young Men Volume 2 #24, December 1953) (Saga of the Original Human Torch #3, June 1990)

August 9th, 1945 - Logan was captured by Japanese soldiers in Japan, where he was sent to a prison camp in [Nagasaki](#). Logan escaped from his cell along with [Lt. Ethan Warren](#), an American soldier who was also captured, and found refuge and love in a local Japanese girl, named [Atsuko](#). Unfortunately, Lt. Warren, himself a mutant, returned and murdered the girl and the two men fought, until both were caught in the [atomic bombing of Hiroshima](#) that destroyed much of the city. Logan survived, but was devastated to lose another woman in his life.

1945 - After the war ended, Logan sought redemption in Jasmine Falls, Japan, and he studied with Bando Suboro, in order to learn how to be a man and leave his warrior nature behind. Finally at peace since Silver Fox's supposed death, Logan met and fell in love with a local woman, named [Itsu Akihiro](#) and they married and conceived a [child](#) together, unknown to Logan.

1946 – The Russians brain wash Bucky, outfit him with a bionic arm, and manipulate him into becoming The Winter Soldier.

1946 – Nick Fury begins receiving the Infinity Formula from Dr. Sternberg to heal wounds received from wartime, and it drastically slows down his aging process.

1946 – In 1946, while Logan was proving himself worthy of being a father in combat, the demon sword-smith, [Muramasa](#), created an explosion, that caused Logan to accidentally stab a villager with his claws. Logan was banned from the village, but wanted to say good-bye to Itsu. Returning to their self-built home, Logan found Itsu murdered, by Bucky Barnes, now the brainwashed Winter Soldier. Although Barnes ostensibly served the [USSR](#), he was acting under Romulus' orders. Birth of Akahiro/Daken.

1944-1950 – Birth of Charles Xavier.

1954 – Nick Fury was officially recruited by Colonel Tom Lynaugh into the CIA.

1958 – The Tribellian Invasion of Kansas takes place. Woodrow McCord dies saving the Earth. (Original Sin Annual)

1961 - Logan, known as Wolverine now, joined the [Weapon X Project](#), part of the [Weapon Plus Program](#), which had been created to fight the mutant menace. Nevertheless, Weapon X only used mutants as superhuman operatives on international tasks. He was then placed on the Black Ops squad run by the CIA, called [Team X](#), with Sabretooth and Silver Fox (it's unknown if they remembered their past history at this point), [Maverick](#), [Kestrel](#) and [Mastodon](#). During this time, Logan and the others received memory implants via staged scenarios, telepathic manipulation by [Aldo Ferro](#), and other technology. Weapon X also duplicated Wolverine's healing factor and implanted it in Team X, slowing their aging processes.

1963 - Silver Fox betrayed Wolverine and Sabretooth to enemy soldiers, and she fled Weapon X.

1966 – Death of the original Dum Dum Dugan. (Original Sins #5, October 2014)

1968 – Howard Stark introduces the helicarrier to Nick Fury. Nick Fury is shown to have at least two LMDs he's already using to take care of SHIELD business in lieu of himself.

1968 - Wolverine was shot with [Carbonadium](#) bullets, which slowed his healing factor so that Weapon X or Romulus could know how to kill him.

1968 (?) – Birth of Victor Von Doom and Ben Grimm.

August (?), 1968 – Birth of Reed Richards

December 1st, 1969 – Vietnam War military draft is held. Charles Xavier who will go on to become Professor X is drafted, ending his first relationship with Moira Kinross.

1970 – Charles Xavier's 12 month tour in Vietnam, Cain Marko becomes The Juggernaut, but is buried under the rubble of the temple that he gets the Gem of Cyttorak from. He will eventually free himself after about 30 years.

1972, Wolverine joined [Department K](#), a secret Canadian Defense Ministry branch with ties to Weapon X. Based in Ottawa, he partnered with [Neil Langram](#) and worked with Nick Fury, now a high-ranking CIA agent, and with [Richard](#) and [Mary Parker](#). Years later, Langram was sought as an operative by the [Hellfire Club](#), but he refused, and he was then slain by Sabretooth, hired as a mercenary. Wolverine and [Carol Danvers](#), a young US spy, investigated and confronted Sabretooth at the Club's Canadian facility. Sabretooth told Wolverine details of the Club's intent to guide a war between mutants and humans. Sabretooth then bombed the facility, but he, Wolverine and Danvers survived. A troubled Wolverine turned to drugs and alcohol, and he was dismissed from Department K after accidentally shooting a fellow agent. Disgusted with himself, he planned to lose himself in the [Yukon](#). But before leaving Canada, while in his Lotus Seven, Logan was pumped full of Thorazine, beaten, and kidnapped, by a group of armed men from the Weapon X Project, possibly under Romulus' orders. The man known only as the [Professor](#), [Dr. Abraham Cornelius](#), and [Dr. Carol Hines](#) began to examine Logan, while he floated in a containment tank. Logan's skeleton, including his claws, was bonded with the indestructible metal known as [Adamantium](#), making it unbreakable, and his personality was buried beneath the most intense brainwashing he had ever undergone. While in the tank, Logan was put under deep hypnosis, telling him that he was not a man or individual, and being a man disgusted him. The Project wanted Logan to believe that he was an obedient animal and that individuality lead to suffering and death. Reduced to a near-mindless state, Logan was forced by Weapon X to slaughter every inhabitant of

the small town [Roanoke](#) as a test. Logan proved too difficult for the Weapon X Program to control and, after many years, he broke free of the programming, fell into a berserker fury and escaped the facility, with the help of the Winter Soldier, killing nearly everyone except for the Professor, Dr. Cornelius, Dr. Hines, and [Malcolm Colcord](#), who later became the Director of a new Weapon X Program. Wolverine's healing factor was probably exhausted by his ordeal, since over the next few years he healed more slowly than ever before.

1973 (?) – Birth of Susan Storm. (Originally 17/18 year old College Freshman Reed Richards met 12 year old Susan Storm for the first time. The Official Marvel Handbook says Dr. Reed Richards, who earned his doctorate at 22, met Susan for the first time when she was 17.)

1978 – Birth and adoption of Anthony “Tony” Stark.

October 1978? – Birth of Bruce Banner. (New Avengers Vol 3 #23, October 2014 for birth month, colleague of Tony Stark for year)

Late 1970s – Early 1980s – Death of Max and Magda Eisenhardt’s daughter Anya in a fire. Max Eisenhardt reawakens his powers for the first time and kills the mob that prevented him from rescuing her. He then kills many soldiers who assault him while he is attempting to bury her body by forcing them to turn their guns on themselves. Magda flees after seeing Max’s powers and gives birth to his twins months later, who will grow to be Pietro and Wanda Maximoff. (Classic X-Men #12)

1980/1981 – Birth of Peter Quill. (Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 2 #18, November 2009)

Note: Interestingly, Peter Quill of the Marvel Cinematic Universe was also born in 1980.

Early 1985 – Birth of Johnny Storm.

1985 – Birth of Scott Summers, Warren Worthington III, Hank McCoy, and Jean Grey. Birth of Rick Jones also takes place in this year.

August 10th, 1985 – Birth of Peter Parker.

January 1986 - In the form of a German noblewoman, the shapeshifting Mystique married Count Christian Wagner, but still made time for a series of affairs with other men in the castle and nearby town. One such lover actually touched her cold heart, the mysterious Azazel from La Isla des Demonas. After making love to the Countess Raven in a church hall, however, Azazel spurned Raven's proclamations of true love, and merely told her to raise their child, whom she was now pregnant with, as if it were the count's. A heartbroken Raven had no choice but to agree and,

Early-to-Mid March, 1986 – Birth of Bobby Drake.

Between April – October 1986 – Birth of Alex Summers some time this year. (Has to be younger than Iceman because Cyclops and Iceman were both 16 for a period of time.)

Late October 1986 - While Christian did become suspicious as to the baby's paternity, his sudden "accidental" death ensured no one else heard his suspicions. A few months later, she gave birth to a child, but the baby was born visibly mutated with blue fur all over, iridescent eyes and a prehensile tail. Due to the shock and the strain of the boy's difficult delivery, Mystique lost concentration and accidentally revealed her true form. Word spread of her and the baby's condition, and mother and son were chased by a torch-wielding mob. Trapped, Mystique morphed into one of the villagers and threw her own infant son over a waterfall to expedite her escape. (Birth of Kurt Wagner)

1987 – Charles Xavier and Max Eisenhardt meet for the first time, and see each other as kindred spirits. They reveal their mutant powers to each other as they work together to rescue Gabrielle Haller from Hydra. (20 years before Uncanny X-Men #161)

1988? – Gabrielle Haller becomes pregnant with Charles Xavier's son, unknown to Xavier. They split amicably.

1989? – Birth of David Haller, who will go on to become Legion.

October 12th, 1991 – Birth of Sam Guthrie, who will go on to be known as Cannonball.

Sometime between January 1992 and August 1992 – 6 year old Peter Parker is left orphaned when the airplane that CIA Agents Richard and Mary Parker are on explodes mid-flight. He will spend the next 9 years being raised by Richard's brother and sister-in-law, Ben and May Parker.

1993 – 8 year old Scott Summers and 7 year old Alex Summers are forced to parachute from an exploding plane; their parents are abducted by the Shi'ar.

1997 – Birth of Quentin Quire.

