## **Financial Responsibilities and Technology Fees**

The following guidelines have been implemented to not only encourage student responsibility but also to reduce the number of lost devices.

## If Lost (Charger)

- Bring your device to the Technology Office for charging in the first 24 hours
- A letter will be sent home informing parents of a \$20 replacement fee.
- Student will be issued a new charger after 24 hours and a fee assessed.

## If Damaged (Charger)

- If Hardware Issue Student will be issued a new charger right away with no fee assessed
- If Accidental Damage
  - o If First Incident Student will be issued a new charger right away with no fee assessed
  - O If Second Incident
    - A letter will be sent home informing parents of a \$20 fee
    - Student will be issued a new charger right away and a fee assessed.

## If Lost (Device)

- Come to Technology Office for a one-day loaner
- Parents will be called informing them of a \$250 replacement fee
- Student will be issued a new device after 24 hours and a fee assessed.

## If Stolen (Device)

- After notifying the Technology Office of stolen device, you will be provided the serial number, model, etc. required for the police report.
- Come to Technology Office for a one-day loaner (up to five days)
- Once a copy is received by the school, the student will be issued a new device with no fee assessed

## If Damaged (Device)

- If Hardware Issue Student will be issued a new device right away with no fee assessed
- If Accidental Damage
  - o If First Incident Student will be issued a new device right away with no fee assessed
  - O If Second Incident

- Come to Technology Office for a one-day loaner

  - Screen \$15
  - Other \$40
- Student will be issued a new device after 24 hours and a fee assessed.
- O If Third Incident
  - Come to Technology Office for a one-day loaner
  - Parents will be called informing parents of the following fees:
    - Screen \$30
    - Other \$50
    - Student will be issued a new device after 24 hours and a fee assessed.
- O Fourth Incident and Above
  - Come to Technology Office for a one-day loaner
  - Parents will be called informing parents of the following fees:
    - Screen \$50
    - Other \$60
  - Student will be issued a device after 24 hours and a fee assessed.
- If Intentional Damage
  - Come to Technology Office for a one-day loaner
  - Parents will be called informing parents of the following fees:
    - Screen \$30
    - Other \$60
  - Students will be issued a new device after 24 hours and a fee assessed.
- Protective Case (If Removed, or can tell it has been removed, than insurance is voided and full repair costs will be assessed.)
  - o If Case is damaged through accidental means
    - First incident Will be replaced with no fee assessed
    - Second incident Fee of \$35 will be assessed.

# Student Responsibilities

# Each student will be responsible for:

- Abiding by the Marceline R-V Acceptable Use Policy.
- Always having in their possession a fully-charged and functional computer.
- Attending each class with their computer unless directed otherwise by faculty.
- Logging in under their assigned username and password and not sharing their password with other students.
- Backing up their data to Google Drive.
- Proper maintenance and care of the device.

# Care and Maintenance

## When using your computer at home:

- Have a set location at home for the computer. This location should have adequate room for the computer to sit safely. This area should also be near a power outlet so that the computer can fully charge while at home.
- Keep the computer clean. Students should only use a microfiber cloth to wipe the screen.
- Trackpads can be damaged if not used properly. Never use a pencil, eraser or other object on the trackpad.
- Do not place heavy objects on top of the computer. This may cause damage to the screen. The laptop should never be in a pile or shoved at the bottom of a heavy bag.
- Do not place stickers or skins on the computer.
- Be careful with the screen. Do not touch the screen with your fingers.
- Do not place anything between the screen and the keyboard when you close the computer.
- Do not forcibly bend the AC adapter cord. Leave plenty of room for the wire to reach the computer.

# To maximize battery life:

- Turn down volume.
- Turn down brightness.
- Exit any applications you are not using.
- Shut-down computer completely when not in use.

#### **During Classes:**

- Dim your screen to conserve power and make your battery charge last longer.
- Keep open only applications and websites you are using. This saves processor power, memory and extends your battery life.
- Work on a flat and level surface and not on top of other items on your desk.
- Do not leave your computer on your desk where it may get knocked off when not in direct use.

#### After School and at Home:

- Use a surge protector instead of plugging directly into the wall to protect from lightning strikes and power surges.
- Be wary of "borrowing" wireless access from others in your neighborhood. You can never be sure if others are stealing your information.
- Use your computer away from food and liquids. Spills can be deadly to your computer.
- Leave your computer in a secure place during after-school sports and activities.
- Do not leave your computer in a car overnight or for long periods. Extreme heat or cold can damage your computer.
- Keep your computer locked in a safe location when you are away.
- Keep your computer and charger safe from pets and younger siblings.
- Only use the school-provided charger with your computer.
- Do not leave the computer laying flat on the floor. If you must have it on the floor, lean it vertically against a wall or furniture. This avoids being stepped on.
