NOTICE OF SCRIMMAGE

1. RULES:

- 1.1. The scrimmage will be governed by the *rules* as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2. The US Sailing prescription to rule 63.2 is deleted and will not apply.
- 1.3. Under rule 70.5(a), the right of appeal is denied.

2. ELIGIBILITY:

- 2.1. This is an Open scrimmage as described in the NWISA District Rules.
- 2.2. Number of sailors attending and boats available will determine whether we race everyone together in a single fleet (teams comprised of 2 sailors) or form two divisions (teams comprised of 4 sailors).
- 2.3. Teams shall be accompanied by a designated adult team leader, who may be an advisor, coach or parent recognized by the school.

3. ENTRY AND ENTRY FEE:

- 3.1. **All NWISA teams from the Kitsap or Olympic Peninsula are encouraged to participate. If you need assistance with boats, with registration, or have questions about the regatta please contact the scrimmage host.**
- 3.2. Eligible schools may register through the NWISA website link or contact the scrimmage host directly.
- 3.3. Teams unable to compete once registration closes are requested to notify the scrimmage host as soon as possible.
- 3.4. Each competitor must have a signed [waiver](#) on file.
- 3.5. There is no entry fee for this scrimmage.

4. BOATS AND FORMAT:

- 4.1. This scrimmage will be sailed in FJs.
- 4.2. Register all sail numbers in the registration spreadsheet or advise scrimmage host directly.

5. SCHEDULE:

6. RACING AREA:

- 6.1. All races will be sailed on Dyes Inlet.
- 6.2. Boat rotations will occur from Silverdale Waterfront Dock.

7. TRAVEL AND TRANSPORTATION:

Teams are responsible for their own transportation. The address of the regatta site is: 3337 NW Bryon Street, Silverdale WA 98383

8. COACHING:

- 8.1. Team leaders, chaperones, coaches, parents, advisors, and other support personnel may go afloat in the sailing area, provided they do not interfere with racing.
- 8.2. Competitors may receive coaching including instructions, assistance, equipment, or sustenance while on the water in between races.

9. CONDUCT

- 9.1. No contestant shall use, either on or off the water, alcoholic beverages (beer, wine, or distilled spirits, each as defined in Chapter 51 of the US Internal Revenue Code and intended for beverage use), or marijuana, cocaine, or any other controlled substance (as defined in 21 US Code 802), the possession of which, by that contestant is unlawful under 21 US Code 841.