Marvel Silver Age, Mid February 2001 (Fantastic Four #1, November 1961) – May 2005 (Amazing Spider-Man #95, April 1971)

Mid February 2001 – The Fantastic Four are born. (Fantastic Four #1, November 1961) (Wolverine Vol. 6 #12 for Age of Superheroes)

(Letters Column: Stan Lee replied that Reed and Ben were in their late 30s, Sue was in her 20s, and Johnny had just turned 16. – John Byrne)

Late February 2001 – 22 year old Hank Pym debuts and shrinks for the first time. (Tales to Astonish #27, January 1962)

Late March 2001 – Bruce Banner saves 16 year old Rick Jones from being caught in a nuclear blast. The Incredible Hulk is born. (Incredible Hulk #1, May 1962)

Mid April 2001 – Jason Macendale Jr. is inducted into the CIA.

Late April 2001 – Dr. Donald Blake becomes Thor for the first time. (Journey Into Mystery #83, August 1962)

Late April 2001 – Mid April 2002 Year 1 (August 1962 – May 1964) End of Sophomore Year / Most of Junior Year in High School (Amazing Fantasy #15/Amazing Spider-Man #1 – Amazing Spider-Man #12)

- **Late April 2001 - 15 Year Old Peter Parker becomes Spider-Man. (Amazing Fantasy #15, August 1962)** – First appearance of Peter Parker/Spider-Man, Aunt May, Uncle Ben, Flash Thompson, Liz Allan, Raymond Warren, The Burglar, Crusher Hogan, and Max Shiffman. (Amazing Spider-Man Vol. 3 #1, June 2014, for date) (Miguel O'Hara also quotes that Spider-Man got his powers near the turn of the century)

- Amazing Spider-Man (Vol 3) 1.1 takes place. (Immediately after Amazing Fantasy #15)

- Late April 2001 - Hank Pym decides to become Ant-Man. (Tales to Astonish #35, September 1962) (Age of Ultron #10A.I. for age)

- Late April 2001/Early May 2001 – First appearance of Loki Laufeyson. (Journey into Mystery #85, October 1962)

- **Early May 2001 – Spider-Man meets the Fantastic Four and defeats The Chameleon. First appearance of The Chameleon, J. Jonah Jameson, and John Jameson. (Amazing Spider-Man #1, March 1963)**

- Amazing Spider-Man (Vol 3) 1.2 takes place. (portions taking place as part of ASM #1)

- Early May 2001 – Tony Stark, weapons manufacturer, is injured and taken hostage in a foreign country. Together with Professor Yinsen, he builds a device to keep shrapnel from penetrating his heart, and a set of armor out of scrap metal. Tony Stark successfully escapes back to America, where he will become the superhero known as Iron Man.

- Mid-May 2001 - Amazing Spider-Man (Vol. 3) 1.3 takes place. (Portions taking place as part of ASM #2)

- Mid-May 2001 - Story #2 of Amazing Spider-Man #2 takes place, where Spider-Man defeats The Tinkerer. (Amazing Spider-Man #2, May 1963)

- Amazing Spider-Man (Vol. 3) 1.4 and 1.5 takes place.

- Mid-May 2001 - First appearance of Janet van Dyne/The Wasp. (Tales to Astonish #44, June 1963)

- Late May 2001 – First appearance and defeat of Doctor Octopus. (Amazing Spider-Man #3, July 1963)

- Late May 2001 – First appearance of Dr. Strange. (Strange Tales #110, July 1963)

- Late June 2001 - The Avengers are formed for the first time in Avengers #1 (September 1963)

- **“The Search for the Green Goblin Formula” storyline. (Amazing Spider-Man #244-245, Sep-Oct, 1983)**

- **“Doom” – First appearance of Beta Ray Bill. (Thor #337, November 1983)**

- **August 10th, 2008 – Peter Parker celebrates his 23rd birthday.**

- **“The Kid Who Collects Spider-Man” - Peter meets his biggest fan Timmy Harrison, after reading about him in The Bugle. He reveals his secret identity to him, and as he leaves, the reader realizes that Timmy is dying from leukemia. (Amazing Spider-Man #248, January 1984)**

- **“Secret Wars” - Peter Parker fights in the Secret Wars obtains the symbiote costume. Commonly used milestone to end the “Bronze Age” of Marvel Comics. (Marvel Super Heroes Secret Wars #1 - #12, May 1984 - April 1985)**

Marvel Modern Age, Summer 2008 (Amazing Spider-Man #252)
- *Now (Avengers and X-Men: AXIS)*

- Peter Parker brings the symbiote costume home when he returns to Earth. (Amazing Spider-Man #252, May 1984)

- Peter Parker tells Aunt May that he quit his studies at ESU. (Amazing Spider-Man #253, June 1984)

- Spidey and Black Cat take down the Blob, Aunt May ignores Peter’s calls. (PPSSM #91, June 1984)

- “Madness” - Rogue confirms that she is 18 years old. (Uncanny X-Men #182, June 1984)

- **Spider-Man/Human Torch #4 takes place.**

- Reed Richards celebrates his 40th birthday. (Fantastic Four #271, October 1984)

- Mary Jane tells Peter she has known for years that he was Spidey. (Amazing Spider-Man #257, October 1984)

- Amazing Spider-Man #258 is when Peter realizes something is wrong with the black suit and Mr. Fantastic quarantines it. Peter Parker has to temporarily go out as The Amazing Bag Man. The Red and Blues make their return. (Nov. 1984).

- Web of Spider-Man #1 – Peter is able to use church bells to get the symbiote costume off when it returns and tries to take control.

- First appearance of Legion, who is in his late teens. (New Mutants, #25 March 1985)

- Amazing Spider-Man #263, Peter wears the non-symbiote Black Suit that Black Cat gives to him for the first time. He will wear the Black Suit and Red and Blues interchangeably (April. 1985)

- Amazing Spider-Man #265 – Peter and Aunt May finally reconcile about Peter's decision not to go back to school. First appearance of Silver Sable. (June. 1985)

- "Secret Wars II" Marvel Crossover Event takes place. (Secret Wars II #1 - #9, July 1985 – March 1986)

-- "Hero" story takes place during Secret Wars II. One of Johnny Storm's fans is severely injured, and eventually dies, from trying to imitate The Human Torch. Johnny Storm feels guilty and decides to quit superheroics. The Beyonder convinces him that there was nothing that could be done, and he was not at all at fault. (Fantastic Four #285, December 1985)

- Death of Jean DeWolff (PPSSM, #107-#110 October 1985 – January 1986)

- "Born Again" Daredevil storyline takes place. Daredevil's betrayal and utter destruction at the hands of the Kingpin. (Daredevil #227 - #231, February 1986 - June 1986)

- First appearance of Elizabeth Braddock as Psylocke. (New Mutants Annual #2, October 1986)

- Spider-Man and Black Cat team up against Sabretooth. (Peter Parker, Spectacular Spider-Man #116, July 1986)

- Flash incarcerated and framed as Hobgoblin, and Spidey attempting to prove his innocence. (Amazing Spider-Man #278, July 1986)

- "Tapped Out/Apocalypse Now!" - First appearance of Apocalypse. (X-Factor #5 - #6, June – July 1986)

- Peter Parker goes to Appalachia on his first assignment for NOW magazine, and ends up fighting Magma. (Web of Spider-Man #16, August 1986)

- Peter Parker defeats Magma in the Appalachia Mountains of Virginia, but escapes leaving the tattered remains of his costume behind. Temporary "final" appearance of the red and blues. (Web of Spider-Man #17, August 1986)

- Peter Parker is missing in the "Where is Spider-Man" storyline. Turns out he was in the Virginia mountains fighting Magma and got buried under rubble before making his way back to New York. (Amazing Spider-Man #279, August 1986, Web of Spider-Man #17-18)

- Peter begins wearing the Black Suit exclusively. First appearance of The Sinister Syndicate, and first appearance of Boomerang in Spider-Man comics. (Amazing Spider-Man #280, September 1986)

- First appearance of Eddie Brock. (Web of Spider-Man #18, September 1986)

- "Mutant Massacre" X-Men event. (Uncanny X-Men Vol #210 - #213, October 1986 – January 1987)

- Spider-Man Vs Wolverine #1 – Death of Ned Leeds. Spider-Man accidentally kills a murderer named Charlie when he punches with his full strength in a daze. It is worth noting that in What If... Spider-Man Vs Wolverine (Earth-8351), an alternate reality branches from this issue where Peter Parker learned to take his powers seriously and honed his spider sense to levels where he just "knew things." This "Assassin Spider-Man" worked with Wolverine and will be making an appearance in Spider-Verse. (February 1987)

- "Under Siege" – The Avengers face off against The Masters of Evil. Never before had the Avengers faced as excruciating a defeat – but never before had they risen up from such depths to claim victory. (Avengers #270 – 277, August 1986 - March 1987)

- First appearance of Jason Macendale Jr. as Hobgoblin (after abandoning Jack O' Lantern alias). He will also temporarily become Demogoblin later on. (Amazing Spider-Man #289, June 1987)

- Mid-April 2009 - Peter Parker marries Mary Jane Watson. (Amazing Spider-Man Annual #21, June 1987)

- First appearance of Tombstone. (Web of Spider-Man #36, March 1988)
- Venom's first full appearance! (Amazing Spider-Man #299, April 1988)
- The superhero team Excalibur, made up of Shadowcat, Meggan, Captain Britain, Nightcrawler, and Phoenix (Rachel Summers) is formed. (Excalibur Special Edition Vol 1 #1, April 1988)
- Spider-Man defeats Venom, goes back to the Red and Blues permanently (The Black Suit will still show up during special occasions.) (Amazing Spider-Man #300, May 1988)
- "Armor Wars" – Tony Stark's deadliest technology ends up in a cabal of supervillains. (Iron Man #225 - #231, December 1987 - June 1988)

