## RP Tip #1: Thread your replies.

It may seem insignificant, more work or no different than how you may already do your replies, but trust me when I tell you that in the long run for both you and the person you are writing with, it will make a world of difference.

RP Tip #2: The post you reply to matters.

Look before you reply. Often times, people will reply to the wrong part of the post making it more difficult to keep up with the SL because replies are getting lost. This can also go with tip #1 about threading. Threading will help in curbing this issue.

RP Tip #3: It is best to do a draft of your reply somewhere else first.

Due to Blue Sky not having the draft options yet (this tip will exclude most platforms as they have more expanded options to avoid this) so as not to lose your progress in case of an app crash or the need to go back to the original replies to get a better sense of how to give your own, or any other unforeseen possibilities that could mean losing what you already have. This makes this tip all the more important to heed.

Apart from this, drafting your reply elsewhere (either electronically or manually) gives you more space to be creative without the pressure of being "found out". As in, if you accidentally post before being ready or am trying to hide you're online.

## RP Tip #4:

For those who thrive having multiple accounts or just want more accounts to write on but have only one email, I have your solution.

Mail.com will not only give you 1 new email address with ease, but under that 1 email you can have multiple alias addresses that will count as their own.

## RP Tip #5: Rules.

They aren't mandatory, but you're writing experiences will be a whole lot better if you had a set of rules (also your limits/boundaries) that you want anyone who is interested in writing with you to view and adhere to.

Of course, people will be people and will ignore. Sorry.
