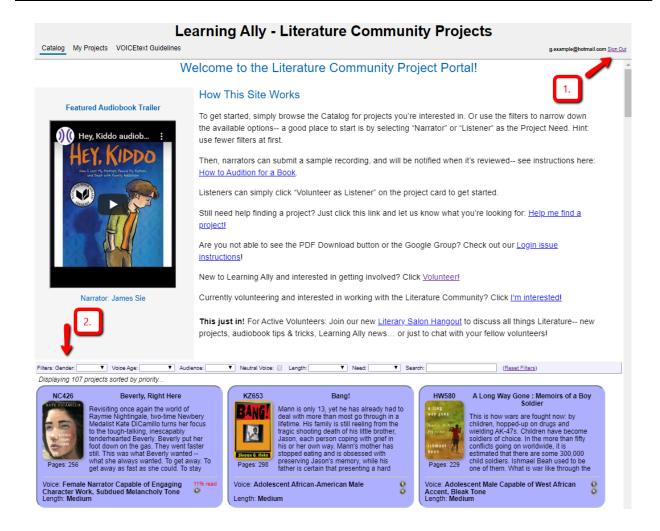

Instructions for Listeners

Please note that we recommend using Google Chrome for its easy integration with all things Google.



1. Signing In

- > To use the Portal System, you must sign in to your Google account.
- > Click on "Sign In" in the top right corner and follow the prompts.
- ➤ If you have any trouble accessing the PDF or the Google Group tab, try using an incognito window in Chrome (Ctrl-Shift-N or Cmd-Shift-N).

➤ If you're having trouble with login or the Google group, please see this <u>help</u> document.

2. Finding a Project

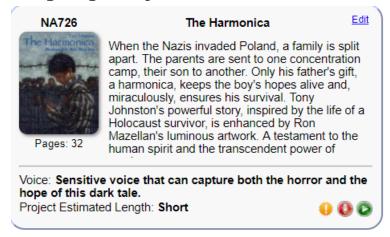
To help narrow your search, you can use the search tools located along the top of the page. You can search according to characteristics that you like, but the primary filter you should use is Need: Listener.

Options include:

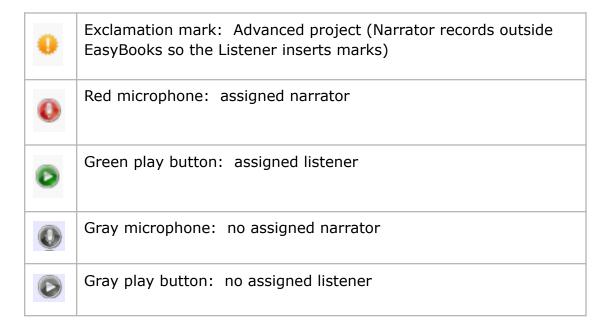


3. Navigating a Project Card.



Example of an advanced project card with an assigned narrator and listener

➤ The Project Card will have vital information such as **story summary**, **story length**, **and voice type**. There is also information on whether the project already has an assigned narrator and/or listener.





Example of a Project Card that needs a listener

> To expand a Project Card, simply click on it.

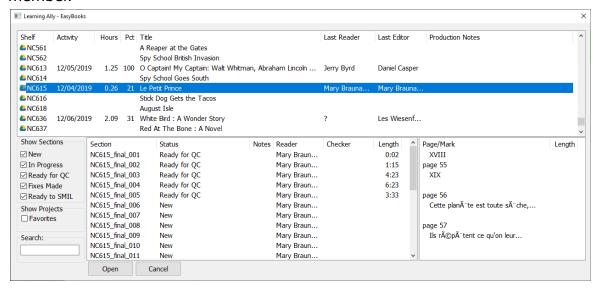


➤ The expanded Project Card will have more information about the project, such as number of pages, voice comments, and helpful links, such as YouTube and Audible. You can sign up as a listener by clicking on the Volunteer As Listener! button.

4. Process of checking/listening

- Using the expanded Project Card, download the book PDF to be used as a reference to check for any typos (OCR errors) that may appear in EasyBooks.
- ➤ Open up EasyBooks and locate the project. Select and open the first file which should be just the title of the book. The second file will usually have the author's name, a table of contents and some of the book text. The file status should be Ready for QC.

Note: It SHOULD be one listener assigned to a project. If you discover someone else has been checking your project in error, please contact a staff member.