Late April 2009 – Mid April 2010 - Year 9 (June 1988 – May 1994) – Most of 2nd Year of Grad School (#301-389)

- Late April 2009 – Spider-Man is back in the red and blues. Peter Parker gives a guest speech at ESU on ohmic resistance. Beginning of the "Fifth Reich Arc" (Amazing Spider-Man #301-303, June 1988 – August 1988)
- May 2009 – Spider-Man deals with Black Fox. (Amazing Spider-Man #304-305, September 1988 – October 1988)

Summer 2009:

June 2009 - Amazing Spider-Man #306 - Reminded that he hasn't filed for his assistantship grant, Peter races to ESU (October 1988)

- June 2009 – Peter Parker travels around and finishes his Webs Tour for his photography book. (Amazing Spider-Man #307-#308, October – November 1988)

- June 2009 – “Evolutionary War” takes place. First appearance of Speedball in Chapter 5, Amazing Spider-Man Annual #22. (X-Factor Annual #4 – Avengers Annual #17, August 1988 – November 1988)

- July 2009 – Amazing Spider-Man #309

- August 2009 - Amazing Spider-Man #310 (Dec 1988) – Received Research Assistant Grant, \$9000/a year. Pete heads to ESU to register for classes, and meets Anne-Marie Baker, his fellow research assistant, and Dr. Evan Swann, the lab head. Picks up two courses.

- Peter turns 24 on August 10th, 2009

- September 2009 – Amazing Spider-Man #311 (January 1989)

- September 2009 – “Parable” – Galactus returns to Earth. (Silver Surfer Vol. 4 #1 - #2, December 1988 – January 1989)

- October 2009 – Amazing Spider-Man #312

- Halloween 2009 – “Life’s Blood” - Ghost Rider Volume 3 begins. First appearance of Danny Ketch as the second Ghost Rider. (Ghost Rider Vol. 3 #1, May 1990)

- November 2009 – Amazing Spider-Man #313 (March 1989)

- Christmas Eve 2009 – Amazing Spider-Man #314 (April 1989)

- First appearance of 15 year old Jubilee. (Uncanny X-Men #244, May 1989)
(Wolverine Vol 6 Annual #1, October 2014 for age)

- Beginning of the Acts of Vengeance company crossover. Loki coerces Doctor Doom, Kingpin, Magneto, Mandarin, Red Skull, and Wizard into working together to taking care of their enemies. Avengers Island is sunk. While they succeed to some degree, it all ends in failure due to infighting (most notably between Magneto and Red Skull). (Avengers #311, December 1989)

- “The Gentleman’s Name is The Juggernaut!” First appearance of New Warriors. (Thor #411, December 1989)

- Psylocke temporarily becomes Lady Mandarin. Debut of Psylocke's Asian body. (Uncanny X-Men #256, Late December 1989)
- Peter Parker temporarily holds the Captain Universe powers. Conclusion of the "Acts of Vengeance" Marvel event. (Amazing Spider-Man 327-329, December 1989 - Feb 1990)
- First appearance of Gambit. (Uncanny X-Men Annual #14, July 1990)
- Peter Parker teams up with Green Goblin and the Molten Man against Tombstone. (Web of Spider-Man #66, July 1990)
- Peter Parker confronts Harry Osborn, who decides he wants to do good with the Green Goblin persona. He also reveals that he knows Spider-Man's identity.
- The Return of the Sinister Six story arc. (Amazing Spider-Man #334-339, July 1990 - September 1990)
- Peter Parker temporarily becomes Spider Hulk. (Web of Spider-Man #70, November 1990)
- Past events of "The One With The Super Rare 3-D Cover" takes place. Scott Adsit recounts Deadpool's original sin, where Butler sent Deadpool (with Sabretooth as a guide) to kill his parents. Deadpool successfully does so. (Deadpool Vol. 3 #34, November 2014)
- **Cletus Cassidy makes his first appearance. Cardiac makes his first appearance. Peter is seen attending class. (Amazing Spider-Man #344, February 1991)**
- **Deadpool makes his first appearance. (New Mutants #98, February 1991)**
- Amazing Spider-Man #350/Amazing Spider-Man Annual #25 (Aug/Sep 1991) – Last appearance of fellow research assistant Anne Marie Baker and second to last appearance of Professor Swann.
- "Sabotage" First published appearance of X-Force. They deal with the Jankos Hostage Situation. (X-Force #1 - #4, August 1991 - November 1991)
- First appearance of Bishop. (Uncanny X-Men #282, November 1991)
- **"The Infinity Gauntlet" event takes place. Captain America's shield is shattered for the 3rd time by Thanos, but is brought back into existence by the Infinity Gauntlet in the end. (July - December 1991)**

- **First appearance of Squirrel Girl. (Marvel Superheroes Vol. 2 #8, December 1991)**

- **Carnage makes his first appearance. One of Peter's classmates, Chip, is killed. (ASM #361-363, April - July 1992)**

- **"War Machine" Story Arc. First appearance of the War Machine Armor. Tony Stark becomes the first pilot of the War Machine Armor and defeats the Masters of Evil. He then gets his affairs in order for his seemingly coming death. (Iron Man #281 - #283, June 1992 - August 1992)**

- Spider-Man is able to borrow the Phoenix Force from Rachel Summers, and temporarily becomes Spider-Phoenix. (Spider-Man #25, August 1992)

- **Harry Osborn dies after heroically saving Peter, MJ, and Normie from an exploding building. Harry proclaims Peter as his best friend before he dies. (Spectacular Spider-Man #200, May 1993)**

- Spidey invents the Spider-Armor Mk 1. (Web of Spider-Man #100, May 1993)

- **March 2010? [Maximum Carnage](#) – Cletus Cassidy generates a copy of the Carnage symbiote from his blood, and breaks out of Ravencroft Asylum, freeing Shriek in the process. He goes on a killing spree in New York. First appearance of Shriek in Spider-Man Unlimited #1. (*Amazing Spider-Man* #378-380; *Spectacular Spider-Man* #201-203; *Spider-Man* #35-37; *Spider-Man Unlimited* #1-2; *Web of Spider-Man* #101-103, May 1993 - August 1993)**

- "Fatal Attractions" – Magneto rips the adamantium out of Wolverine's body. One of the precursors to the rise of Onslaught. (X-Factor #92 – Excalibur #71, July - November 1993)

- Late March 2010 - *Amazing Spider-Man* #383-385 – Prof. Swann noticed Parker having difficulty, and suggested him to go home and consider his priorities, excusing

him from class. Last appearance of Professor Swann. (November 1993) The Jury goes after Spider-Man and Venom.

- April 2010 - Amazing Spider-Man #386-389 – “Lifetheft/Pursuit” Arc takes place. Dr. Swann puts in a word to Dr. Sanchez to see Peter about her Alzheimer research. (February 1994 – May 1994)

- Mid-April 2010 – Peter and Mary Jane’s first wedding anniversary.

Late April 2010 – Mid-April 2011 Year 10 (June 1994 – July 2003) (End of Second Year of Grad School, Starts Third Year of Grad School in January) (ASM #390 – #494)

- Late April 2010 - 24 year old Peter Parker begins the year with the “Shrieking” storyline. The cover of Part 3 proclaims “Peter Parker No More”. After his battle with Shriek and Carrion, Peter Parker sees that Aunt May has had a stroke. This enrages and saddens him, and he webs himself in a literal cocoon. When he leaves the cocoon to hunt the Ravencroft escapees, he proclaims, “I am anger, I am madness, I am The Spider. And God help you if you get in the way!” Peter Parker wears The Spider persona for some time, as Ben Reilly, the clone Spider-Man makes his first re-appearance since his introduction. - Late April 2010/Early May 2010 - Peter and Mary Jane conceive a child.

- Peter finishes his second year of Grad School.

- July 2010 - Ben Reilly appearing at an ill Aunt May’s bedside. (Spectacular Spider-Man #216, Sept 1994)

- July 2010 – The Beginning of the Second Clone Saga! Ben Reilly mentions he’s been on the road for almost five years. Ben Reilly and Peter Parker defeat The Traveler (Web of Spider-Man #117, ASM #394, Spider-Man #51, Spectacular Spider-Man #217, all October 1994)

- July 2010 - Amazing Spider-Man #397/Spectacular Spider-Man #220 (Jan 1995) – “Web of Death” Arc takes place, Mary Jane announces her pregnancy.

- Peter Parker (and Ben Reilly) turn 25 on August 10th, 2010.

