### Stage 1 - Geography



Students through inquiry solidify their understanding of the importance of outdoor places to people, communication of geographical information and use of geographical tools

#### Learning experiences

Students begin the day with inquiry questions. Students utilise geographical tools to help determine what a location is like and what makes it important to them and to others in their community.

Geography (2015)

- Investigate people's connections and access to places
- Investigate connections that people, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples, have to local and global places
- Investigate places across a range of scales within Australia
