MEMBER RESPONSIBILITIES

House meals are every weeknight at 7pm (except on Wednesdays at 7:30pm), Saturday brunch at 12pm, and Sunday at 6pm, 6:30pm, or 7pm (depending on the house). House meetings are every Sunday at 6:30pm at Wells, 7pm at Haymarket and Concord, 7:30pm at Bowers. Members are expected to attend at least 75% of house meetings and most dinners.

How does your schedule mesh with these events? Would you be able to attend the expected number of meals and meetings? If not, why?

House meals are prepared by house members on a rotating schedule. Each member cooks once a cycle (between 15 and 25 days) for roughly 30 people. You don't have to be a cook when you apply, but when you live here you will need to learn to cook vegetarian meals for up to 25 people (with some help of course).

Tell us about your experience and/or interests with cooking. Would you be able to contribute 3-4 hours preparing a meal every couple of weeks? If not, why?

All food collectively purchased and prepared is vegetarian. Cooks prepare special alternatives to meet members' dietary restrictions (vegan, GF, allergies, etc.)

Do you have a special dietary requirement? (please specify)

Members share maintenance and upkeep of the houses by performing assigned household chores (sweeping, cleaning, gardening, taking out the trash, etc.) or by performing administrative duties (e.g., bookkeeping).

Would you be able to contribute between 2 and 3 hours a week to house maintenance and upkeep responsibilities? If not, why?

Every month, house members cut two checks: one for rent (averaging about \$650), one for food group/utilities (averaging \$200). New members also pay a security deposit equal to one month's rent and a one-time membership fee of \$30.

Would you be able to pay the security deposit and one-time membership dues upon moving in? Do you have a reliable source of income? If so, what would you do if you lost that source and how long could you pay for rent, food, and utilities?

To maintain our tax-exempt status, we must collect statistics on the income levels of our membership.

If you were to move into the house, would you be willing to confidentially disclose your income level to Qumbya annually for this purpose (do not tell us your income now)?

LIVING IN COMMUNITY

Each Qumbya house strives to be open to people of a variety of religious beliefs, ethnic backgrounds, ages, family statuses, gender identities, and sexual orientations. Some of the ways we do this include making sure folks have space to celebrate holidays that are important to them or not assuming we know folks' preferred gender pronouns and making sure we always use the pronouns folks prefer.