- **Ben Reilly becomes the Scarlet Spider. (Web of Spider-Man #118, Nov 1994)**

- **First appearance of Kaine. (Web of Spider-Man #119, Dec 1994)**

- **Aunt May told Peter that she knew he was Spider-Man, before dying from her illness. (Amazing Spider-Man #400, April 1995) During “The Final Chapter”, Norman Osborn would reveal that this was an actress infused with Aunt May’s DNA.**

- **Spider-Man 2099 meets Spider-Man for the first time. (Spider-Man 2099 Meets Spider-Man #1, November 1995)**

- Ben Reilly takes over as Spider-Man temporarily. (Sensational Spider-Man #0, Jan 1996)

- The Carnage symbiote merges with Ben Reilly. (Amazing Spider-Man #410, April 1996)

- **Halloween 2010: Ben Reilly is killed by The Green Goblin’s Glider, saving Peter. Peter Parker returns as Spider-Man and defeats Norman. Ben Reilly was revealed as the clone and Peter as the original. Mary Jane gives birth to a premature baby, who is immediately kidnapped. (Spider-Man #75, Dec 1996)**

- Christmas Eve 2010 – Amazing Spider-Man #420 (February 1997)

Spring Semester 2011 – Peter’s 3rd (Incomplete) Year In Grad School (5th Grad School Semester)

- **January 2011 – Peter and Mary Jane goes back to Empire State University, Peter starts working with Paul Stacy (Gwen’s cousin) and Professor Mark Howard. (Amazing Spider-Man #421, March 1997)**

- **“Justice... Like Lightning!” – First appearance of The Thunderbolts. (Thunderbolts #1, April 1997)**

- Identity Crisis: Spider-Man adopts four new identities. Takes place in *Amazing Spider-Man* #434-435; *Spectacular Spider-Man* #257-258; *Sensational Spider-Man* #27-28; *Spider-Man* #91-92. (May – June 1998)

-- Spider-Man #92 – Paul Stacy rejects Peter’s work for being too sloppy. Prof. Howard was asked by [Norman Osborn](#) to take Peter Parker under his wing and see to it that he lived up to his potential. Professor Mark Howard’s last appearance. (June 1998)

- Spidey has a showdown with Black Tarantula. The 3rd Rose is revealed to be Jacob Conover. (Amazing Spider-Man #436, July 1998)

- 25 year old Spidey teams up with Synch from Generation X to take down Plantman. Spidey is turned into Man-Spider by Plantman's spores, but is returned to normal by the issue's end. (Amazing Spider-Man #437, August 1998)

- "The Gathering of Five" (SeSM #32, ASM #440, PP:SS #96, SSM #262, SeSM #33) and "The Final Chapter" (ASM #441, PP:SS #97, SSM #263, PP:SS #98) take place. (October 1998 - November 1998)

- Mid-February 2011 – Valentine's Day – ASM Vol. 2 #4/445 (April 1999)

- Peter Parker, Spider-Man Vol 2 #9 – Last appearance of Paul Stacy. (September 1999)

- "Ultron Unlimited" – Ultron makes duplicates of himself and tries to take over The Earth. Defeated by Antarctic vibranium. (Avengers Vol. 3 #19 - #22, August 1999 – November 1999)

- Peter Parker, Spider-Man Vol 2 #18 (June 2000) – Peter gets himself cleaned up at ESU

- First appearance of Marvel Boy (Noh-Varr). (Marvel Boy Vol. 2 #1, August 2000)

- **Norman Osborn tortures Peter Parker and doses him with drugs in an attempt to make him his heir to The Goblin Legacy. (Peter Parker, Spider-Man #25, Jan 2001)**

- "Welcome Back Frank" Punisher Volume 4 takes place. (Punisher Vol 4. #1 - #12, April 2000 – March 2001)

- **Morlun makes his first appearance. Ezekiel Sims makes his first appearance. (ASM Vol. 2 #30, June 2001)**

- Peter Parker starts teaching Science at Midtown High School. (ASM Vol 2. 31, July 2001)

- Wild Sentinels made by Donald Trask attack the mutant haven of Genosha ruled by Magneto. Sixteen million perish including what seems to be Magneto himself. (New X-Men #115, August 2001)

Mid-March 2011:

- Peter Parker fights The Vulture in a snowy setting. (ASM Vol 2. 32, January 2002)

- **"I know your secret. I know you're Spider-Man." – Aunt May (ASM Vol 2 38/#479, February 2002) Aunt May walks in on Peter bruised and bloodied, sleeping next to a torn Spidey suit.**
- Nuff Said Silent Issue. Mary Jane misses Peter, Peter misses Mary Jane, Aunt May is figuring out how to improve the public's opinion of Spidey, and Spidey is saving lives. (Amazing Spider-Man Vol 2, #39/#480, May 2002)
- "The Kang Dynasty" - Kang's all-out assault on the world, with the Avengers on the frontline. (Avengers Vol. 3 #41 - #55, June 2001 - August 2002)
- April 2011? - Emma Frost states she's 27 years old. (New X-Men #138, May 2003)
- (Amazing Spider-Man #53/#494, July 2003) takes place. Peter and Mary Jane are comfortable with being intimate again.
- Mid-April 2011 – "Past" portions of Secret War takes place, Peter Parker and Mary Jane's Second Wedding Anniversary. (Daisy Johnson's cover is a High School Spring Break student.) (Secret War #2, July 2004)

Late April 2011 – Mid April 2012 Year 11 (August 2003 – March 2006) (Amazing Spider-Man Vol. 2 #54/#495 -#528)

- **Late April 2011 - Peter Parker donates the money from mob boss Forelli so that the Gwen Stacy Library can be opened. (Amazing Spider-Man Vol. 2 #54/495, August 2003)**
- **"Unintended Consequences" – Peter tries to look out for his students at Midtown. (Amazing Spider-Man Vol 2 #55/#496 – Vol 2 #56/#497, September 2003 – October 2003)**
- **"Vegas Bleeds Neon" Iron Man Vol 3 story arc. First appearance of the Iron Man Model 29 in #72. (Iron Man Vol 3 #70 – 72, September 2003 – November 2003)**
- August 10th, 2011 – Peter Parker's 26th Birthday is celebrated in Amazing Spider-Man Vol 2#57 (Vol 1#498) – Vol 1#500 (Oct - Dec, 2003)**

- August 2011 – "The Draco" storyline where 24 year old Nightcrawler meets his birth father, Azazel, who plans on returning and conquering the Earth with his race

of “demonic” mutants, the Neyaphim. Iceman reforms from a head, taking moisture from an enemy’s body. (Uncanny X-Men #429 - #434, October 2003 – January 2004)

- August 2011 – First appearance of X23. (NYX #3, February 2004)

- August 2011 – Magneto is revealed to be alive after the fall of Genosha in New X-Men #115. He was supposedly revived by Wanda. (Excalibur Vol 3 #1, July 2004)

- August 2011 - Sins Past storyline – Peter Parker finds out that Norman fathered Gwen’s twins who she gave birth to while she was in Europe. She was only pregnant for 7 months. (ASM #509-514, August 2004-January 2005)

- August 2011 - Toxin is “born” (Venom Vs Carnage, Sep. 2004)

- August 2011 - “Gifted” – Mass student orientation at Xavier’s School for Gifted Youngsters. Dr. Kavito Rao presents “Hope”, the mutant cure. Ord from Breakworld invades. An emergence of a new X-Men team consisting of Cyclops, Wolverine, Emma Frost, Shadowcat, and Beast. The return of Colossus. (Astonishing X-Men Vol. 3 #1 - #6, July 2004 - December 2004)

- August 2011 – “Avengers Disassembled” Marvel Event (Spectacular Spider-Man Vol 2, #17-#20, Sep 2004 – Dec 2004) (Avengers #500 - #503, Oct-Dec 2004) – Spider-Man undergoes a transformation from the Spider Queen but comes out with organic webbing and limited communication with spiders. He modifies his web shooters so that Mary Jane Watson can use them if she ever has to. She is seen doing so two years later in the “Goblin Nation” storyline of Superior Spider-Man.

- Meanwhile, Scarlett Witch’s reality warping powers cause numerous problems for The Avengers, including the deaths of Scott Lang and Clint Barton. It ultimately leads to the Avengers being disbanded, the formation of The New Avengers, and into the House of M story arc later.

- October 2011 – “Annihilation Day” – Annihilus’s Annihilation Wave emerges from the Crunch and destroys Klyn. This marks Annihilation Day, the beginning of the Annihilation. (Annihilation Prologue #1, May 2006)

- “Breakout!” - Spidey becomes a member of the New Avengers. (New Avengers #1-6, January-June 2005) First appearance of Maria Hill in New Avengers #4.

- First appearance of the Young Avengers. (Young Avengers #1, April 2005)

- Spider-Man/Human Torch #5 – Johnny FINALLY figures out Peter and Spidey are one in the same. (July 2005)

- “New Avengers” Story Arc (Amazing Spider-Man #519-#524, June 2005 – November 2005)

- “Man and Machine” – The New Avengers team up with the Autobots. (Only the original 4 New Avengers take part in this adventure) (New Avengers/Transformers #1-#4, September 2007 - December 2007)

- Late January 2012 - “The Sentry” story arc – First appearance of The Illuminati. The Sentry joins The New Avengers. (New Avengers #7 - #10, July 2005 – October 2005)

- Late January 2012 – “House of M” Crossover Event takes place. (Sentry is part of the team, but Ronin is absent.) (August 2005 – November 2005)

- Late January 2012 - Ronin (New Avengers #11-#13, Nov 2005 – Jan 2006) takes place.

- Late January 2012 – First appearance of Amadeus Cho. (Amazing Fantasy Vol 2 #15, Jan 2006)

- Late January/Early February 2012 - Spidey goes through a transformation with new abilities in The Other. (Friendly Neighborhood Spider-Man #1-4; Marvel Knights Spider-Man #19-22; Amazing Spider-Man #525-528, December 2005 - March 2006)

- February 5th, 2012 - Spidey makes a comment about the Super Bowl being on. (Friendly Neighborhood Spider-Man #4, (published March, 2006) The next few issues show a Winter setting. (most prominently in Marvel Knights: Spider-Man #22, which is also the issue where Peter wears a NY Giants jacket (who played in Super Bowl XLVI and beat the Patriots)

- (Tracer’s technology estimates Aunt May to be 73 years old at this point.)

- Spider-Man, at the end of The Other story arc, vows to take a new lease on life.