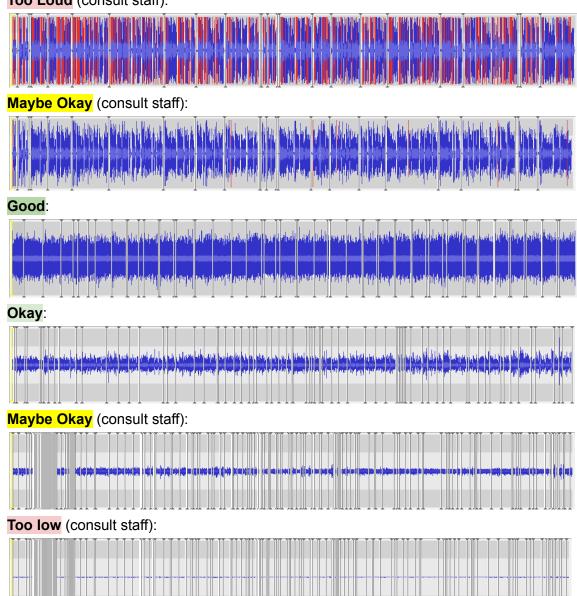
- > The three most important things to listen for:
 - **ACCURACY** narrator is accurate to the text
 - **AUDIO QUALITY** audio is within acceptable levels and free of interference, noise, echo, and loud mouse clicks
 - **PERFORMANCE** the narration is lively and engaging

5. The QC Process.

- Basic Projects (Narrator recording in EasyBooks)
 - 1. Visual Waveform check
 - 2. Mark Sweep
 - Close audio review
 - 4. Check corrections
 - 5. Change status to Ready to SMIL!
- ➤ Advanced Projects (Narrator recording outside EasyBooks)
 - 1. Visual Waveform check
 - 2. Close audio review
 - 3. Check corrections
 - 4. Insert marks
 - 5. Resolve notes
 - Change status to Ready to SMIL!

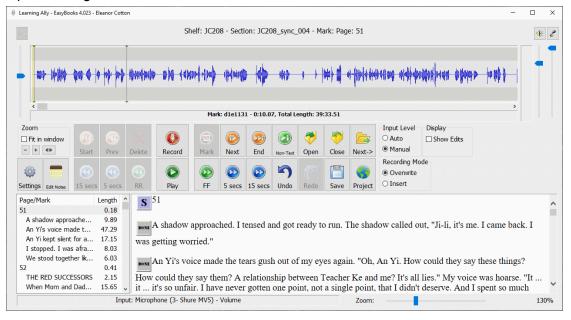
6. Visual Waveform check.

Click the Fit in window checkbox below the waveform to evaluate the waveform.
Too Loud (consult staff):



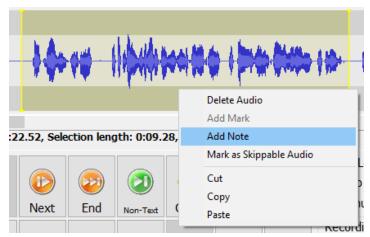
7. Mark Sweep.

- > A mark sweep is done on basic projects to ensure the marks are in the right place.
- At the beginning, click Play, listen a bit, then click the orange Next mark button, and repeat throughout the file:



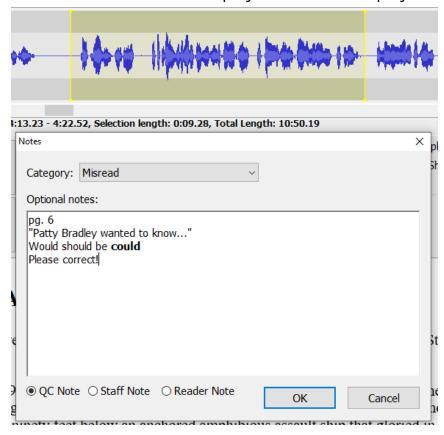
8. Close Audio Review.

- Listen to the ENTIRE FILE word for word. You are listening for accuracy, audio quality, performance and continuity.
- Make QC notes where applicable. If you find an error, highlight the sentence where it occurs in the waveform, right click, and select ADD NOTE:



➤ Choose the note category and enter the page number and some text to help others locate the sentence (~5 words from the beginning of the sentence with the error; you can copy and paste from the EasyBooks text window) plus what needs to be fixed. Remember to be polite!

- > Please note: most audio quality issues can and will be resolved by staff with noise reduction software, but they should still be noted.
- ➤ If you are comfortable with audio editing, you can correct some issues like deleting too much silence, double-takes, copy/cut/paste audio, etc. and resolve the note yourself by checking the box next to the note after clicking the Edit Notes button.
- Repeat the process for all files in the project that have the status Ready for QC.
- > Be sure to communicate the project status in the project's Google Group.

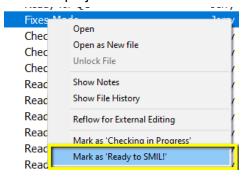


9. Check Corrections.

When the file status says "Fixes Made", review the corrections by clicking the Edit Notes button and clicking on each note and listening to ensure they are now correct and the transitions before and after are smooth.

10. Change File Status.

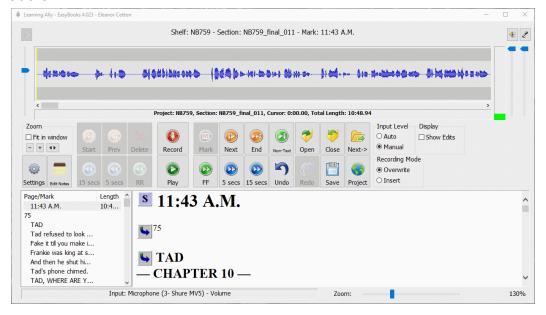
When the file is completely checked, fixed and ready for post-production, right-click on the file in the project list and select Mark as Ready to SMIL!



