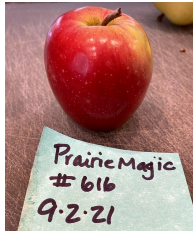

Although we doubt it, it would survive. It seems to be hanging on, and even produce some fruit again.</p>