- Secrets & Lies Story Arc (New Avengers #14-#15, February – March 2006) takes place. New Avengers go public with their questionable roster.

- Mid-April 2012 – Present events of “Secret War” takes place. Peter Parker and Mary Jane’s 3rd Wedding Anniversary also takes place. (Secret War #5, December 2005)

- Mid-April 2012 - “The Winter Soldier” – Captain America story arc takes place. The Winter Soldier is revealed to be James Buchanon. (Captain America Vol. 5 #8 - #14, September 2005 - April 2006)

- Mid-April 2012 – “Extremis” - Iron Man story arc takes place. Iron Man Mark 30 “Extremis Armor” makes its first appearance in Iron Man Vol. 4 #4. (Iron Man Vol 4. #1 - #6, January 2005 – April 2006)

Late April 2012 – Mid April 2013 Year 12 (April 2006 - June 2010) (Amazing Spider-Man #529 - #629)

- Spider-Man begins the year with the “Mr. Parker Goes To Washington” storyline where he goes with Iron Man to Washington to discuss the Superhuman Registration Act. He is gifted with the Iron Spider costume as he takes on the role of Iron Man’s protégé. (ASM #529-#531, April-June, 2006)*

- New Avengers Annual #1 – Marriage of Luke Cage and Jessica Jones, who is shown to have given birth to her daughter, Danielle Cage. (June 2006)

- “Deadly Genesis” X-Men story event takes place. The Third Summers Brother, Vulcan (Gabriel Summers) revives and makes his presence known. (Banshee) Sean Cassidy is killed. Vulcan renounces Cyclops as his brother and goes to take down the Shi’ar. (X-Men: Deadly Genesis, January – July 2006)

- “The Collective” story arc of New Avengers #16 - #20 takes place. Peter is wearing the Iron Spider costume and the Civil War has not started. (April 2006 - August 2006)

- “Execute Program” Iron Man story arc takes place. First appearance of the Argonaut Iron Man Armors: Battle Argonaut (Model 31), Hulkbuster Argonaut (Model 32), Subterranean Argonaut (Model 33), Submarine Argonaut (Model 34), and Stealth Argonaut (Model 35) In Vol. 4 #11. (Iron Man Vol. 4 #7 - #12, June 2006 – November 2006)

- “Supernovas” X-Men Vol. 2 story arc takes place. The X-Men take on the Children of the Vault. Iceman completely reforms from steam to ice, to his human form, marking the first time he has ever pulled himself back together after being vaporized. Beginning of Iceman/Mystique romance. (X-Men Vol. 2 #188 - #193, September 2006 – January 2007)

- “Civil War” Marvel Crossover Event takes place. (July 2006 – April 2007)

-- “Civil War: The War at Home” 7 part Amazing Spider-Man story arc takes place at the same time as Civil War. 26 year old Spidey unmasks himself as Peter Parker after over a decade of keeping his secret. “My name is Peter

Parker, and I've been Spider-Man since I was 15 years old." (Amazing Spider-Man #532 - #538, - July 2006 - April 2007)

-- Black Panther and Storm are married during a temporary ceasefire during the war. (Black Panther Vol. 4 #18, September 2006)

- May 2012 - Annihilation Day + 220 - Nova kills Annihilus by reaching into his throat, and turning him inside out, taking vengeance for the Nova Corps and effectively ending the Annihilation Wave. (Annihilation #6, March 2007)

- "Planet Hulk" - Before the Civil War begins, Bruce Banner is tricked by The Illuminati and sent off to a planet with no inhabitants so that The Hulk can no longer hurt anyone else. Due to a navigation malfunction and a wormhole, he ends up on Sakaar, which is where he spends his time during the Marvel Civil War. (Incredible Hulk Vol. 2 #92 - #105, April 2006 to June 2007)

- July 2012 - "Armistice Day (Annihilation Day + 268)" - After Annihilus' defeat, the remaining Annihilation Wave forces agree to a treaty that brings the hostilities to an end, but gives the remaining Wave forces all of the Skrull territory and the former Kree capital, Kree-Lar. (Annihilation #6, March 2007)

- July 2012 - "What's Next" - Nova (Richard Rider) returns to Earth after dealing with the fallout from The Annihilation Wave, only to be upset by The Marvel Civil War and how things have changed. (Nova Vol. 4 #1 - #3, June 2007 - August 2007)

- July 2012 - "Back in Black" storyline happens when Kingpin sends a sniper who shoots May leaving her in a critical state. Peter then dons the black costume to take revenge. (ASM #539-543 May 2007 - October 2007)

- "The Death of the Dream" - The Death of Captain America takes place when he is assassinated on his way to trial. (Captain America Vol. 5 #25 - #30, April 2007 - November 2007)

- "World War Hulk" - Hulk returns to Earth to seek answers on why he was sent off, and unleashes his vengeance. Spider-Man helps the heroes of New York to fight off The Hulk. (wearing Black Costume from Back in Black storyline.) (World War Hulk #1 - #5, August 2007 - January 2008)

- "The Revolution" New Avengers story arc takes place. Spidey is wearing the black suit. (New Avengers #27-31) This is followed immediately "The Trust" New Avengers story arc, Spidey still in black suit. (New Avengers #32-37, Annual #2, September 2007 - February 2008)

- August 10th, 2012 - Peter Parker turns 27.

- "One More Day" - History is altered after Peter and Mary Jane agree to allow Mephisto to save May's life in exchange for their wedding, however under a few conditions: First that history is altered so that Peter never revealed his identity during the Civil War, in order to prevent May from becoming a target of Spider-Man's enemies once again, and another condition which Mary Jane offers to Mephisto in secret. Spidey loses his powers gained during the "Changes" (Spectacular Spider-Man Vol. 2 #17- #20) and "The Other" story arc." (*Amazing Spider-Man* #544-545; *Friendly Neighborhood Spider-Man* #24; *Sensational Spider-Man* vol. 2, #41) Lily Hollister's first appearance. (*Amazing Spider-Man* #545, January 2008)

- Spider-Man goes missing for 2 months after (except for one brief sighting). Peter has been keeping a low profile and living at Aunt May's.

- October 12th, 2012, 7:00 am – "Brand New Day" story arc begins. (#546, February 2008)

- Menace's first appearance. (#549, March 2008)

- First appearance of Thunderbolt Ross as Red Hulk. (*Incredible Hulk* Vol 2 #1, March 2008)

- First appearance of 27 year old Rick Jones as A-Bomb. (*Incredible Hulk* Vol 2 #2, April 2008)

- "Power To The People" story arc takes place. Spider-Man begins The Gauntlet arc, where his old foes have gained increased powers. He begins with Electro. (Amazing Spider-Man #612 - #614, January 2010 - February 2010)

- "Something Can Stop The Juggernaut" 3-part storyline. (Amazing Spider-Man #627-629, April - June 2010)

- Mid-April 2013 - Siege of Asgard Marvel Event takes place. Norman Osborn is finally taken down paving way for a new age. (Siege #1-4, March 2010 - June 2010, New Avengers #61-#64, March - June 2010)

Late-April 2013 - Mid-April 2014 Year 13 (July 2010 - May 2014) - "The Age of Heroes/The Heroic Age" (Amazing Spider-Man #630 - Superior Spider-Man #26)

Late April 2013 - Reed Richards puts together the Future Foundation. (Fantastic Four #579, July 2010)

May 2013 - 27 year old Peter begins the year with the Shed storyline, fighting The Lizard who has eaten Billy Connors and completely overtaken Curt Connors. He continues surviving his ordeal against The Lizard who was adding New Yorkers to his thrall. The Lizard begins to feel remorse over eating Billy even though he has completely overtaken Curt Connors. (Amazing Spider-Man #630-633, July - Aug, 2010)

- June 2013 - "Second Coming" X-Men crossover occurs. Cable and Hope return from the future. The Human Council attacks. The Death of Nightcrawler at 26 years old in X-Force Vol 3. #26. Human Council is decimated. X-Men reinstalled as heroes. X-Factor reunites. Hope Summers unveils the magnitude of her powers, and connection with The Phoenix. The first five new

mutants since M-Day appear on Cerebra. (X-Men Second Coming #1 – X-Men Second Coming #2, May 2010 – September 2010)

- June 2013 - The Grim Hunt Arc begins. (Amazing Spider-Man #634 - #637, Aug-Sep 2010)

- June 2013 - One Moment in Time where Peter Parker and Mary Jane, post-Brand New Day, recap the retcons that took place when Mephisto erased their marriage. (#638-641, September 2010 - October 2010)

- “Stark Resilient” story arc, Iron Man Model 38 “Bleeding Edge” makes it’s first appearance. Invincible Iron Man #25 – Invincible Iron Man #32, June 2010 – Jan 2011)

- New Avengers Vol 2 #1-#6 is the Possession Arc where The New Avengers move to The Avengers Mansion led by Luke Cage. (August 2010 - January 2011)

- Shadowland Marvel Event takes place. (September 2010 – January 2011)

- Origin of the Species takes place. Norman Osborn’s baby is born... every villain on the planet wants the first ever strain of pure Goblin blood, leaving Spider-Man’s friends and family exposed to a Sinister plan that threatens to bring down every strand of Peter’s life that’s been stitched together carefully over the past few years. (ASM #642 - #647, November 2010 – January 2011)

- “Big Time” Story Arc. Peter Parker begins his job at Horizon Labs. Debuts the Stealth Suit in #650. (Amazing Spider-Man #648 – 651, Jan 2011 – Feb 2011)

- “The New Iron Age” takes place. Anthony Stark turns 35 years old. (Invincible Iron Man #500, March 2011)

