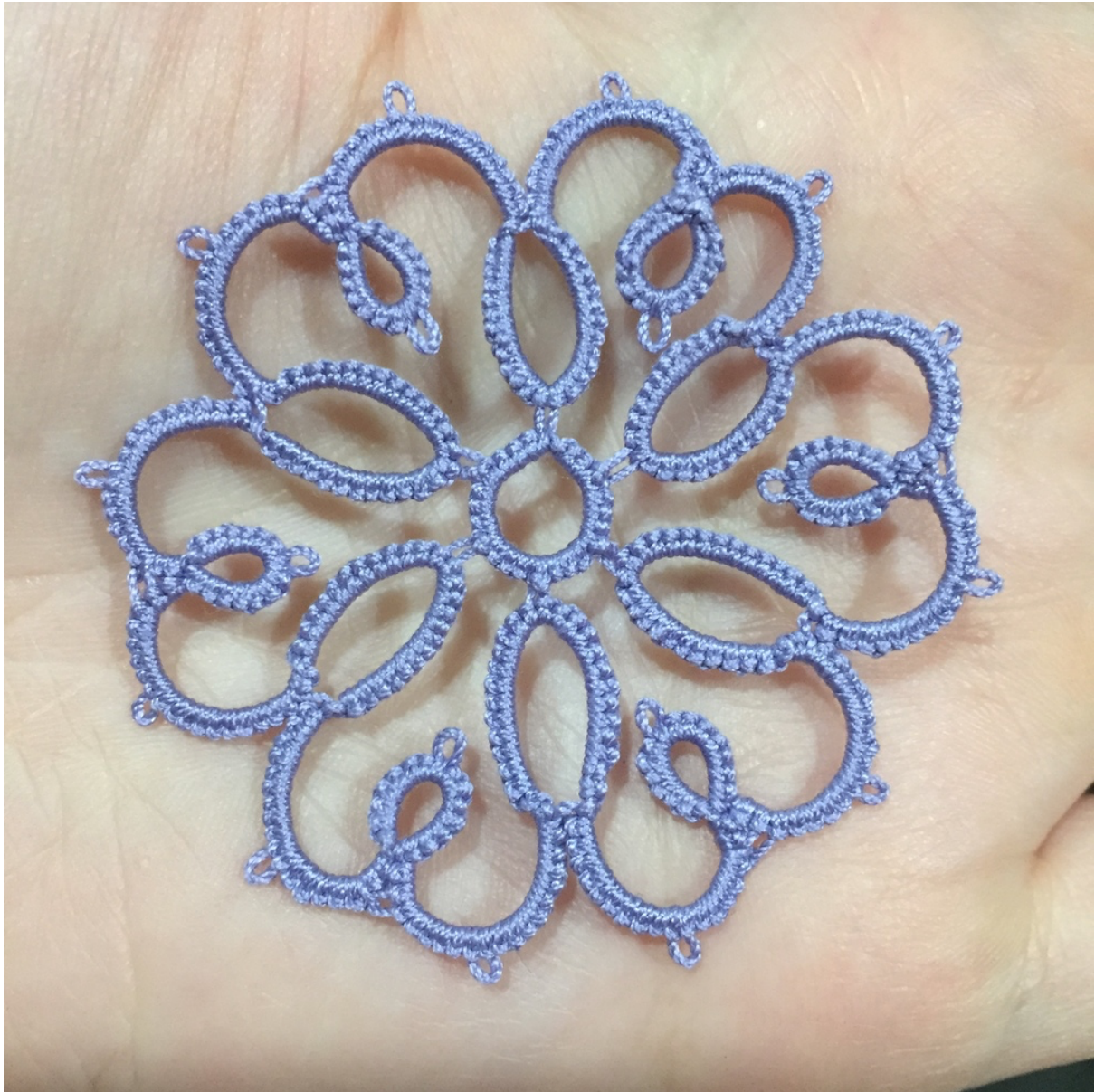


2018 DRR 2 Doily 1 - Coretta's doily (Hexaflower?)

Round 1 (Coretta Loughmiller):



R: 8-8 rw

Ch: 2-6-10-1

*Unflipped stitches chain: 13-13

Ch: 1+10-6-2 rw

R: 8-8 rw

Ch: 2+6-10-1

Repeat from * till you get to the last set of unflipped stitches

Unflipped stitches chain: 13 fp

TR: 4+4+4+4+4+4 cl fp

Unflipped stitches chain: 13

Ch: 1+10-6+2 join tie and cut

Work looks like an edging (long) it is rounded by the thrown ring. You may also choose to work the small central ring first, tie and cut and then work the next round joining to the first ring.

Round 2 (Muskaan):

Version I. (ring sequence marked for 1st repeat.)



For single colour, CTM. (Single shuttle and ball)

R1 : 10 – 10. Insert free ring of previous round through this. rw

Ch : 3 – 10 – 5 rw

R2 : 8 – 8 rw

Ch : 5 – 8 – 2 rw

Next 2 rings are worked as SCMR (self closing mock ring), but can be worked as true rings.

MR3: 4 + 7 + 11

MR4: 11 + 7 – 4 rw

Ch : 2 + 8 – 5 rw

R5 : 8 + 8 rw

Ch : 5 – 10 – 3 rw

Repeat from R1, but joining next chain to the last chain made.

