WORKSHOP

New Business/Open Topics

Dr. Montgomery discussed the messages received from concerned parents on the class sizes. Discussion held on current class sizes, potential enrollment, and options for the upcoming school year. Hiring will be determined based on enrollment for the upcoming school year and if an additional class is needed it will be added accordingly. Members of the Board asked questions regarding class sizes and further discussion ensued.

Health, Life Safety, ADA Report

Mr. Rick Young of Perkins and Will provided an update on the Capital Improvement Plan, Ten-Year Health and Life Safety Survey, and the Accessibility Assessment. Members of the Board asked questions on the assessment report. The Board will get access in June and Perkins and Will will come back with an update.