- “Revenge of the Spider Slayer” Story arc. Marla Jameson dies in #654. Flash Thompson becomes Venom in #654 through Project Rebirth 2.0. Spider-Man vows that “no one dies” on his watch. Spider Armor Mk III debuts in #656 (ASM #652-654, March 2011 - April 2011)

- “No One Dies” Story Arc. Peter Parker vows as Spider-Man that no one else dies after the death of Marla Jameson. (Amazing Spider-Man #655 – 656, April 2011 – May 2011)

- Flash Thompson’s solo series as Venom begins. (Venom Vol. 2 #1, May 2011)

- “Wolverine Goes To Hell” story arc takes place. Hellverine commits atrocities in Wolverine’s body including the murder of Pastor John Wraith. While his

soul in hell, Wolverine meets Thomas Logan, who murdered his alleged father, John Howlett Sr. Thomas Logan tell Wolverine that he is his biological father. (Wolverine: Road to Hell #1, Wolverine Vol. 4 #1 - #8, November 2010 - June 2011)

- Avengers Vol 4. 12.1/Age of Ultron #10 (past portion) takes place. The Avengers and Hank Pym defeat Ultron, preventing the Age of Ultron from occurring. (June 2011/August 2013)

- Spider-Man and Wolverine live out years together in different eras before returning to the moment that they were taken out of time. "Dog" Logan, Wolverine's half-brother, follows Wolverine to the present. Astonishing Spider-Man/Wolverine #1 - 6 (July 2010 - July 2011)

- Spider-Man joins the Future Foundation. (ASM #657-#660, May 2011 - July 2011)

- "Date Night" New Avengers Vol 2 story arc #7-#13. (February 2011 - August 2011)

- "Identity Wars" - Spider-Man, Deadpool, and Hulk travel to [Earth-11638](#) ("The Perfect World") where they meet The Amazing Spider. The Amazing Spider was trapping Spider-Men of other universes and stealing their powers to become stronger, with the help of that reality's Ben Parker. The Amazing Spider realizes his mistake, but is still killed. His soul is freed from Hell by Dr. Banner, the Sorcerer Supreme, who merges him with the spirits and powers of the repentant damned, creating Ghost Spider and giving Earth-11638's Peter Parker another chance. (Amazing Spider-Man Annual #38 - Incredible Hulks Annual #1, June 2011 - August 2011)

- The Return of Anti-Venom. (#663-664) (August 2011)

- "Fear Itself" Event takes place. Captain America's Shield is broken for a 4 time by The Serpent, brother of Odin and God of Fear in #5.* (Fear Itself #1 - #7, June 2011 - December 2011, New Avengers Vol 2 #14-#16, September 2011 - November 2011)

- "Schism" X-Men event takes place. Cyclops and Wolverine split the X-Men. Wolverine leads many mutants away from Utopia (where Cyclops's team of X-Men remains). This leads to the opening of the Jean Grey School of Higher Learning. (X-Men: Schism #1 - #5, September - December 2011)

- "Spider-Island" Event takes place. (#666-673) (September 2011 - January 2012)

- Peter forms the Way of the Spider fighting style under Shang Chi's guidance.
- First appearance of Nick Fury Jr. (Marcus Johnson) (Battle Scars #1, January 2012)
- "Great Heights" ASM Story Arc (#674-675, January 2012 – February 2012)
- "I Killed Tomorrow" ASM Story Arc takes place. Peter and Grady work together to prevent New York from being destroyed in 24 hours. (#676 – 677, March 2012)
- "Life After Death" Scarlet Spider Vol. 2 story arc takes place. Kaine takes up residence in Houston, Texas as the Scarlet Spider. (Scarlet Spider Vol. 2 #1 – 2, March – April 2012)
- "The Descendants" Secret Avengers story arc. Flash Thompson joins the Secret Avengers as Agent Venom, along with the original Human Torch, Jim Hammond. (Secret Avengers #22 - #23, March – April, 2012)
- New Avengers Vol. 2, "New Dark Avengers" Story Arc takes place. (#17-23) Meanwhile, in Avengers Vol. 4 #23, Norman Osborn gains the power of the Super-Adaptoid, but is still defeated by The Avengers and The New Avengers. He was overloaded with all the powers in the vicinity, and went into a coma. (December 2011 - May 2012)
- Summer 2013 - ("Last Summer when Doctor Octopus tried to blackmail the world" Superior Spider-Man #8) - Ends of the Earth Event takes place. Spider Armor MK III makes its debut in 682. (#682-685, Ends of the Earth Special, #686-687, Avenging Spider-Man #8, May 2012 - August 2012)
- Summer 2013 – "Iron Man No More / Long Way Down" Invincible Iron Man story arc. Iron Mark Model Mark 40 debuts in Issue #517. James Rhodes once again appears as Iron Man in the same issue. (Invincible Iron Man #516 - #520, July – September 2012)
- "No Turning Back" Story Arc takes place. (#688 – 691, August – October 2012)
- August 10th, 2013 – Peter Parker's 28th Birthday.
- Late August 2013 – "Otherworld" Uncanny X-Force story arc. Fantomex is put on trial for multiverse crimes by The Skinless Man and Horoam'ce. (Uncanny X-Force #19 - #23, February 2012 – May 2012)
- Late August 2013 - Spider-Men event takes place. (Spider-Men #1-5, August 2012 -November 2012)

- Early September, 2013 – 50th Anniversary “Alpha” Story Arc takes place. (#692 - #694, October 2012 – November 2012) (Has to take place during the school year.)
- Mid September 2013 – “Just Another Day in Westchester County” – The Jean Grey School for Higher Learning has been open and operating one week. (Wolverine and the X-Men #4 - 8, March 2012 – June 2012)
- Mid September – Avengers Vs. X-Men takes place. (Avengers Vs. X-Men #1-#12, New Avengers #24-30, Wolverine and the X-Men #9 - #18, June 2012 – December 2012) Black Panther annuls his marriage to Storm in #8. Professor X is killed in #11 by a Dark Phoenix-possessed Cyclops.
- Mid September – “The Future” story arc takes place. Iron Man Armor Model 41 debuts in Invincible Iron Man #523. (Invincible Iron Man #521 - #527, September 2012 – December 2012)
- Mid September – “End Times” New Avengers Vol. 2 Finale Story Arc. (New Avengers #31-34 – December 2012 - January 2013)
- Mid September 2013 – “Believe” - Tony Stark (debut of) Iron Man Armor Model 42 in Iron Man Vol 5 #1. “Believe” story arc in Iron Man #1 - #4 take place. (January 2013 - February 2013)
- Mid September – “Memento Mori” - The Illuminati re-form in Wakanda. Captain America’s memory of the Illuminati is erased and his membership revoked. (New Avengers Vol 3. #1 - #3, March 2013 – April 2013)
- Mid September – “Avengers World” - Captain America and Tony Stark form an extensive Avengers team to be prepared for any and all threats. First appearance of Ex Nihilo and his group. Peter Parker’s last outing as an Avenger until Original Sin takes place. (Avengers Vol 5. #1 - #3, February – March 2013)
- Mid-September “Danger Zone” (#695 – 697) takes place. At the end of #697, Norman Osborn is revealed to have disappeared from his room in the coma ward where he was placed months before. (December 2012 – January 2013)
- Mid-September 2013 - Peter Parker “dies” in the Dying Wish storyline while Otto Octavius takes over his body. (ASM #698 - Amazing Spider-Man #700, January - February 2013)
- Mid-September 2013 – Avenging Spider-Man 15.1 (February 2013)
- Mid-September 2013 – “My Own Worst Enemy” (Within 2 days of ASM #700) Doc Ock takes over as The Superior Spider-Man and debuts a new Superior Suit. (Superior Spider-Man #1-2, March 2013)

- "My Life as a Weapon" – Hawkeye's fourth solo title begins at his apartment in Brooklyn. (Hawkeye Vol. 4 #1 - #5, October 2012 - February 2013)

- Mid-October 2013 – Doc Ock has spent a month inside Peter Parker's body. (Superior Spider-Man #4, April 2013) Doc Ock finds out Peter was a credit and a thesis short from graduating grad school. Peter Parker enrolls into Advanced Physics part way through the semester by executing certain bribes. He executes Massacre in Superior Spider-Man #5. (May 2013)

- Mid-October 2013 – Avenging Spider-Man #18 takes place (May 2013). Superior Spider-Man #6 (May 2013) then takes place a few days after Superior Spider-Man #5.

