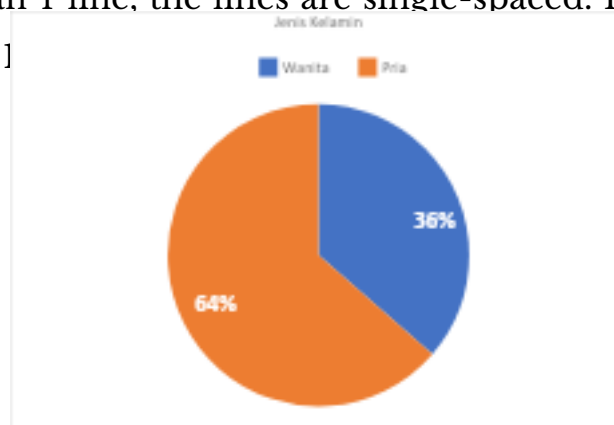


Figure 1. Distribution of the injured lower extremity ← 10 pt
