



FCPS Financial Literacy Scope and Sequence

[25RS HB 342](#)

HB 342 amends KRS 158.141 to require, beginning with students entering grade 9 on or after July 1, 2025, successful completion of a one credit course in financial literacy for high school graduation.

This requirement also applies to students participating in the Early Graduation Program (EGP) established in KRS 158.142. House Bill (HB) 342 (2025), [Financial Literacy Elective Course Code Guidance Document](#).