- Mid-October – "World Eater" take place. The events of World Eater take place one week before "Black Swans/Blue Hell" and after Avengers Vol 5 #5. (New Avengers #4, May 2013)

- Late October 2013 – First appearance of James Rhodes as Iron Patriot. (Gambit Vol 5 #13, July 2013)

- Late October 2013 – Substantial period of not talking to Mary Jane Watson. Midterms for ESU Fall Physics Grad students. (Superior Spider-Man #10, July 2013) Followed by Avenging Spider-Man #19-22 (June 2013 – August 2013)

- Late-October – "Black Swans/Blue Hell" takes place. The Illuminati go to Latveria to face an Incursion. Beast is in his pre-All New X-Men appearance. (New Avengers #5-6, June – July 2013)

- Late October 2013 – Dr. Hank McCoy (Beast) brings Cyclops, Iceman, Angel, Beast, and Jean Grey from September 2002 to the present. (All-New X-Men #1, January 2013)

- Late October 2013 – "Agent of S.H.I.E.L.D." Bruce Banner begins working as an Agent of SHIELD. Hulk destroys, Banner builds. Tony Stark and Bruce Banner have a disagreement in #2. Issue #3 reveals it's been one year since the Skrull Invasion. (Indestructible Hulk #1 - 5, January – May 2013)

- Late October 2013 – "The Last White Event" Arc takes place (Avengers Vol. 5 #6 - #9.) Spock's first shown interactions as an Avenger. (April – June 2013)

- Late October 2013 – Tony Stark debuts the Space Armor Mark III in Iron Man Vol 5 #5. He goes off into space. This concludes the Believe Arc. (March 2013)

- Late October 2013 – Wolverine and Invisible Woman (from the Age of Ultron), having prevented the Age of Ultron by convincing Hank Pym to install a shutdown for Ultron in the past, return to the present. A massive shockwave echoes through time and space as reality seems to shatter before being pulled back together. First appearance of Angela in The Marvel Universe. (Age of Ultron #10, August 2013)
- Late October 2013 – “Cosmic Avengers” Tony Stark spends time in space as a member of The Guardians of the Galaxy. Angela also joins The Guardians (Guardians of the Galaxy #1 - #7, May 2013 – November 2013)
- November 2013 – (Superior Spider-Man #11-#13) Spidey fights and slays the Alistair Smythe as the Spider-Slayer. Spidey also takes over The Raft as Spider Island II. (August – September 2013)
- November 2013– SpOck debuts a new costume and his Spiderlings to reclaim Shadowland. (Superior Spider-Man #14-16) (Aunt May hasn’t talked to SpOck in weeks) (September 2013 – October 2013)
- November 2013 - Superior Spider-Man Team Up #1-2 takes place. Followed by Scarlet Spider #20 (September 2013 – October 2013)
- November 9th, 2013 – “Necessary Evil” (SSM #17-19) story arc takes place; Parker signs the paperwork for Parker Industries. (November – December 2013)
- November 9th, 2013 - Superior Spider-Man #32 takes place during #19, when the explosion inside Horizon Labs takes SpOck to 2099. He is able to build a time machine that instead takes him to parallel worlds. He sees that the Fantastic Five Spider-Man, House of M Spider-Man, Iron Spider-Man, and Armor Spider-Man have been killed by Morlun. He recruits Spider-Man India, Six-Armed Spider-Man, Spider-Bitch, Spider-Man Noir, Spider-Monkey, and Assassin Spider-Man.
- Late November 2013 – “Thrones – New Avengers Vol 3 #7. Takes place 28 days after New Avengers Vol 3. #6. Wakanda prepares for war against Atlantis. (New Avengers Vol 3 #7, August 2013)
- Late November 2013 – “Godkiller and The Secret Origin of Tony Stark” Tony Stark thwarts 451’s plans to take control of the Godkiller. He discovers that he’s adopted, that he has a brother, and he leaves the Guardians. (Iron Man Vol 5 #6 - #17, April 2013 – December 2013)
- “Battle of the Atom” X-Men 50th Anniversary crossover event takes place. (Battle of the Atom #1 - #2, November – December 2013)
- December 2013 - “Infinity” Marvel Crossover Event takes place. Superior Spider-Man Team Up #3 - #4 takes place. (November 2013 for SSMTU) (October

2013 – January 2014 for Infinity) (New Avengers Vol. 3 #8 – 12, September – January 2014) *Tony Stark mentions seeing The Living Tribunal's body, and New Avengers Vol 3. #8 takes place one week after #7)

- Late December 2013 – #20-#21 “Return of Stunner” Arc takes place. Peter Parker presents his thesis, is accused of plagiarizing Doctor Octopus, but ultimately prevails. (December 2013 – January 2014)

- “The Apocalypse Twins”, “Ragnarok Now”, and “Avenge the Earth” Uncanny Avengers storyline takes place. (Uncanny Avengers #6 - #22, June 2013 - September 2014)

- December- “Killable” story arc takes place. Wolverine loses his healing factor to the microverse virus. (Wolverine Vol 5 #8 - #13, October 2013 - March 2014)

- Christmas Day, 2013 – Iron Man 3030 (Rhodey Stark) mentions it's Christmas. Captain America puts a mortal Wolverine and Superior Spider-Man on a leave of absence from The Avengers. (Avengers Vol. #24.NOW, February 2014)

- January 2014 - Superior Spider-Man Annual #1 (January 2014)

- January 2014 - “The Agamotto Gambit/See How Swans Fly” story arc (New Avengers Vol. 3 #14 - #15, April – May 2014)

- January 2014 - “The Mirror” story arc. The Avengers battle Avengers from another universe. Bruce Banner finds out that Tony Stark and the others reformed the Illuminati and joins. #26 shows us that it takes place one month after Infinity. (Avengers Vol. 5 #25 - #28, March – June 2014)

- February 2014 - Superior Spider-Man Team Up #5 - #8 (December 2013 - March 2014)

- Late March 2014 – “Darkest Hours” SpOck graduated with a PhD in Nuclear Physics (again). Opens Parker Industries. Temporarily bonds with the Venom Symbiote. Superior Spider-Man #22 - Superior Spider-Man #26. (January 2014 - March 2014)

- Late March 2014 – All-New X-Men #21. The Original X-Men have been in the future about 6 months, young Jean Grey is stated to be 17. Bobby Drake's 28th (and 17th) birthday happen around this time. (March 2014)

- “The Most Amazing School In The Universe” story arc takes place. (Wolverine and the X-Men Vol 1. #38 - #40, January – March 2014) (Cyclops notices Wolverine isn't healing in #39)

- "The Quest for Nightcrawler" takes place. The X-Men are saved by 27 year old Nightcrawler in Heaven from Azazel and Nightcrawler returns to the land of the living! (Amazing X-Men Vol. 2 #1 - #5, January 2014 – May 2014) (Doesn't heal in #5)

- April 2014 – Superior Spider-Man Team Up #9 - #12 (March 2014 - June 2014)

- Mid-to-late April 2014 – Past events of Wolverine Vol. 6 #2 - #4 (#3 being first chronological appearance of Wolverine's Ablation Armor, made by SpOck).

Late April 2014 – 2015 - Year 14 (June 2014 - Now) (Superior Spider-Man #27 – Avengers Vol. 5 #35)

- Late April 2014 (circa Easter 2014/April 20th) - 31 Days pass after Superior Spider-Man #26. Peter Parker ends the year by returning to the world of the living, taking back his body and defeating The Green Goblin. (Superior Spider-Man #27-31, April 2014 - June 2014)

- Late April 2014 – Electro blows up the new prison holding supervillains the same night Green Goblin blows up Spider-Island II.

- Late April 2014 – "Lucky to be Alive" - 28 year old Dr. Peter Parker is adjusting back to his life as Spidey. It has been 13 years since he's become Spider-Man. Black Cat seeks revenge on him. He also discovers there is another person that was bitten by the same radioactive spider that gave him his powers 13 years ago. Takes place the day after Superior Spider-Man #31. (Amazing Spider-Man Vol 3, #1-2 – June – July 2014)

- May 4th, 2014 – New York Goats (Red Bulls) beat FC Dallas after having their mascot returned to them. (Amazing X-Men #7, July 2014)

- May 2014 – Amazing Spider-Man: Family Business Original Graphic Novel takes place. (June 2014)

- May 2014 – "Kaine" Peter flies out to Houston, TX to try to make things right with Kaine. (Amazing Spider-Man #1, June 2014)

- May 2014 – Venom (Flash Thompson) joins the Guardians of the Galaxy. (Free Comic Book Day 2014: Guardians of the Galaxy, July 2014)

- June 2014 – "Rings of the Mandarin" storyline takes place. Tony Stark battles against Malekith the Accursed who now wields many of the Mandarin's rings. (Iron Man Vol 5. #23.NOW - #28, May – August 2014)

- June 2014 – “Who Shot The Hulk” storyline takes place. Bruce Banner becomes mentally handicapped after being shot, but his intelligence is restored to an even higher degree by Tony Stark’s application of Extremis to Bruce’s brain. (Hulk Vol. 3 #1 - #4, June 2014 – August 2014)

- June 2014 - Amazing Spider-Man Vol 3, #3 (August 2014)

- June 2014 - Captain Marvel (Carol Danvers) joins the Guardians of the Galaxy. (Guardians of the Galaxy #16, August 2014)

- June 15th (and 16th), 2014 - “Graduation Day” story arc of Wolverine and the X-Men Vol 1. Armor, Pixie, Anole, and Kid Omega are among the first class to graduate from The Jean Grey School of Higher Learning. Genesis, Broo, Sprite, and Shark-Girl are implied to of graduated because they are all wearing gowns, but they are not seen being given diplomas. (Wolverine and the X-Men Vol 1. #42, April 2014)

- June 2014 – “Healing Factor” Ms. Marvel Vol. 3 story arc takes place. Ms. Marvel and Wolverine team up against Thomas Edison. (Ms. Marvel Vol 3 #6 - #7, September – October 2014)

- June 2014 – “World War Wendigo” Amazing X-Men Vol. 2 story arc takes place. Wolverine has not left the school yet, Steve is still young, and Thor is still worthy of Mjolnir. (Amazing X-Men Vol. 2 #8 - #12, August 2014 – December 2014)

- June 2014 - Wolverine leaves the Jean Grey School of Higher Learning in past events of Wolverine Vol 6. #4.

