

Ceramics 3 Curriculum Outline

Course Name: Ceramics 3 (Offered with Ceramics 2)

Grade Level (s): 11-12

<u>Course Description</u>: Ceramics 3 is an advanced independent section of ceramics offered to highly independent and motivated students. It is an organized independent study course designed to allow advanced students to experiment with materials, help design their own curriculum and further explore ceramic materials. Work may be retained for exhibit in the SCC Art Show. Further, students will:

- Engage in critical thinking, problem solving, and research through elements and principles of art and design studio practices and processes.
- Develop unique, well crafted works of art utilizing deliberate choice of media, tools, and techniques.
- Explain the intent, meanings, and impacts of different media works of art and design, considering complex factors of context and perspective.
- Hypothesize the intent behind a work or a collection of art works and cite evidence to support an interpretation.