For 2 colours, use SLT (shoelace trick) as needed. I substituted SLT with an unflipped half stitch in the colour of the next element.

SS (switch shuttles) works only before MR3 and after MR4.

Version II. Inner flower/calyx



Worked from behind, but all frontside clockwise.

Stitch count may need to be tweaked as per one's tension.

All chains 12 + 12, then lock joined twice to same picot, one on either side. This was done to keep them centered. One can use any other join.

This 'calyx' can be worked from the front to look more like a small flower, layered over the central round (it actually looks pretty when I see it from the back). Reason I did not do it here is to keep focus on central round and butterflies.

Also, I may end up cutting off orange and change colour (and/or position it above) depending on how the other rounds are designed.

Round 3 Instructions by Tim

R8+8+8 RW (Joins to the picots either side of the gap between butterflies.)

Ch 12 DNRW (Do not reverse work)

Split ring (SR) 4-4/8 DNRW

CH 12 RW

R6+6 DNRW (Join to next picot near tip of butterfly wing)

R6+6 RW (join to next picot)

R6-6 CL DNRW

() Optional between *'s.

Pull up thread through space between prev chain and first ring. Pass both shuttles through.

Pull loop closed.

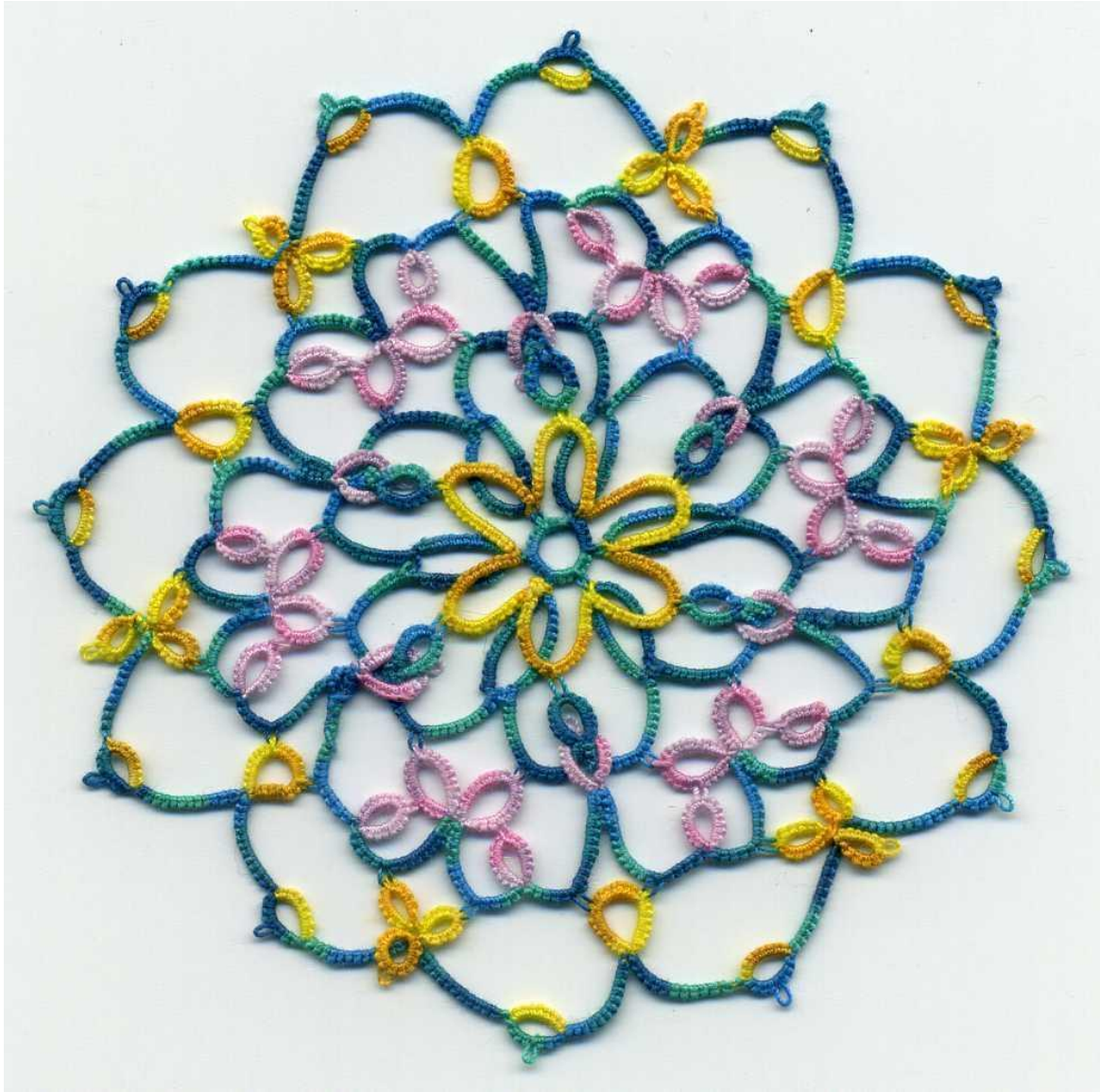
Ch 12 DNRW

SR 4-4/8 DNRW

CH 12 RW

Repeat from beginning 5 more times

Tie and cut. Sew in ends.