- June 18th, 2014 – Hawkeye (Clint Barton)’s birthday. (Matt Fraction’s website)

- July 2014 – The entirety of “Wolverine Volume Six” takes place. “Rogue Logan” story arc takes place. With his healing factor gone, Wolverine infiltrates Offer’s squad (undercover with the aid of SHIELD) in order to find information about Sabretooth’s organization. Logan defeats Sabretooth in their final showdown of the title, and Sabretooth is imprisoned by SHIELD. Logan concludes the title asks Shadowcat to call him by his birth name, James. (Wolverine Vol 6, #1-12, April 2014 – October 2014) (Note: Wolverine Volume Six must take place after Wolverine and the X-Men Vol. 2 #9, but before Original Sin #1. Thor has Mjolnir in Wolverine Volume Six, but loses it in Original Sin.)

- July 2014 – “Wolf and Cub” – Wolverine, 19 year old Jubilee, and Shogo go on a camping trip where Wolverine learns that Jubilee can now fend for herself. (Wolverine Volume Six Annual, October 2014)

- July 2014 – “A Perfect World” – The Illuminati battle The Great Society. Namor forms The Cabal. (New Avengers Vol 3. #16.NOW – New Avengers #23 May – October 2014)

- July 2014 – Original Sin #1 takes place. (July 2014)

- July 2014 - Amazing Spider-Man Vol 3, #4 (September 2014)/Original Sin #2 -#3 (July 2014 – August 2014)/Nova #18 (August 2014) take place. Past events of Hulk Vs Iron Man #1 takes place. (August 2014)

- July 2014 – “Infinite Avengers” story arc takes place when Captain America sees that The Illuminati erased his memories. (Avengers Vol 5. #29 -34, July 2014 – October 2014)

- July 2014 - Amazing Spider-Man Vol 3, #5 (takes place right after #4.) (October 2014). Amazing Spider-Man Vol 3, #6 takes place after #5. (November 2014) (Note: ASM V3 #6 says that an event in #1 took place “last week”, although I believe Anna Maria was exaggerating.)

- July 2014 – Original Sin #4 takes place. (August 2014)

- July 2014 – Thor and Loki: The Tenth Realm takes place. (Original Sin 5.1 – Original Sin 5.5, September 2014 – November 2014)

- July 2014 – Original Sin #6 - #8 take place. (September 2014 – October 2014)

- July 2014 –Hulk Vs. Iron Man #3.1 (past) takes place within the pages of Original Sin #3, before the interrogation of The Orb. The rest takes place after Original Sin #8 (Hulk has not yet become Omega Hulk). First appearance of the newest Hulkbuster armor, the Iron Man Model 50. (Original Sin 3.1 – Original Sin 3.4, August 2014 – October 2014)

- July 2014 – “Tomorrow Never Learns” and “No Future” take place. Orientation begins at the Jean Grey School for Higher Learning. Wolverine goes to the World to find Fantomex. Quentin Quire deals with one-day becoming Phoenix and is also made a teaching assistant. Quentin Quire and the Future X-Men defeat and kill Future Quentin Quire. Quentin Quire’s 17th birthday takes place after Wolverine and Storm vacation in The World. (Wolverine and the X-Men Vol. 2 #1-9, May 2014 - November 2014)

Note: (Editor’s note from the introduction of Wolverine and the X-Men Vol. 2 #7 place the events of “Tomorrow Never Learns” before Wolverine Vol 6. #1. However, this is impossible because Quentin Quire appears in Wolverine Volume Six #10 as a student at the school, while he leaves the school in Wolverine and the X-Men Vol. 2 #5. Wolverine is dead by the time Wolverine and the X-Men #10 rolls around, so

Wolverine Volume Six MUST take place before Wolverine and the X-Men Volume Two because there are no breaks. "Tomorrow Never Learns" is directly followed by "No Future")

- July 2014 – "Uprising" story arc takes place. (Avengers World #10 - #14, September – December 2014)

- July 2014 – "The Iron Nail" story arc takes place. Captain America defeats The Iron Nail and Gungnir, but ages rapidly as the serum is drained out of him into his 90s. (Captain America Vol 7. #17 - #21, April 2014 – June 2014)

- July 2014 – "Let's Get Well" story arc takes place. Steve Rogers is old. Havok, Rogue, and Sunfire are awakened from cryo containment. (Uncanny Avengers #23, October 2014)

- July 2014 - "The Tomorrow Soldier" Captain America Volume 7 Arc. Steve is still old, Hulk is smart (not wearing new hairstyle), but somehow Thor has regained worthiness of Mjolnir. Sam Wilson takes over as Captain America. Easiest just to brush off as continuity error, especially when we know that Thor will be wielding Jarnbjorn while Sam Wilson is the new Captain America. (Captain America Vol 7, #22 - #25, September - December 2014)

- July 2014 – "Far From Refuge" - Wolverine has one last conversation with Rogue in the First Half of #24. (Uncanny Avengers #24, November 2014)

- July 2014 – "The Death of Wolverine" occurs. Wolverine finally learns how to swim! Wolverine dies killing Dr. Cornelius, one of the senior scientists in charge of the Weapon X program, and saving new experiments from being bonded with adamantium. (Possibly takes place at the same time as Avengers and X-Men: AXIS) (The Death of Wolverine #1 - #4, November 2014)

- July 2014 – "Omega Hulk" storyline takes place. After the events of Hulk vs Iron Man, Hulk is now smart and prefers to go by Dr. Green. He begins taking out other gamma-irradiated superhumans. It is also implied that he's keeping Bruce Banner's consciousness trapped within him. (Hulk Vol. 3 #5 - ?, October 2014 - ?)

- July 2014 – "Ms. Marvel Team Up" – Spider-Man and the new Ms. Marvel team up. (Amazing Spider-Man #7, December 2014)

- July 2014 - "AXIS" Avengers and X-Men Marvel Event.

-- "Far From Refuge" – Second half of Uncanny Avengers #25 takes place. Havok, Scarlet Witch, and Rogue are captured along with Magneto by the Red Skull and his S-Men. Magneto kills the Red Skull, only for him to return as Red Onslaught.

(Uncanny Avengers #24, Magneto Vol. 3 #10, Uncanny Avengers #25, November – December 2014)

-- “We Will All Be Dead Tomorrow” – Red Onslaught unleashes World War Hate by telepathically influencing the inhabitants of the world to conflict with each other, and is aided by his Adamantium Sentinels with superhero hunting protocols created by Tony Stark during the Civil War before his memory was wiped. (Avengers and X-Men AXIS #1 - 2, December 2014)

-- “Degree Absolute” – Loki is captured by Dr. Doom after Dr. Doom sees the future. Latveria is engulfed by World War Hate, but Loki helps to solve it. Takes place at the same time as Avengers and X-Men: AXIS #2 and Magneto #11. (Loki, Agent of Asgard #6 - #7, November – December 2014)

-- “The World Doesn’t Need Heroes, It Needs Villains” –When Red Skull revives as Red Onslaught, Magneto gathers villains to take him on. (Magneto Vol. 3 #11, December 2014) (Note: Magneto #11 takes place during Avengers and X-Men: AXIS #2)

- July 2014 – Nightcrawler mourns for Wolverine after his death. (Nightcrawler Vol. 4 #7, December 2014)

- July 2014 – Storm mourns for Wolverine after his death. (Storm Vol. 3 #4, December 2014)

- July 2014 – Melita Garner interviews the X-Men and students about who Wolverine was after his death. (Wolverine and the X-Men Vol. 2 #10, December 2014)

- “Four Words” – Mystique, Sabretooth, Daken, X-23, and Lady Deathstrike are all gathered together by a stranger after the Death of Wolverine. (Death of Wolverine: The Logan Legacy #1, December 2014)

- August 10th, 2014 – Peter Parker turns 29.

(8 Months Later)

Note: For now, the 8 months later events take place in March 2015. As the sliding timescale progresses, and with the need to keep 4 real world years to 1 Marvel Year, this gap of time will undoubtedly shrink too.

- March 2015 – “The Three Avengers” - Sunspot buys AIM. Cannonball and Messenger and their baby live on a planet patrolled by The Imperial Guard. Avengers have fallen under SHIELD authority. Avengers Tower is now SHIELD Station Golgotha. Amadeus Cho is now part of The Illuminati. Hawkeye, War Machine Drones, Captain Marvel, and Invisible Woman are a part of SHIELD’S

Avengers. The rest of The Illuminati's ranks currently consist of Iron Man, Doc Green (Extremis Hulk), Hank Pym (in Yellowjacket garb), Captain Britain, Doctor Strange, Beast, Black Panther, Black Bolt, and Mr. Fantastic. (Avengers Vol. 5 #35, November 2014)

- March 2015 – “Universal Avengers” - Star Brand, Nightmask, Hyperion, Odinson, Abyss, and The Exnihili undertake a mission to save the universe that they are unlikely to return from. (Avengers Vol. 5 #36, December 2014)

- March 2015 – “The Cabal” – Namor's Cabal razes other worlds, while Namor seeks Dr. Doom's help. Dr. Doom refutes him, and instead finds his own solution to the incursions that involves The Molecule Man. Wakanda Falls. (New Avengers Vol. 3 #24, November 2014)

- March 2015 – “What Happened When The World Woke Up” - The Illuminati are able to witness Amadeus Cho's interrogation by Susan Richards of SHIELD. Black Panther translocates to his teammates and reveals that Wakanda has fallen.

Bonus: In the Amazing Spider-Man 2 film, Max Dillon yells out in his imagined scenario to Alistair Smythe that Spider-Man is a Leo. The possibility remains this is a reference to his first comic appearance (Amazing Fantasy #15, August 10th, 1962) or Andrew Garfield's Birthday. (August 20th, 1983)