11. Advanced Projects.

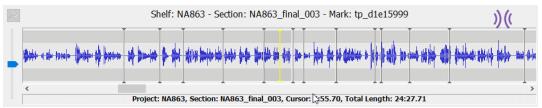
The primary difference for these projects where the narrator works outside EasyBooks is that you will need to insert the synchronization marks but do NOT insert marks in the file until **after corrections have been made.**

➤ After corrections have been made and checked, it's time to insert the sync marks. Start at the beginning and click Play, and click the Mark button (or M key) to place marks as needed to sync the text to the audio.



- > Remember that marks should be placed right BEFORE the text or page number they refer to.
- > You can move marks with a click and drag, or delete them with right-click/delete.

➤ If the narrator needs to make a correction after marks have been inserted and marks have been shifted because of the new audio, you can SHIFT+CLICK on the mark (usually where the edit began) and drag either to the right or left. This will shift ALL marks after that point.



12. Using the Google Group in the Portal

Google Group is the primary form of communication between staff, narrators and listeners. It is important for all to communicate over the course of the recording. Narrators are encouraged to post whenever a file is uploaded as listeners are encouraged to post when they have checked a file, if any edits are needed, or any questions in regards to the project.

> Click on the MY PROJECTS link at the top left corner of the portal:



➤ You will then see either one or a listing of smaller Project Cards along the left margin of the screen. These are the projects you have signed up to work on.

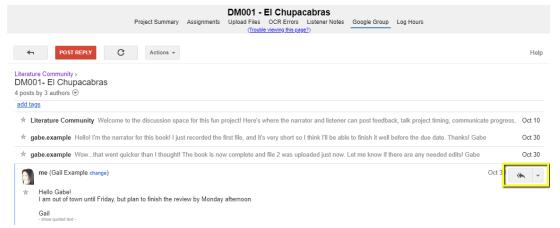


> Click on the desired project.

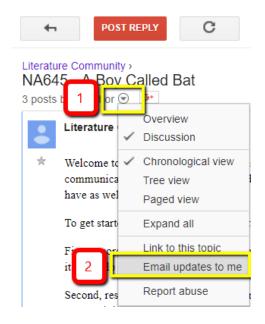
The **GOOGLE GROUP** link on the right will take you to the project Google Group thread.

NOTE: If you as the listener notice a serious issue or are unsure of something in the recording (poor sound, poor performance, etc) please contact staff.

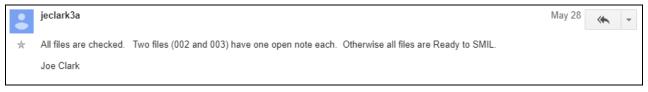
> You can post a message by clicking the Reply button here:



And if you want to receive email notices of any other posts, you can do that here:

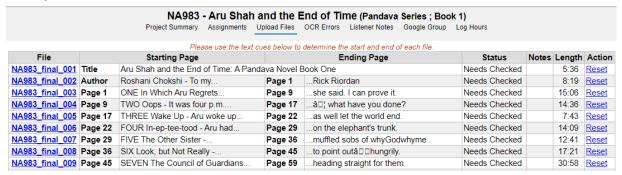


Here's a typical Listener post:



13. Other Tabs in My Projects (FYI)

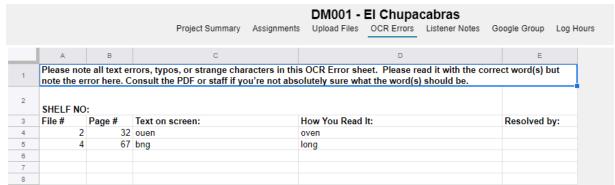
> **UPLOAD FILES -** projects that we record are divided up into files (usually by chapter, character, etc.). Here you can find a list that shows file status, notes, and more information.



Example of an UPLOAD FILES tab

The first column has the *file name*, followed by columns for the *page where* the *file begins*, *first few words*, *page number where the file ends*, *file status*, *Notes*, *Length* and available *Action*.

➤ OCR ERRORS - this link is used to track Optical Character Recognition errors in the project text. Listeners should note these here as they are encountered in EasyBooks.

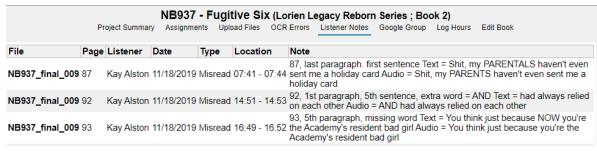


Example of an OCR Error tab

> GOOGLE GROUP

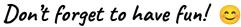
See <u>previous section</u>.

➤ **LISTENER NOTES -** This section contains a list of any errors/edits that are created by the listener. These are automatically populated from the notes you create in EasyBooks.
