# Weighted GPAs

#### Background

In November 2016, the board passed a motion to make GPA reporting consistent between the two high schools. Under the new policy, weighted GPAs are reported on transcripts at both schools. Weighted GPAs are calculated with an extra grade point for honors and AP courses taken in 10th through 12th grade. Prior to November 2016, Gunn reported both weighted and unweighted GPAs, with honors and AP courses given an extra grade point in all grades. Paly only reported unweighted GPAs.

#### Questions
