Foundational	D	Foundational Projects (D) Students: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Create: The user consistently produces unoriginal ideas, preferring predictable choices and requiring presented options when researching, indicating a lack of independent ideation or process innovation. ● Produce: When faced with challenges, one remains at their current skill level and gives up. ● Reflect: It neither reflects nor explains. ● Connect: The artwork lacks originality, primarily serving as a reproduction of existing works. ● Project Specific Criteria: Student has met some of the requirements for the project and demonstrates an emerging set of skills (working towards a basic level).
