Once you have followed these steps, you will have a better idea of how to prepare yourself in the most efficient way possible. Here are some websites to assist you:

1. You know that you have grammar issues to address (especially verb forms!). There is the ever-famous Barbara K. Nelson site that I just LOVE: [Barbara K. Nelson Site](#).
2. For listening comprehension of native speakers, visit this site. On the opening page, you will find a pull-down menu to select the level of speech to listen to, ranging from beginner to superior level. After selecting a topic, scroll all the way to the right to find vocabulary help, useful phrases, and grammar practices related to your choice. You can listen to a series of people discussing the same topic. In the upper right-hand corner, there are three buttons labeled S, E, and N. If you click the S button, you can read along with the speaker. The E button provides the English translation. If you click the N button, you can watch and listen to the speaker without any text appearing. Try practicing first with all text turned off, as you KNOW you will read along if the text is available! Feel free to play the clips multiple times. At this stage, you are just getting your ear attuned. Observe the speakers' faces while they talk. Look at the translations ONLY as a last resort. Keep a record of the tasks you listen to. [Listening Comprehension Site](#).
3. Practice grammar and vocabulary using these reading resources from the BBC Mundo and CNN websites. Bookmark these sites on your computer, as they contain a wealth of information in Spanish that you will use: [BBC Mundo](#) | [CNN Español](#).
